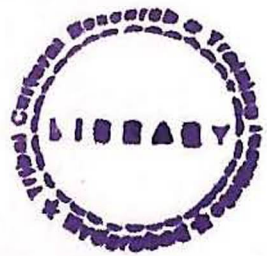

**ACTION PLAN TO WEAN THE YERUKULAS OF STUVARTPURAM AWAY FROM  
CRIMINAL ACTIVITY.**

**INDTRODUCTION:**

The Yerukula tribe was notified as Scheduled Tribe for the first time under the S.Cs. and S.Ts. Orders (Amendment) Act, 1956 in respect of Andhra Region. The same position continued under amendment to the said Act Viz., SCs. and STs. lists (Modification) Order, 1956 after formation of A.P.State.

The Area restriction imposed in the said Act in respect of Yerukula tribe was removed and the Yerukulas throughout the state of Andhra Pradesh have been notified as Scheduled Tribes under the SCs. and STs.orders (Amendment) Act 1976.

Yerukulas were reported to be tradesmen in selling salt, grain, turmeric, Curryleaves etc. on their packbullocks, donkeys and were leading nomadic life. In addition to this, the other source of eking out their livelihood was reported to be stealing, highway robbery, house breaking etc., during their nomadic life. Some of them who settled in villages were also engaged in basket making, mat weaving, pig rearing etc.

The Yerukula women were engaged in sooth-saying and while doing so they gather the information for criminal activities of their men. Therefore they did not have a distinct occupation for their livelihood.

It is necessary here to go back to legislative history leading to promulgation of Acts to control the traditional criminal behaviour on the part of tribal groups. The then British Government enacted Criminal Tribes Act 1871 which

provided for registering all the member or any members of such tribes declared as Criminal Tribes. It was assumed that unless the entire tribe was kept under certain restrictions it would be difficult to detect the professional criminals in it. Therefore both social and legal stigma was attached to the criminals as well as non criminals within a group.

The criminal Tribes Act, 1871 was amended during 1897 under which a provision was made permitting separation of the children of Criminal tribes between the ages of 4 to 18 years from their parents and placing them in reformatory settlements.

The Criminal Tribes Settlement Act 1908 was enacted to provide for Registration of tribes suspected of living by crime, supervision by the police and placement of the members of criminal tribes who had been convicted in settlements. The act was hoped to provide for a complete reformation of criminals.

Since the desired result was not achieved by the said Act, it was amended during 1911. Under this act, the Criminal Tribes were classified into three categories viz. a) Tribes who were originally criminal, but had settled down to honest occupations although some sections of them or individuals continue to live by crimes (b) Tribes who had settled abodes and generally some stensible occupation but who periodically committed decoities and robberies at distant places from their homes and lived by such gains and (c) Nomadic tribes who wandered continuously and committed robberies whenever opportunities offered. Because of this classification different methods were suggested for dealing with different groups.

The Criminal Tribes Act which was amended in 1923 came into effect during 1924. The said amended act provides for constant surveillance of an individual of any community who was considered to be a habitual offender or who committed systematic crimes.

Although the Criminal Tribes Act was well intended to settle the criminal tribes on honest life, it labelled all members belonging to such tribes as criminals for the simple reason that they were born in such tribes and coercive measures were used to deal with criminals and non criminals alike. Therefore the position of the criminal tribes continued to be similar as before. After India attained independence, eminent leaders and social reformers realised that the Criminal Tribes Act was a blot in the Indian Statutes and brought pressure to withdraw such an Act. Therefore, the Criminal Tribes Act was repealed during 1952 and the 'Habitual offenders Act' was enacted. The repeal of Criminal Tribes Act paved the way for removal of legal stigma attached to criminal tribes. After the repeal of C.T. Act, the Yerukulas were notified as 'Denotified tribes' till their inclusion in the list of Scheduled Tribes under the S.Cs., S.Ts. orders (Amendment) Act 1956 in respect of Andhra region.

As far back as 1914, the settlements were established for reclamation of Criminal Tribes. One of such settlements for Yerukulas is at Stuartpuram near Bapatla in Guntur District. The Yerukula settlement at Stuartpuram was established with 300

families and was intended to be an agriculture settlement. The management of this settlement was entrusted to the Salvation Army, a religious organisation.

The Salvation army as well as the Govt. attempted to control Criminal behaviour of settlers and reform them through several means like coersive, persuasive and rehabilitative. Yet the criminal activity continued to exist although on a lesser scale. However, due to efforts of various non-Governmental Agencies and Government several criminals came out of crime to lead honest life since mid 70s. of late, during March 1999, 11 criminals of this settlement offered to surrender and to come out of criminal life with the hope that the Govt. will take up ameliorative measures for their families.

Accordingly it is decided to take up ameliorative measures for all the poor families along with the families of surrendered criminals. For this purpose, socio-economic survey of all the Yerukula families residing at Stuvartpuram settlement is conducted in order to propose various measures for their socio-economic betterment with a view to wean them away from the criminal activities in case of families still practicing such activity by providing alternative source of income and in case of poor families to make them not to resort to criminal activity. The study reveals as follows.

Stuvartpuram a hamlet of Murukondapadu village in Bapatla Mandal, Guntur district is situated on the Bapatla Chirala Road at a distance of 8 Kms. from Bapatla. It is constituted by 9 habitations called 'Gangs' traditionally, on either side of the



road. Some of the families from pedda Gang are stated to have settled at Vrukshanagar, a newly developed colony, adjacent to store Gang. Habitation wise number of families and population are as follows:

#### POPULATION:

The Stuyartpuram consists of 654 households of which 77% are headed by males and 23% by females. Therefore there is high incidence of families headed by females in the settlement for which the following reasons may be attributed.

- Some are said to be killed or shot dead while thiving,
- Some males deserted their wives on the pretext that the women had extra marital relations when the males were in prisons, and
- Shorter life span of males due to heavy addiction to liquor.

Total population of these 654 households is 2772 which works out to an average family size of 4 persons. Of the total population, 1351 are males (48.73%) and 1421 are females (51.26%) and it is interesting to note that ratio of females to males works out to 1052 females per 1000 males where as it is 939 females for 1000



males in case of S.T. population of the district and 970 females per 1000 males in case of total population of the district.

LAND HOLDINGS:

Of the 654 households only 27.82% are holding land and the rest 72.17% are landless. Even among these landed families, majority of them have leased out their lands and are pursuing other occupations. Only 40 families are said to be cultivating their lands. But this may not be the correct situation. Even the persons who revealed their land particulars stated to have land to the extent of 1 to 2 acres at the maximum. It appears that they are trying to suppress the correct position about their land holdings. It may be due to ignorance about the extent of land holding or they do not aware of issue of lands to their parents or grand parents.

However, when contacted the revenue officials it was informed that the total extent of land available for cultivation in Stuvartpuram settlement is 580.10 Acres, the details of which are as follows.

Eventhough the land is allotted to Yerukula settlers, the particulars of either individual land allotment or enjoyment are not coming forthwith since the allottees might have sold away the lands without any recorded evidence. However the land would have been changed hands among the Yerukulas.

Therefore, confusion prevailed in the minds of informants to reveal as to whether they possess the land or not in the absence of recorded evidence. The District Collector, Guntur, vide his Lr.R.Dis.8551/90/95, dt;13.10.1992 permitted the M.R.O. Bapatla to accept the relinquishment of the lands measuring 381.21 Acres offered by the Salvation Army. (copy of the survey number wise details of extent of lands of salvation Army resumed by the Govt. is given in Annexure).

#### OCCUPATIONAL PATTERN:

Since the Yerukulas were engaged in criminal activities, they were settled in Stuvartpuram settlement which was primarily an agricultural settlement, to make them lead honest life. Subsequently, they were allotted lands to persue agriculture as their way of life with a view to wean them away from criminal activities. But the present occupational pattern depicts a different situation defeating the very object of their settlement. However, due to efforts of Salvation Army towards their reformation through religion, Education, Health as well as coersive and persuasive methods by the Govt., some of them could acquire educational qualifications and profess employment in Govt. and Private establishments. The present occupational pattern of the Yerukulas of Stuvartpuram settlement is as follows:

The persons engaged in the household activities generally include females who are engaged in daily domestic works like cooking, washing and rearing of children and other household activities. It is informed that the persons engaged in agricultural labour would have work in agricultural fields for about 5 months in a year. Some of the persons are engaged as guards to the crops like paddy, cashew plantations etc. before their harvest. Agri. labour also includes persons engaged in sand quarries as labourers. It is very interesting to note that majority of the persons engaged in rikshaw pulling include SSC failed candidates. Most of them hire rikshaws on daily rent basis from non tribals of Vedullapalli an adjacent village. It appears that the rikshaw pulling is the <sup>l</sup> lucrative to other occupations and provide immediate returns. Many persons engaged

in such activity are demanding to provide financial assistance to purchase rickshaws of their own. Petty trade includes sale of turmeric, dry fish, rice flakes (Maramaralu) and sale of old (purchased)/new (steeled) clothes etc. Sale of dry fish is said to be major occupation among petty traders. It is a common sight that fish are dried on the sandy land and some times hung to the threads in front of their houses before they are taken for sale. It is informed that the dry fish is taken to far off places like Warangal, Khammam, Hyderabad etc. for sale. After finishing such sales in the said places, in return they purchase old clothes for sale in the nearby villages of their settlement. Even some are engaged in stealing new clothes. They are adept (it is informed) in stealing new clothes from the busy shops in urban centres. About 11% of the working force are employed in Govt. and Private establishments. It is interesting to note that there are employees from this settlement in coveted All India Services like I.A.S., I.R.S. and I.P.S. One of the person from this settlement is a professor in Andhra University.

Very few of them are also eking out their livelihood as Auto/Jeep drivers on rented private vehicles.

#### EDUCATION:

One elementary school and one High school managed by the salvation Army and one M.P.P.school and one High school at Vedullapalli adjacent to the settlement are catering to the educational needs of the Yerukulas. Two hostels (one for Boys and one for Girls) of Salvation Army and 2 hostels of Tribal Welfare Department are also functioning.

The details of school age and school going children of the settlement are as follows.

The percentage of school going children in age group of 6 - 11 years is 83.15% and it is 91.1% in the age group of 12-16 Years showing that more number of Yerukula children in higher classes are continuing their education. The household survey reveals that the literacy rate of Yerukulas of Stuvartpuram is 49% where as it is 20.9% among S.Ts of Guntur district and 46.4% among the general population of the district (1991 census).

Thus the educational levels of Yerukulas of Stuvartpuram settlement are more than those of S.Ts. as well as General population of the district. This may be attributed to the efforts of Salvation army as is evident from the fact that even many of the old age people in the settlement informed that they had elementary education. This tendency is also reflected in the higher rate of school going children of the settlement.

It is observed that some of the children of this settlement are being sent to Englishmedium schools at Bapatala and Chirala, the near by towns, irrespective of the economic status of the

parents. Many of the parents expressed their desire to admit their children in good/englishmedium schools.

**EDUCATED UNEMPLOYED YOUTH:**

The household survey reveals that there are 215 educated unemployed youth in the settlement, the details of whom are as follows:

It is interesting to note that majority of the X failed and passed candidates are stated to be engaged in Rikshaw pulling to ckeout their living. There are 18 females out of 82 X class pass and Intermediate failed candidates in search of employment. Out of 37 Intermediate pass or degree failed candidates there are 6 female candidates. There are also 15 Graduates, 4 Postgraduates, 7 ITI./diploma holders and 6 other technical/professionally qualified candidates who include B.Tech and B.Sc. (Ag). studied candidates and a lone female candidate trained in Nursing.

It is very jyst to record the anxious voice of a mother to provide her graduate son, a secured employment lest there is every possibility of him becoming a criminal.

HOUSING:

Yerukulas of the settlement are living in pucca houses including tiled and asbestos sheet roofed and thatched houses. Out of 654 families, 575 families possess either pucca or thatched houses. The remaining 79 families are either sharing the house or residing on rent basis in others houses.

Majority of the pucca houses are constructed in peddagang, Vrukshanagar and 6th gang. It can not be presumed that the families living in pucca buildings are rich and those living in thatched houses are poor, since the informants might not have revealed actual picture of their assets.

It can be inferred from the details in the preceding pages that the Stuvartpuram settlement was established as an agricultural settlement for reclamation of Yerukula criminals. But the intent of settlement of Yerukulas on agricultural pursuit could not be met with. However the educational levels were developed through which several Yerukulas secured employment and their literacy levels are also high in comparison to other S.Ts. and general population of the district. Except the salaried people nobody could reveal the actual extent of income and sources of income, though efforts were made to ascertain it. When enquired about indebtedness majority of them were said to be indebted and their debts ranged from Rs.10,000/- to Rs.1,20,000/- and it is observed such indebtedness is not commensurate with the occupation they profess and assets like House or land they possess. They stated that they are poor since they are indebted.

Although, a legal stigma attached to the Yerukulas of Stuvartpuram settlement was relinquished due to repeal of criminal tribes Act during 1952, the social stigma continued, the humiliation met with. As a result of the reformatory activities of the Salvation Army and other N.G.Os like Samskar in recent times, and the coercive, persuasive and rehabilitative measures from the Govt. side made certain (about 100 members) criminals to come out of their criminal activities since mid 70s and formed an association whose members were allotted lands. However criminal activity continued by some of the families unabated. Recently another batch of 11 criminals have offered to surrender. Yet, some women of the settlement are stated to be engaged in sales of clothes procured through stealing. Crimes like picking pockets, stealing of Goats, house breaking etc. are still practised by some Yerukulas. It is informed by the S.I. of police that 40 people of Stuvartpuram settlement are still active criminals. The details of criminals available in the police station are as here under:

There are about 215 educated unemployed youth in search of secured employment. Eligible among them are to be provided with some employment, either through self employment programmes or other Govt. employment, otherwise there is every possibility that some of them may embrace criminal activity.

The socio-economic conditions of the people who are stated to have come out of the crime are discussed in the proceeding pages.

76 families of them could only be contacted during the survey. Out of them 20 families are headed by females. The total population of them is 345, constituting an average family size of 5 persons. Of the total population of 345, 152 are literates, constituting 44.06%. There are 106 males and 46 females among these literates. Out of 45 school age children in the age group of 6-11 years, 37 are school going (82%) and 23 out of 25 are going to schools in the age group of 12-16 years (92%). 34 families possess lands (44.7%), 62 families own houses (39 thatched and 23 pucca houses). The rest are residing in rented houses. The occupational pattern of members of these 76 families is as follows.

Only 11 families are engaged in Agriculture. Persons under others category include daily wage workers in Rice Mill, Cinema halls and auto Drivers.

There are 19 educated unemployed youth of whom 11 are Intermediate pass candidates; 6 are X class passed and the rest are X class failed.

The felt needs of some of these ex-criminal families are as follows:

Background of the Recently surrendered Criminals:

Of the 11 criminals who have offered to surrender during March '99, three persons were not available at the time of the survey. The details of remaining 8 persons are as follows:

1. Mogili Kondaiah s/o Gangaiah is of 29 years old. He is a matriculate. He is residing at peddagang. He is married and his wife is also literate. He has one daughter and one son. His mother is also residing with him. He has neither land nor house. A case booked against him is pending at Chirala court. His mother is engaged in petti business while his wife is doing household activities. He has a ration card. He requested for provision of house, milch cattle and loan for petty trade for his

mother. He also requested to admit his children in English medium school.

2. Kampa Babu Rao S/o Kondaiah, aged about 39 years, passed intermediate and is residing at peddagang. His wife is stated to be mentally retarded. He has a son and a daughter. His mother is also staying with him. His son is studying in 2nd class and the daughter is in 1st class. He has neither land nor house. He also doesn't have Ration card. He has taken one acre of land on lease and growing vegetables. The lease amount was paid by Samskar, the Non - Governmental organisation. Two cases are pending against him, one at the Court in Narasaraopet and one case at the Court in Guntur. He requested for construction of house, provision of treatment for his wife and admission of his children in good school and sanction of loan for his mother to take up petty business.

3. Ballani Ankaiah s/o Subbaiah is a resident of peddagang. He is about 52 years old and is an illiterate. He spent for about 20 years in prison and at present one case is pending against him in the Court at Tenali. He stated that he is suffering from Heart ailment. He has two sons and a daughter. His eldest son is of 22 years old who has discontinued studies while in Intermediate and his younger son is in Vth class. His daughter is in VI class. He requested for provision of scholarship for his daughter to admit her in the Residential school run by Samskar at Nizamabad. He has one acre of land which is stated to be mortgaged. He requested for provision of pucca house and sanction of loan for establishment of Fuelwood depot and

employment for his son who discontinued Intermediate.

4. Bogiri Samuel S/o Alivelu, aged about 40 years is a resident of pedda Gang. He studied upto VI class. He has one son and three daughters. His family consists of 6 members including his wife. His son has undergone training in jeep driving and studied upto VII class. Presently he is working in Wine shop. One of his daughters failed in X class. His second daughter is dropout from school and engaged in Agrl. labour. There are two cases pending disposal against him, one at Court in Bapatla and the other at Court in Guntur. He has no lands and residing in a thatched hut. He requested for provision of house and an auto to his son. He also requested for sanction of loan for petty trade or Milch animal to his wife. He was given ration card but taken back.

5. Bochu Prabhakar S/o Yesupadam aged about 47 Years is illiterate. His family consists of three members. His wife is an Agricultural labourer. He has no house and land. Three cases were booked against him which are related to illicit liquor. He requested for provision of a House and loan to establish sheep unit. He also requested for grant of Rs.500/- PM. for maintenance of his family. He is not issued ration card. He has also requested for providing financial assistance since he is suffering from cardiac problems.

6. Kavati Prakash S/o Raja das, Aged about 50 years is studied upto 5th class. He is working as Agrl. labourer. His family consists of 6 members i.e., his wife, 2 sons and 2 daughters.

All the children are persuing education. He has neither house nor land. 3 cases are pending against him, 2 at Chirala and one at Bapatla. He was imprisoned for six years in different periods. He requested for provision of house, sanction of loan for petty trade and Rs.500/- PM. towards maintenance of his family.

7. Pola Venkateswarlu, S/o Venkaiah, aged about 40 years is residing at peddagang and studied upto VII class. He is presently engaged in Rikshawpulling. His family consists of wife and 3 daughters. His wife is a matriculate and engaged as a labourer. His three daughters are studying. He is residing in a thatched hut and has no lands. He has no ration card. One case is pending against him at Kandukur. He possess a llicence for Auto driving. He requested for provision of House and sanction of an Auto.

8. Chukka Paul S/o Somaiah aged about 34 years studied upto matriculation. His family consists of 4 members ie. wife, one son and one daughter. He resides at peddagang and stated to have a thatched house and land. More than 12 cases are said to be pending against him in different courts. He requested for provision of inputs for taking up agriculture and for admission of his children in Good English medicum schools. He also requested for sanction of legal charges for dealing with cases pending against him. He requested to arrange for transfer of all cases to a special court. He requested for provision of an Auto Rikshaw or Jeap.

ACTION PLAN

### ACTION PLAN:

On the basis of the Household survey for assessing the socio economic conditions of the 654 yerukala families, the poor families which are to be treated now through ameliorative measures are classified into three categories viz.,

1. Families whose heads have come out to surrender during March 1999 with the hope that Govt. Will provide alternative occupations to lead honest life.
2. Poor Families who have come out of crime and trying to lead honest life through other occupations than criminal activity.
3. Very poor families which do not have lands, pucca or semipucca houses and are pursuing non-remunerative occupations like agriculture labour, rikshaw pulling, petty Trade etc.,

The following measures are suggested for the socio Economic Development of the Yerukalas of the settlement and priority is to be given to the above categories of families.

#### LAND BASED ACTIVITIES:

The extent of cultivable land available for yerukalas in stuvartpuram is 580.10 Acres of which Dry land is 314.17 Acres and Wet land 265.93 Acres. However the position of present enjoyment of these lands appears to be not clear. Thus there is need to take up a survey to update the land records. To take up this survey, the Revenue authorities may be geared up so as to complete the work within a month starting from June '99 After arriving the clear enjoyment particulars of land the deserving families among them are to be provided with seed, Fertilisers and pesticides on subsidized rates to enable them to cultivate paddy in wet lands and to take up Horticulture in drylands.

The estimated cost for supply of above inputs would be Rs.5.48 lakhs. The inputs are to be supplied in Kharif '99.

It is proposed to takeup Horticulture, i.e., cashew plantation in Dry lands (75 Acres) by providing C.I.Wells with Electric Motors. Vegetable cultivation (10 Acres) and floriculture (10 Acres) may also be taken up. The total cost for Horticulture development would be as follows.

Supply of inputs under Horticulture development has to begin from the month of July '99.

**IRRIGATION:**

An extent of 138 Acres of Wet land situated between Romperu irrigation channel and drainage channel is allotted to 147 families. Both the irrigation channel and drain are breached and require repairs. These repairs are to be takenup immediately so as to enable the farmers to takeup paddy cultivation effectively during kharif '99. The Executive Engineer, Drainage, Chirala and Executive Engineer, Irrigation, Tenali have to takeup these repair works.

**HOUSING:**

Provision of Housing is a priority for 234 families of the settlement. Houses under I.A.Y. Scheme may be provided to these



234 families and the work may be completed within an year. The total cost works out to Rs.46.80 Lakhs.

#### SCHEMES FOR WOMEN:

DWCRA GROUPS: It is reported during the survey that some of the women are engaged in petty trades like selling of dry fish, Turmeric, Rice flakes (Maramaralu), Mirchi Powder etc., besides agricultree labour and household activities. It is also interesting to note that some of them have come out of criminal activities since 1970.

It is reported that some of the Women are in the habit of savings organised by private agents. Therefore this enthusiasm can be utilised to mobilise them to form into Self Help Groups. (SHGs) During the survey this aspect was discussed with the women particularly those who are engaged in selling of dryfish, Turmeric and chilli powder and old clothes. They have agreed to form into self help groups. As such six groups are formed so far. Four more groups can also be formed.

In this connection the activities which are already in practice such as sale of Dry fish, turmeric chilli powder may be taken into consideration and DWCRA group loaning for the above activities may be provided for the 10 groups.

The financial estimates for the above activities are:

DWCRA Group loaning @ Rs.17.500/- per Group for 10 groups  
Rs.1.75 lakhs.

#### TRAINING FOR EMPLOYMENT:

In order to divert the educated unemployed youth who may tend to embrace criminal activity in the absence of secured

employment either in Government or private establishments, there is need to impart training under TRYSEM in the trades like motor mechanism, Driving, Computer Training, Electrician, etc., and they may be provided employment under self employment schemes. financial estimates for providing training in different trades are as follows.

- a) Driving & Motor Mechanism for 30 candidates. Rs. 1.45 lakhs
- b) Computer training for 15 candidates. Rs. 1.45
- c) Electrician training for 7 candidates. Rs. 0.37
- d) Training in Nursing (MPHW(F) for 12 candidates. Rs. 1.16

In addition to the above, two groups have been formed to establish fancy stores under C.M.E.Y. Programme.

#### EDUCATION:

The parents are more aware of the importance of education and requested to admit their children in good English medium schools. For this purpose about 50 additional seats under the "Best Available Sachools" scheme may be allotted for the children of Ex - criminals and those criminals who have surrendered now. The estimates for 50 students @ Rs.7,000/- P.A.50 X Rs.7,000/- is 3.50 lakhs.

The youth under the age group of 15 - 25 years of the village have aspired different courses to improve their educational qualifications in Technical courses in order to have better employment opportunities. The course wise number candidates is given below.

- Total cost of the above schemes work out to Rs. 8.59 lakhs

PENSIONS : Old age pension for 12 members and Widow pensions for 10 members may also be sanctioned.

As far as the 8 criminals who opted to surrender during March '99 are concerned, it is not known in how many cases they are booked in various courts since they might have suppressed the facts or ignorant of number of cases in which they were booked. Therefore only the No. of cases pending against them were recorded basing on their statements. The following requirements may be considered.

1. Transfer of cases to a single or special court for speedy disposal.
2. Provision of legal assistance.
3. Admission of their children into Best Available Schools by relaxing the rules if necessary.
4. Provision of pucca Houses for their families.
5. Provision of financial assistance to engage themselves in alternate occupations such as Auto Rickshaws, Tyre carts, Milch Animals, Petty Trades, Fuelwood depot etc., priority may be given for these eight families in providing assistance so that confidence is created that Government is helping them as they have come out of criminal activity.

#### CO-ORDINATION :

A responsible and Committed Officer may be nominated to Co-Ordinate the programme implementation. The services of "SAMSKAR", an N.G.O. which is rendering yeoman service to the noble cause of reforming the criminals of stuvartpuram to lead honest life for the last 25 years or any other reputed N.G.O. in the district can be utilised in mobilising the youth. Women etc. while forming S.H.Gs. and motivating the people for proper utilisation of schemes proposed.
