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It is to mention here that in his every correspondence the nature of permission and purpose to meet the Onges have been changed from one communicated to others and none of his letters reflected similar nature of purpose for which he wants to take permission. Secondly, in 1953 according to him he has undertaken research works but he has not given any information as to whether he was granted any permission and the authority granting so. Hardly the books which he claimed that he is going to update has not also been submitted to any authority of the A&N Administration such as Chaiman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary (TW), Director (TW), Executive Secretary, AAJVS or Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman.

We have constituted a Standing Committee for scrutiny / review all ongoing research proposals on the Primitive tribal group. Until the above proposal is cleared by the Standing Committee and ratified by the Executive Council of AAJVS, the research proposal cannot be accepted or permitted to be continued. Secondly, the Joint Secretary, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, informed vide his letter placed at page 102/C, that it should be ensured that undue interferences in the life of the Primitive tribal group do not take place without the approval of Ministry of Tribal Affairs.
