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PREFACE

The increased activities of left wing extremism in the state have thwarted many developmental interventions during the past couple of years. Continuous unrest due to the left wing extremist activities has increased woes and sufferings of the people in the area. This has led the Central Government as well as the State Government to rethink the developmental process going on in the area and a concept of Integrated Action Plan (IAP) was conceived during the 7th Five Year Plan. Presently this idea is being implemented in 82 LWE affected districts of the country. In Odisha the IAP is being implemented in 18 LWE affected districts to gear up the process of infrastructural development in the area and thereby to create a base for sustainable income for the affected people of the districts. Formulation of different plans for IAP needs a broad data base. In order to cater this need this institute made a noble attempt to create an updated data base for the region in a book form on various major indicators of development such as, its vital statistics on the basis of 2011 Census, agriculture, education, health, infrastructure, social security programmes etc. These statistical information are expected to be guiding tools for policy formulation for these districts. Sincere efforts are made by the officials of this institute to get the data from various authentic sources and attempts have been made to ensure correctness of data. The book has been compiled meticulously and any error found may have been unintentional and clerical.

Hope this statistical handbook on IAP districts of Odisha will be of immense help for researchers, academicians, planners and administrators. Any suggestions for improvement of this publication in future will be highly solicited.

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INTRODUCTION

During the past few years the menace of naxalism has become a matter of concern for both Govt. of India and many state Governments. Continuous unrest and violence in the area derail the process of development and thereby raising the plight and woes of the people living in those areas. A vicious cycle of poverty and underdevelopment is growing which needs to be addressed. The spread of naxalism has become a major area of concern in the states of Odisha, Andhra, Bihar, Chhatisgarh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra and West Bengal. About 82 districts are affected by left wing extremism. In Odisha 18 Districts are either totally or partially affected by this left wing extremist movement.

Initially while presenting its budget for the year 2010-11 Govt. Of India introduced a special scheme for development of 33 LWE affected districts of the country. In the later stage due to the prevailing situation the number increased taking the total to 35 districts. Further the Planning Commission prepared an Integrated Action Plan (IAP) for the affected areas with a view to give more emphasis on the development process and to channelize adequate funds to support its smooth implementation. At present the Ministry of Home Affairs identified 82 districts affected by Left Wing Extremism under its ambit for Security Related Expenditure scheme.

In Odisha 17 Nos. of new districts were created during October 1992 by delimiting the existing 13 Nos. of mother districts and making them all together 30 districts. The main aim of the state government for creation of 30 districts was to bring the administration to the door step of the people for immediate government help and side by side gearing up infrastructural development in the inaccessible areas and to create an atmosphere which will be more convenient for the state to achieve different plan objectives, so that people in the remote areas

will not be harassed and will get the benefit of the development.

Keeping this in mind, it was felt necessary by the state administration to cover 18 Districts which have been affected by left wing extremism under IAP Programme. These are 1) Balangir 2) Deogarh 3) Gajapati 4) Ganjam 5) Jajpur 6) Kalahandi 7) Kandhamal 8) Keonjhar 9) Koraput 10) Malkangiri 11) Mayurbhanj 12) Nabarangpur 13) Nayagarh 14) Nuapara 15) Rayagada 16) Sambalpur 17) Sonepur and 18) Sundargarh

Under the IAP scheme which was initially visualised since the 7th five year plan, a number of special development initiatives were taken up in the IAP districts which cover programmes like infrastructural development, agricultural development, improvement in the standard of education, health and sanitation, provision of safe drinking water, provision for social security and marketing of their products.

The Districts covered under IAP as referred to in the Finance Ministry, were a sub set of the 82 LWE affected Districts identified by the Ministry of Home affairs for coverage under its security related expenditure (SRE) scheme where more than 20% of the police stations have experienced some incidence of naxal violence.

After so many years of concerted developmental efforts in Odisha, it is observed that all regions of the state have not uniformly developed. Despite repeated efforts to develop all parts of the state, regional imbalances exist. For example, the region comprising the old Kalahandi, Balangir and Koraput district known as "KBK districts" which is now comprised of districts, like Kalahandi, Nuapara, Balangir, Sonepur, Koraput, Malkangir, Nabarangpur and Rayagada is considered to be as one of the poorest regions in the country.

The state Govt. is deeply committed to remove regional imbalances and inequities to extend the benefit of development to all in order to eliminate regional disparities. During the year 2010-11 the Govt. of India after careful consideration announced its decision to introduce a special skill for the development of Left Wing Extremism affected districts and thus the preparation of Integrated Action Plan (IAP) by the Planning Commission for the affected areas was announced and subsequently adequate funds were made available to support the Action Plan.

IMPLEMENTATION OF IAP

IAP was formulated as an Additional Central Assistance (ACA) scheme on 100% grant basis in November 2010. To begin with, the Integrated Action Plan (IAP) for 60 tribal and backward districts of the country was to be implemented with a block grant of Rs. 25 crore and Rs. 30 crore per district during 2010-11 and 2011-12 respectively. The funds were to be placed at the disposal of a Committee headed by the District Collector and consisting of the Superintendent of Police of the district and the District Forest Officer.

The district level committee will have flexibility to spend the amount for development schemes according to need, as assessed by it. The Committee would draw up a Plan consisting of concrete proposals for public infrastructure and services such as School Buildings, Anganwadi Centers, Primary Health Centers, Drinking Water Supply, Village Roads, Electric Lights in public places such as PHCs and Schools etc. The Development Commissioner of the State concerned or any officer in charge in the equivalent rank in charge of development in the state shall be responsible for scrutiny of expenditure and monitoring of IAP implementation process.

It was resolved that the Planning Commission will undertake macro level monitoring of the scheme. Implementation of the scheme will be reviewed at regular intervals and suitable decisions to be taken on the modalities for implementation of the scheme as a part of the 12th Five Year Plan.

PARAMETERS FOR ELIGIBILITY UNDER IAP:

The Planning Commission considered that the scheme should not be limited only to the severely LWE affected district. It was also proposed by them, that the scheme should cover other Tribal and Backward districts also. To identify the IAP district for inclusion in the scheme, the following parameters were fixed.

- a) Whether the district is included in the list of 83- security related expenditure scheme.
- b) Whether Tribal population exceeds 25%
- c) Whether forest area exceeds 30%
- d) Whether the poverty ratio in the district exceeds 50%
- e) Whether the district is covered under the Backward Regions Grant Fund. (BRGF)

PROVISIONS FOR CHANGE IN IAP:

The Ministry of Home Affairs also constituted an empowered group of officers with member Secretary, Planning Commission as its Chair Person. The empowered group inter-alia, has overriding-powers to modify existing norms / guidelines on implementation of various development programmes and flagship schemes in consultation with the Ministries / Department Concerned.

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE SCHEME

The salient features of guidelines are:

- i) The district level committee should draw up a plan consisting of concrete proposals for public infrastructure and services such as school buildings, Anganwadi Centres, Drinking Water Supply, Village Roads, Electric Lights in public places such as PHCs and schools etc. the schemes so selected should show results in the short term.
- ii) A Suitable form of consultation is to be ensured with the local members of parliament on the schemes to be taken up under the IAP.

- iii) The expenditure on the projects should be over and above the expenditure being incurred for the regular State / Central / Centrally Sponsored Schemes. The district level committee should ensure that there is no duplication of expenditure on the same project.
- iv) The State Government will release the funds directly into the bank account opened for this

purpose by the District Collector & District Magistrate. The State Government will ensure that funds are transferred to this bank account within 15 days of the release of the funds from the Consolidated Fund of the State Government failing which the State Government should transfer to the district penal interest at RBI rate.

IAP DISTRICTS IN ODISHA - AN OVERVIEW

At present the state Administrative authority declared the name of eighteen districts, affected by Left Wing Extremism (LWE) to be covered under IAP programme. These 18 districts are (1) Balangir 2) Deogarh 3) Gajapati 4) Ganjam 5) Jajpur 6) Kalahandi 7) Kandhamal 8) Keonjhar 9) Koraput 10) Malkangiri 11) Mayurbhanj 12) Nabarangpur 13) Nayagarh 14) Nuapada 15) Rayagada 16) Sambalpur 17) Sonepur and 18) Sundargarh . An attempt has been made in this book to incorporate various information on the present scenario of development in these Districts covered under IAP scheme.

POPULATION

Development of an area always depends on its population profile. Each and every policy for development requires the population criteria of that area to evolve a comprehensive scheme. Government of India before preparing a road map for implementing the Integrated Action Plan (IAP) in the LWE districts took into account the kaleidoscopic features of population of these areas. In Odisha, the population of all the 18 IAP districts is 24026593 as per census, 2011. It is about 57.24% of the total population of the state. However the population varies from district to district on the basis of the geographical conditions, area & topography.

The density or concentration of population in districts like Jajpur, Ganjam, Subarnpur, Bolangir, Nayagarh, Mayurbhanj, Nowrangpur, Keonjhar, and Sundargarh is higher than that in other eight districts such as Deogarh, Gajapati, Kalahandi, Kandhamal, Koraput, Malkangiri, Nuapada, Rayagada and Sambalpur. Among the IAP districts the density of population is highest in Jajpur (630 per Sq.km) and lowest in Kandhamal(91 per Sq.km).

In absolute terms, three IAP districts with highest population are Ganjam (3529031), Mayurbhanj

(2519738) and Sundargarh (2093437). The population growth rate of these three districts (as per Census 2011) are 11.66% in Ganjam, 13.33% in Mayurbhanj & 14.35 % in Sundargarh .The districts with lowest population are Deogarh (312520), Gajapati (577817) and Subarnapur (610183) and the population growth rates of these three districts are 14.01%, 11.37% & 12.61% respectively. (Table 3.1 and 3.4)

Apart from this, it is observed from the table no. 3.2 and 3.3 that, ST population is higher in districts like Mayurbhanj, Sundargarh, Kendujhar, Koraput and Nowrangapur where as the SC population is comparatively more in districts like Ganjam, Jajpur, Bolangir, Kalahandi and Keonjhar.

AGRICULTURE:

Agriculture sector includes agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, fisheries, forestry and other related activities. Though from last decade the economy of Odisha is diversifying, agriculture is still dominating the entire economic process. About 60% of the population of the state are still drawing their sustenance from agriculture. Above all the entire ST population of the state basically depends on agriculture and allied activities for their sustainable income. In the IAP areas specifically, the mode of farming of this part of population depends on the topographical feature of the area. There is a need to improve agricultural production and productivity with more and more use of modern technology and scientific methods.

The climate of the state is tropical in nature characterized by high temperature with high humidity, medium to high rainfall and mild winter. Monsoon rainfall contributes 80% of the average annual rainfall of in the state. This is 1445.9 mm in IAP area as against 1451.2 mm in the state as a whole. (Table 4.4).

The IAP districts in Odisha extend to the northern plateau, the eastern ghat and central tableland geographical zones of the state. The type of agricultural activities pursued here differs from those in coastal zone. These areas are frequently affected by the vagaries of monsoon like the other areas of the state.

LAND UTILIZATION PATTERN:

Land cannot be expanded endlessly. The available land is to be used for agriculture as well as for various other purposes. Proper utilization of available land is the key to augment food production in the IAP areas.

It is revealed from the Table No 4.1 that in terms of net area sown Ganjam has the highest sown area with 361 thousand hectare followed by Balangir, Kalahandi and Mayurbhanj districts with 340, 339 and 339 thousand hectares respectively.

PRODUCTION OF MAJOR CROPS:

Production of various food crops mainly depend on rainfall and its distribution, topography of the land and its soil type. In Odisha Paddy, Wheat, Maize, Ragi, pulses like Mung, Biri, Kulthi, Kandul, Oilseed like Til, Groundnut, Mustard, Cash crops like Cotton, Jute, Sugarcane are generally grown.

The yield rate of food crops has been presented in Table No. 4.2. In terms of paddy production Kalahandi comes first followed by Balangir and Subarnapur with the annual yield of 9927403, 9585515, 8492912 quintals respectively. Wheat is cultivated only in some districts like Balangir, Kendujhar, Mayurbhanj, Sambalpur, Subarnapur, Kalahandi, Debagarh with Sundergarh having the highest annual yield of 11043 quintals during the year under reference. Other crops produced in IAP districts are Maize, Ragi, Mung, Kulthi, Til, Groundnut, Mustard, Jute, Potato and Sugarcane.

Among the cash crops sugarcane is produced in all the districts barring a few. In sugarcane production Koraput district has the highest yield followed by Nabarangpur and Ganjam with 1844555, 1718916, 1022562 quintals respectively.

It is observed from Table No. 4.3 that in the IAP areas the use of NPK fertilizer is largely in practice. Organic fertilizer is not abundantly used which needs to be introduced as well as encouraged due to its cheap availability and sustainability.

IRRIGATION

Table No. 4.4 reveals the extent of area under different irrigational facilities available for agriculture in IAP areas. It is observed from the table that Ganjam shows the highest cultivated area under irrigation. It is followed by Kalahandi and Mayurbhanj. But it can be observed that the irrigation facilities extended to different districts are not enough to cover at least the total net area shown. This requires expansion of irrigation facilities to improve crop production in these areas.

In IAP districts paddy cultivation is done in autumn, winter as well as in summer season. While in winter season area under cultivation and production are more, in summer and autumn season it is very less due to non availability of adequate irrigation facilities. Expansion of irrigation facilities is needed to improve the situation. Soil quality of an area is another important factor affecting agricultural production. Soil testing should be done periodically before opting for any crop as well as for application of proper fertilizer. In the IAP districts soil testing centres are functional in some districts only. (Table 4.3).

AREA UNDER HYV PADDY:

There has been an increase in the area brought under cultivation of High Yield varieties paddy (HYV) paddy in Odisha. The area under cultivation of HYV paddy in IAP districts is given in table no 4.5. HYV paddy production is highest in Mayurbhanj (6270736 quintals) followed by Subarnapur and Keonjhar districts with 4325506 and 3988215 quintals respectively. Yield rate (in Qtl per hect.) of HYV paddy is highest in Subarnapur (32.87) followed by Mayurbhanj and Sundergarh with 30.53 and 30.52 respectively .

HORTICULTURE:

The agro-climatic conditions of Odisha are favorable for the production of different types of vegetables, fruits and spices. The climate of IAP Districts is conducive to intensive horticultural activity. Vegetables like Potato, Brinjal, Tamato, Beans etc., are generally grown here. Long duration fruits like mango, guava, citrus fruits, litchi, sapeta, banana, papaya and pineapple are grown in these areas. District wise area under various fruit plantation and production of vegetables are presented in Table No 4.6 and 4.7 respectively. As various types of fruits and vegetables are grown in the IAP areas more initiatives for expansion of the area under production and marketing need to be taken.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY:

Animal husbandry is an important source of livelihood for people. In periods of distress, livestock works like insurance for them. Around 80 percent of rural households in Odisha depend on livestock and draw about 30 percent of their annual income or sustenance from it. Among the IAP districts milk production is highest in Ganjam followed by Jajpur and Koraput. Egg production is highest in Ganjam followed by Balangir and Mayurbhanj. Meat production is highest in Ganjam followed by Mayurbhanj and Sundergarh. Similarly fish production is highest in Ganjam followed by Kalahandi and Mayurbhanj districts. Table No.4.10 depicts various products obtained from animal husbandry in the IAP districts.

HEALTH :

Health is an essential component of well-being of mankind and is a prerequisite for human development. The health status of the populations in IAP areas is not very promising because of isolation, remoteness and being largely unaffected by the developmental process going on in India. There is a heavy burden of communicable, noncommunicable and silent killer genetic diseases prevalent in these areas of Odisha. Many of the infectious and parasitic diseases can be prevented

with timely intervention, health awareness, information, education and communication. In spite of the tremendous advancement in the field of preventive and curative medicine, the healthcare delivery services in the IAP districts of Odisha need improvement in accordance with the guidelines suggested to achieve the targeted goals of health for all in India.

People living in the IAP areas in general are highly disease prone. Their misery is compounded by poverty, illiteracy, ignorance of causes of diseases, hostile environment, poor sanitation, lack of safe drinking water and blind beliefs, etc. Tribal population of Odisha living in these areas are in high-risk zone of malaria. In the tribal pockets of IAP districts of Odisha, the diarrheal/dysentery diseases including cholera occur throughout the year attaining peak during the rainy season (from June to October). Table No. 5.1 reflects the prevalence of various diseases like AIDS, Malaria, Tuberculosis, Leprosy and Blindness in IAP districts. Among the IAP districts incidence of AIDs is higher in Ganjam, Koraput, Rayagada districts. More numbers of Malaria cases are found in Rayagada, Kalahandi, Nowrangpur and Kandhamal districts.

Health care is one of the most important aspects of all human endeavors to improve the quality of life especially of the tribal people. It also aims at providing affordable quality health care to the people of the State not only through the Allopathic system of medicine but also through the Homeopathic and Ayurvedic systems, to ensure greater access to primary health care by bringing medical institutions as close to the people as possible or through mobile health units.

The present health facilities available in IAP districts as per the reference year are described in the Table No.5.2. In total 73 hospitals, 245 CHCs, 742PHCs, 179 MHUs are functioning in the IAP districts. It is observed that adequate numbers of doctors are yet to be placed against the sanctioned strength in many IAP districts. (Table 5.3).

EDUCATION:

Education is given the highest priority for the simple reason that it is key to socioeconomic development. Development of the state lies with the upliftment of the backward people who are socio-economically less privileged and educationally backward in relation to total population. Keeping in view the need for universalisation of elementary education, there has been expansion at Primary and Upper Primary stage of School education, in the Government sector, especially in rural areas as well as in backward areas. Table No.6.1 depicts the literacy rate in the IAP districts. Total literacy rate is highest in Nayagarh (80.42) followed by Jajpur (80.13) and Sambalpur (76.22). SC literacy rate is highest in Kendujhar (73.77) followed by Sambalpur (72.08) and Nayagarh (71.59). ST literacy rate is highest in Sonepur (66.78) followed by Nayagarh (66.29) and Sambalpur (65.76).

Table No 6.2 depicts gross enrolment number. In terms of Gross Enrolment number for the year 2013-14 in primary level, it is highest in Ganjam (328385) followed by Mayurbhanj (308234) and Keonjhar (207819). Similarly in upper primary level it is highest Ganjam (197462) followed by Mayurbhanj(128533) and Sundergarh (98677). SC enrollment in primary level is highest in Ganjam (77787) followed by Jajpur (47114) and Kalahandi (37784). SC enrollment in upper primary level is highest in Ganjam (40656) followed by Jajpur (25065) and Kalahandi (18967). ST enrollment in primary level is highest in Mayurbhanj (218856) followed by Sundergarh (124266) and Keonjhar (122096). In upper primary level it is highest in Mayurbhanj (77344) followed by Sundergarh (57066) and Nabarangpur (34805). Table no 6.3 reveals the drop-out rate. Total drop-out rate for primary level is highest in Nayagarh followed by Jajpur and Ganjam. Drop-out rate for ST in primary level is highest in Sonepur followed by Rayagada and Nayagarh. In upper primary level drop-out rate for ST is highest in Malkangiri followed by Rayagada and Nuapada. It is seen that in all the IAP Districts the drop-out rate is high in case of ST

which is a matter of grave concern which needs appropriate measures to address this issue. In Table No. 6.5 number of teachers in different categories of schools are shown. Mayurbhanj has highest number of teachers followed by Ganjam and Sundergarh.

Information on different category of schools such as Primary, Primary with upper primary, Primary with upper primary and secondary, Upper primary, Upper primary with secondary and higher secondary schools have been provided in detail in Table No. 6.4. From the Table it is observed that Mayurbhanj district has the highest number of schools followed by Gajapati and Sundergarh.

Besides, in IAP districts there are also schools under the above categories specifically controlled by the SSD department. Table No 6.6 shows drop-out rate and enrolment rate in SSD schools.

INFRASTRUCTURE:

The importance of good infrastructure for accelerated development and higher economic growth is well recognized. Even after a couple of decades, Odisha still lags behind with respect to good infrastructure facilities and there is a felt need for substantially improved quality of infrastructure in the State. The state Government has rightly focused on electricity, communication and water supply. Table No. 7.1 depicts the status of infrastructural development in the IAP districts.

The demand for power in Odisha has been rising at a faster rate. Over 60 percent of villages in Odisha are now electrified. In IAP districts, Nuapada is the only district with hundred percent electrification followed by Subarnapur, Balangir and Keonjhar. Whereas Koraput, Malkangiri, Kalahandi districts are lagging behind in terms of electrification of all villages.

The state has also taken several initiatives to extend good road communication and to improve the road surface quality throughout the state. An ambitious programme for increasing the number of bridges and cross drainage works has been undertaken to ensure all weather connectivity for remote habitations.

There are various categories of road like national high way, state high way, major district road, other district road, rural road, GP road, panchayat samiti road, forest road which are shown in the Table No.7.1. In terms of total road length Kalahandi tops the list followed by Ganjam and Sundergarh.

In railway connectivity Sundergarh has the highest railway route with highest no. of railway stations and passenger halt followed by Koraput and Rayagada. Districts which have no railway connectivity are Deogarh, Kandhamal, Malkangiri, Nabarangpur and Nayagah.

In the field of postal communication Mayurbhanj district has highest no of post offices followed by Ganjam and Keonjhar. In order to extend smooth financial help to the poor and backward people of these districts, government have taken all out efforts to open up various types of banking agencies in the IAP areas. It is observed from the Table No.7.1 that there are highest numbers of commercial banks operating in Ganjam District followed by Mayurbhanj and Sundergarh. The Table **no** 7.2 reveals the status of drinking water facilities in the IAP districts. It is seen that the provision of tap water needs to be improved in districts like Kalahandi, Kandhamal, Deogarh, Jajpur, Malkangiri, Mayurbhanj, Nowrangpur and Sonepur. In Table No.7.6, list of cold storages in IAP district is given. Cold storage facility is available only in ten districts out of 18 IAP districts.

GDDP AND HUMAN DEVELOPMENT INDEX:

It is observed from the Table No.8.1 that, in terms of GDDP at current price as per 2010-11 data Sundergarh has the highest GDDP followed by Kendujhar and Ganjam. With regard to per capita NDDP, Kendujhar district tops the list followed by Kandhamal and Sundergarh. As regards HDI among the IAP districts, Sundergarh leads the series followed by Debagarh and Mayurbhanj. Some districts like Kandhamal, Gajpati, Malkangiri and koraput have very low HDI which points out their backwardness. (Table 8.4)

POVERTY ALLEVIATION PROGRAMME:

Achievements on different major poverty alleviation programmes are given in Table No.9.4, 9.5 and 9.1 with respect to number of beneficiaries are on MGNREGS, NRLM, IAY, Mo Kudia and Mo Pokhari respectively. It is observed from the Table No. 9.3 that the number of beneficiaries under the convergence of various such programmes is highest in Kandhamal followed by Kendujhar and Malkangiri.

SOCIAL SECURITY MEASURES:


Social security means the overall security of a person in the family, in the work place and in the society. Social Security is a system to meet the basic needs as well as contingencies of life in order to maintain an adequate standard of living. It is not a charity rather a right. Social Security is one of the important dimensions of the development process. It assumes a place of special significance in the developing countries like India where poverty, destitution and income inequalities are abound in large. Not only the central government, the state government also equally committed to provide protective measures to the under privileged people for their development and sustainability. To ensure social security in unorganized sector, the schemes like Public Distribution System (PDS), Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS), Annapurna Scheme, Antyodaya Anna Yojana have been launched especially to provide food security to all age groups in unorganized sector. Similarly schemes like MBPY, IGNOAO, AGNWPS and IGNDP are implemented for the benefit of the people. Table no 9.2 reveals the status of some of the social security programmes implemented in the IAP districts. In addition to this FRA (Forest Rights Act) has been implemented for the tribal and traditional forest dwellers which are reflected in Table No.9.3. It is observed that, in case of individual claims Kandhamal tops the list with 57657 claims settled followed by Kendujhar(40576) and Nowrangpur (33023). With respect to settlement of claims for community as a whole Kendujhar tops the list with 331 cases followed by Kalahandi(163) and Mayurbhanj(91).

IAP District Forest Area





Fig. - 2.2.b
Forest Area







Population in IAP districts and Odisha





Population (IAP & Non-IAP)





IAP Population





Scheduled Tribe Population





Population Growth Rate in IAP Districts (2001-2011)



Scheduled Caste Population Growth Rate in IAP Districts (2001 - 2011)




Scheduled Tribe Population Growth Rate in IAP Districts (2001-2011)





Land Utilisation Pattern in IAP Districts








**Fig-4.2.a

Sugarcane Production (In Qtl.)**





Fertilizers Consumption (in 000'MT)





Irrigation Potential (in 000' Hect.)





Area under cultivation of different fruits (in Hect.)





Fig.- 4.6.b

Vegetables production in IAP districts and Odisha (MT)



Potato Production




Milk, Meat, Fish Production (In MT)






Fig.4.8.b
Egg Production (In Mil. Nos)





Milk Production**





Death due to AIDS





Fig.- 5.1.b
Death due to Malaria






Infant Mortality Rate in IAP Districts

Maternal Mortality Rate in IAP Districts








**Fig.- 6.1.b


Literacy Rate of Scheduled Caste in IAP Districts in comparison to Odisha

Literacy Rate of Scheduled Tribes in IAP Districts in comparison to Odisha





Gross Enrollment upto Upper Primary (in Nos.)





Electrification in IAP





Electrification in Odisha


Total length of roads

Banks





Sources of drinking water in IAP districts





Sanitation (In %)





Mobile Health Van







Individual title distributed in FRA



