## P R E F A C E

To gauge the impact of a particular developmental scheme implemented on the targeted group, evaluation study is very much important. For the welfare and development of the scheduled tribes and scheduled castes people various developmental schemes have been formulated and implemented by a number of agencies since a last couple of years. It is pertinent to note here that though a good number of schemes have already been implemented, virtually, its result is very disheartening. Because in most of the cases the rate of development is very slow and economically and educationally still they are not in a satisfactory stage compared to the general people. In this regard mention may be made of the scavengers who are still sticking to their traditional backwardness. To uplift the socio-economic condition of the scheduled castes people, the State Development Corporation for Scheduled Castes Ltd have been implementing lots of welfare schemes since its inception. Taking into consideration the various ongoing socio-economic discrepancies, the Assam State Development Corporation for Scheduled Castes Ltd. implemented the NSLR scheme since 1994-95 as the nodal agency. The main objective of the scheme is to identify the scavengers and their families who are partially or wholly engaged in unclean and obnoxious occupation like carrying night soil, cleaning safety tanks, drains, removing dead animals to the dumping grounds etc. and liberate them from such occupation and rehabilitate them with suitable economically viable schemes.

The present evaluation study was carried out to find out the proper implementation of the NSLR, which was specially designed for the scavengers. Special emphasis was also laid on to find out the merits and demerits of the scheme and its impact on the economic condition of the beneficiaries after getting the loan. The study also tried to find out the problems/difficulties if any in getting loan by the beneficiaries. The study elaborately describes the impact of the scheme on the beneficiaries showing their success or failure. Besides this, the study also highlights the main factors responsible for discouragement of the beneficiaries regarding their proper utilization of the scheme.

The main findings of the study are incorporated in Chapter-IV followed by investigator's remark in Chapter-VI. Basing on these findings, a few lines have been drawn as concrete suggestion for due consideration of the implementing agencies as well as the Government. I hope the findings and suggestion of this evaluation report will definitely help

the implementing authority and the Government in curbing the unwanted problems and thereby will make everything very smooth. The study has been carried out by Sri Birendra Kumar Barman, Assistant Research Officer, and he was assisted by seven temporary field investigators. Shri L. Das, Mrs. S. Das have taken the pain in typing but the entire report within the least possible time while Mr Ashim Borah (A.R.O), Mr Harichandra Morang (Senior Investigator) and Mr Debabrata Laskar (Senior Investigator) have provided valuable contribution in library works. ## **EVALUATION STUDY OF THE NATIONAL SCHEME FOR LIBERATION AND REHABILITATION OF SCAVENGERS AND THEIR DEPENDENTS(NSLR)**

### **CHAPTER - I**

#### **INTRODUCTION**

The Assam State Development Corporation for Scheduled Castes implemented the NSLR scheme since 1994-95 as the nodal agency. The main objective of the scheme is to identify the scavengers and their families who are partially or wholly engaged in unclean and obnoxious occupation like carrying night soil, cleaning safety tanks, drains, removing dead animals to the dumping grounds etc and liberate them from such occupation and rehabilitate them with suitable economically viable schemes. For the smooth implementation of the schemes, liberal financial assistance is provided to the scavengers in collaboration with financial institutions.

Under this scheme the Corporation motivates the scavengers and their family members to change their traditional occupation by taking up suitable trades and related activities so that they can lead a decent life along with the fellow neighbours. The scheme has added significance to the most backward sections of our society as they have had to face the acute hardship arising out of social evils like untouchability, misbehaviour and economic backwardness.

The Corporation provides 50% subsidy (maximum Rs.10,000.00), 15% margin money and 35% loan assistance from the financial institutions/banks. Maximum limit of unit cost is fixed at Rs.50,000 while the average cost is fixed at Rs.20,000.00.

The characteristic feature of the scavengers living in Assam is that they are mostly urban dwellers and unlike other Scheduled Castes communities of Assam like the Kaibartas, Namasudras, Brittial Banias, Hiras, Jal Keots, Bhui-malis, Sutradhars, the scavengers belonging to Bansphors, Mehtars or Bhangis do not have distinct habitations. Only after independence Government has provided residential facilities to them in certain areas of towns and cities. Thus the scavengers till the passing of the Constitution Amendment Order (SC) of 1950 had to lead a very miserable life devoid of any residences worth the name. They do not have any permanent or temporary residences of their own, nor they possess any landed property. Educationally they are far behind compared to other general and Scheduled Castes communities. As per 1971 Census the literacy rate of the

Bansphors was 15.16% (male 23.13% and female 4.74%) and of Mehtar or Bhangis was 14.49% (male 21.86% and female 5.18%). The Lalbegis, however, had somewhat higher percentage of literacy 33.33% (male 40.74%, female 22.22%). The Maharas on the other hand had the lowest percentage of literacy i.e. 13.62% (male 19.67%, female 6.54%). During 1971 census the State's percentage of literacy was 28.72 (male 37.16%, female 19.27%).

The scavengers and for that matter the Scheduled Castes have had to lead a life of extreme depravity. Their socio-economic condition beggars description. In order to run over the age old backwardness of Scheduled Castes, the Planning Commission earmarked special funds in the 5<sup>th</sup> Five Year Plan. But soon it was felt that mere quantification of amounts in selected head of development could not serve the actual purpose of improving the socio-economic condition of the Scheduled Castes and in order to provide more financial support a new strategy was evolved during the 6<sup>th</sup> Five Year Plan. A separate Sub Plan known as Special Component Plan for the Scheduled Castes was formulated suitable sectoral out lay based on grass root study was provided. The Assam State Development Corporation for scheduled castes was entrusted with certain schemes meant for development of Scheduled Castes. As a result of the need based grass root study, a special plan for the scavengers was chalked out on the national level and in Assam the Scheduled Castes Development Corporation has been implementing the National Scheme for Liberation and Rehabilitation of the scavengers and their families since 1994-95.

There are 85 well defined schemes under the four sectors of development viz. Agriculture and Allied Sector 10 schemes, Small Industries sector 16 schemes, Service sector 33 schemes, Business sector 26 schemes for the National Scheme for Liberation and Rehabilitation of the scavengers. ## CHAPTER - II

### **Objective**

The Assam State Development Corporation for Scheduled Castes implemented the National Scheme for Liberation and Rehabilitation of Scavengers and Their Dependents (NSLR) since 1994-95. The evaluation study covered the implementing years of 1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98 and 1999-2000.

The objective of the present study was

1. To find out the merits and demerits of the scheme
2. To analyse the feed back received from the beneficiaries and implementing agencies.
3. To find out the difficulties/problems if any, in getting loans by the beneficiaries.
4. To find out the impact on the economic condition of the beneficiaries after getting the loan.
5. To find out the reactions of the beneficiaries in respect of untouchability, family planning measures, health seeking behaviour etc.

### **Sampling :**

The scavengers of Guwahati city are spread over of localities namely

1. Marikhali (Marisali) Horijan Colony , Ulubari
2. Dispur Last Gate Horijan Colony
3. Pandu Loco Colony, Maligaon
4. West Gotanagar, Maligaon Horijan Colony
5. G M C Old Colony, Fatasil, Bharalumukh, Guwahati - 9
6. G M C New Colony, Fatasil
7. Gosala Horijan Colony, Rehabari, Chabipul
8. Central Gotanagar Horijan Colony
9. G M C Horijan Colony, Fatasil, Bharalumukh

In order to get a true representative picture of the impact of the scheme, beneficiaries were selected adopting random sampling technique from the list of beneficiaries supplied by the Corporation. Out of 911 beneficiaries 793 (87.04% beneficiaries was selected for study. The sample included all the nine Horijan Colonies mentioned above.

## **Methodology**

Participant observation method was adopted for collection of data. Seven Investigators were appointed on temporary basis for 5 months for field study and tabulation work. The Investigators visited the colonies and interviewed the beneficiaries with the help of structured of schedules. Before sending the Investigator to the field necessary training was imparted by the Directorate. The Investigators had a trying time to meet the beneficiaries in the Harijan Colonies. They spent 3 months in the collection of data from the colonies. They contacted the implementing authorities as well as the local leaders. The local educated leaders assisted the Investigators as most of the beneficiaries tried to avoid the Investigators mistaking them as bank officials. After returning from the field the Investigators performed the tabulation work. The officers of the Directorate as well as the Consultant assisted the Investigators from time to time.

## CHAPTER - III

### DATA ANALYSIS

The evaluation study conducted on the 8 nos. of Harijan Colonies of Guwahati as per the National Scheme for Liberation and Rehabilitation of Scavengers and their Dependents' guidelines of Government of India studied 793 beneficiaries (male 332, female 461) out of a total beneficiaries of 911 beneficiaries.

Majority 335 (42.24%) (165 male, 170 female) nos of beneficiaries are found in the age group of 21-30 years while 302 nos of beneficiaries are found in the age group of 31-40 years. Following table shows the age group of the beneficiaries .

As regards family size, 178 (22.44%) of beneficiaries have 5 members each which is followed by 156 (19.67%) beneficiaries having 4 members each. 71 (8.95%) beneficiaries have large size families having 7 and 8 members respectively. Details are shown in Table – 2.

The male female percentages of the beneficiaries are 53.07 and 46.92

years which is followed by 247 (6.11%) males in the age group 6-10 years and 234 (5.9%) females in the age group of 21-25 years. There were only 105 (2.60%) males and 72 (1.78%) females in the age group 55 + years. The percentage of female children (0-5 years) is 3.56 against male percentage of 4.75.

As regards age and sex distribution of the beneficiaries and their families it was found that 291 (7.20%) males and 288 (7.13%) females were in the age group 16-20 years while 247 (6.11%) males and 234 (5.9%) females were in the age group 6-10 years. The male female percentages of the beneficiaries are 53.07 and 46.92 respectively. Details are shown in the following table.

278 (35.05%) beneficiaries have 2 dependents each followed by 196 (24.71%) beneficiaries each with dependents. There are only 17 (2.14%) beneficiaries having 5+ dependents each. 89 (11.22%) beneficiaries each do not have dependents.

One interesting feature of the evaluation study on scavengers is the high percentage of female with higher educational status in comparison with the male beneficiaries. This is in sharp contrast with other scheduled castes groups of Assam. Perhaps the city dwelling with easily approachable educational centers and comparatively better economic standing contributed to this phenomenon. Thus we have found that out of 793 beneficiaries the female beneficiaries numbering 461 with a percentage of 58.13 surpass the male beneficiaries numbering 332 (41.86%). Majority 94 (11.85%) of the male beneficiaries are found in the class VIII – X level where as majority 112 (14.12% female beneficiaries are located in the class V – VII standard. In the higher level of education the percentages of male are high. Thus against 29 (3.65%) HS passed male there are only 7 (0.88%) females. There are 3 Arts graduate among males while among females there are 2 Arts graduates. Details are shown in Table -5.

Although 27 trades/business have been allotted to 793 beneficiaries under Margin Money Scheme by the Assam State development Corporation and was found that Dry fish business attracted as many as 125 (15.76%) beneficiaries. This was followed by Pan shop business where 102 (12.86%) beneficiaries are engaged. Next choice of the beneficiaries fell upon vegetable shop with 87 (10.97%) beneficiaries. Tent house, firewood, papad making business had 1 beneficiary each. Similarly candle making, homeo clinic attracted 2 (0.25%) beneficiaries each. Details are shown in Table – 6.

Among the beneficiaries there were 129 (16.26%) male and 104 (13.11%) females who had Government jobs . The females out numbered , the males in respect of Government jobs. There were 40 beneficiaries who are engaged in private organization. Out of them 20 (2.52%) are males and 20 (2.52%) are females. Till a few decades back business was not accepted as a source of income but of late the position has completely changed. The study showed that 97 (12.23%) males and 71 (8.95%) females will engaged in business. Ironically self employment was fast reducing due to welfare measures adopted for their rehabilitation . Thus 23 (2.90%) males and 14 (1.76%) females were found in self employment. There was only 1 male Harijan in the technical line. In some Government jobs 2 males (0.25%) and 2 (0.25%) females were engaged. As many as 248 (31.27%) females and 62 (7.81%) males were unemployed. Details are shown in the following Table.

In respect of relation of the beneficiaries to the poverty line under the Margin Money Scheme it was found that the Margin Money Scheme had a positive impact on 134 nos.(16.90%) beneficiaries enabling them to cross the poverty line. Scheme-wise the Pan shop dealers showed much improvement as 36 beneficiaries were able to cross the poverty line out of 102 beneficiaries. The percentage of the beneficiaries of this category, however is 4.53 taking into account of the total 793 beneficiaries. This was followed by Dry fish dealers with 15 beneficiaries out of 125 and Grocery shop owners with 13 beneficiaries out of 77. The percentages being 1.63 and 1.63 respectively. Out of 27 schemes allotted to 793 beneficiaries 10 nos. had no positive impact and their poverty condition remained same as before the implementation of the schemes. These are Radio repairing, Rickshaw, Thela, Homeo clinic, Tent house, Wool knitting making, Fabric painting, Firewood shop and Papad making. Details are shown in Table -9.

Thirteen nationalized banks of the Guwahati city provided the financial back up to the 793 beneficiaries. The Bank of India provided loans to maximum 201 (25.34%) number of beneficiaries followed by the Central Bank of India to 177 (22.32%) beneficiaries and Canara Bank of India to 155 (19.54%) beneficiaries. Details are shown in Table below.

As regards annual monetary income generated by the scheme, the beneficiaries could derive some tangible benefits. Before implementation of the schemes only 228 (28.75%) beneficiaries were in the annual income slab of Rs.30,000.00 and above while the figure increased to 313 (39.47%). The break up is Rs.30,000.00 – Rs.40,000.00 156 (19.67%)beneficiaries, Rs.40,000.00 – Rs.50,000.00 89 (11.22%) beneficiaries, Rs.50,000.00 + 68 (8.57%) beneficiaries.

The female beneficiaries were benefited more than the males. Thus out of 681 beneficiaries implementing the schemes, as many as 385 (48.54%) were females and 2996 (37.33%) were males.

There were 112(14.12%) beneficiaries who were not implementing the schemes sanctioned against them.

Female beneficiaries were more in Pan shop, Stationery, Dry fish, Knitting and Embroidery, Cutting and Tailoring sectors. Details are shown below in Table -11.

The study showed somewhat a tolerable annual income status of the Harijan scheduled castes living in urban areas particularly in a city as the city provides multifarious sources of income. Besides elite poor divide is very conspicuous in the city and the former, by and large depend upon the Harijan even for petty labour non intensive jobs. Thus in our present study quite a large number of beneficiaries i.e. 513 (64.69%) nos. were found in the income slab of Rs.20,000.00 – above 30,000.00. In the lower income slab of Rs.0 – 10,000.00 there were 120 (15.13%)beneficiaries while in the next slab i.e. Rs.10,000.00-20,000.00 there were 160 in (20.17%). Following table shows details of the annual income of the beneficiaries before implementation of the schemes.

In respect of annual income of the beneficiaries after implementation of the schemes, there was a tangible improvement as there were 451 nos. (56.97%) of beneficiaries in the annual income slab of Rs.20,000.00 to Rs.50,000.00 and above. These figures include only the beneficiaries who had actually implemented the schemes. There were 112 (14.12%) beneficiaries who did not implement the schemes willfully. In the annual income slab of Rs.10,000.00 – Rs.20,000.00 there were only 139 (17.53%) beneficiaries while in the next lower category i.e. Rs. 0 – 10,000.00, there were 91 (11.47%) beneficiaries. It is disheartening to note that majority of the beneficiaries did not take the business propositions seriously. Out of 793 beneficiaries as many as 495 (62.42%) beneficiaries discontinued their business. In the Dry fish business 95 out of 125 beneficiaries discontinued. Similarly in Piggery, Poultry, Tailoring and Vegetable shop business sizeable beneficiaries discontinued. Details are shown in the following table.

The beneficiaries in general were elated to find the most desired scheme although some of them had to face some difficulties while going to receive the loans which we have mentioned in the Investigators' Report. Quite a good number of beneficiaries deviated their schemes, perhaps to suit their economic status and aptitude. These beneficiaries showed much eagerness to invest more money in the deviated schemes. Thus 36 (4.53%) beneficiaries invested more money in their schemes. Among such, beneficiaries highest number was found among Pan shop owners and the figure was 13 which was followed by 5 Piggery owners, 4 Fruitshop owners, 3 each of Tea stall and Knitting and Embroidery owners. Details are shown the following table.

It has been observed that before allotting new schemes to the beneficiaries who are quite new in trade and commerce and need based schemes only should have been formulated. In the instant case altogether 36 nos. (4.53%) of beneficiaries changed to new schemes as the allotted schemes appeared to be in productive. Thus 7 (0.88%) beneficiaries switched over to Pan shop, 4 (0.50%) beneficiaries each changed to Fruit shop, Piggery and Tea stall. Incidentally out of 36 beneficiaries only 28 (3.53%) beneficiaries were benefited by the new schemes. The table below shows the trade wise position of the beneficiaries who changed to new scheme.

The beneficiaries were complaining about the insufficiency of the sanctioned amount and as many as 719 (90.66%) beneficiaries contributed money towards their schemes. 685 (86.38%) beneficiaries contributed Rs.3000.00 and above each, 13 (1.63%) beneficiaries contributed Rs.2001 – 3000.00 each, 19 (2.39%) beneficiaries contributed Rs.1000.00 -2000.00 each and 2 (0.25%) beneficiaries contributed less than Rs.1000.00 each for their schemes 74 nos. (9.33%) of beneficiaries did not contribute any amount. Details are shown below.

As regards additional loan incurred during the operation of the schemes only 75 (9.45%) beneficiaries incurred the same from other sources.

It was found that 35 (4.41%) nos. of beneficiaries opted for new schemes without permission from the authorities. 12 (1.51%) beneficiaries deviated to Pan shop 3 (0.37%) beneficiaries deviated to Dry fish, 3 (0.37%) to Knitting and Embroidery, 2 (0.25%) each to Fruit shop, Stationery, Tea stall, Grocery shop and 1 each to Rickshaw, Poultry, Auto Van, Car repairing, Cloth shop, Shoe repair, Piggery, Cycle repairing and Book stall.

There were 48 nos. (6.05%) of beneficiaries who were not repaying anything and the reason showed was poor economic condition. The surprising feature of repayment system was that 33 nos. (4.16%) of beneficiaries failed to repay under the spacious ground of intentionally. It was not known how these beneficiaries dared to disobey the terms and conditions of the loan. The loans in most cases were channalised through the middleman and the beneficiaries were not well versed with the terms and conditions. Thus 32 nos (4.03%) of beneficiaries did not repay due to lack of knowledge. One (0.3%) beneficiary failed to repay due to non utilization of the loan against the sanctioned scheme. Table below shows the repayment position.

The study showed that the money sanctioned to the beneficiaries for undertaking trades appeared to be by and large, sufficient as 517 (65.19%) beneficiaries considered the amounts to be sufficient while only 276 (34.81%) beneficiaries considered the loan amount as insufficient. The very intention of creating opportunities of self employment among the backward scavengers thereby rehabilitating them appeared to be partially successful, as 403 (50.81%) beneficiaries have failed to achieve their goal. But the effort will bear fruit in long course as the Harijans are quite new in trade and business. Besides they are so hard pressed in respect of running day to day affairs that most of the loan amounts could not be utilized for the proposed business. The extravagant nature particularly the addiction of alcohol is one of the major reasons of failure to achieve goal in business. The following table shows the trade and business wise percentage of failures.

The very purpose of providing relief to the depressed scavengers has been by and large, nullified as sizeable number of beneficiaries, 170 (21.43%) preferred to abstain from implementing their allotted schemes. Only 34 (4.29%) beneficiaries invested the loan in other purpose or trades sanctioned by the authorities. The educational level of the beneficiaries showed that the Harijans were new entrants in the trade sphere and naturally they were to be guided off and on. Mere sanctioning of loan was not enough. The Corporation issued beneficiary cards to only 32 (4.03%) and rest of 761 (95.96%) had not got the benefit of beneficiary card.

As regards residential facilities only 370 (46.65%) beneficiaries enjoyed the same while 423 (53.34%) beneficiaries were not getting the same facilities.

The well meaning welfare scheme could not attract all the beneficiaries as only 451 (56.87%) beneficiaries reported that the scheme benefited them while 342 (43.12%) beneficiaries gave an emphatic no.

Untouchability cuts at the root of development of the Scheduled Castes more particularly among the Harijans. But in Assam untouchability is not openly practiced, rather a disguised form of the evil practice is traced.

Hence 357 (45.01%) beneficiaries were of the opinion that untouchability prevails while 436 (54.98%) beneficiaries did not face the prevalence of the evil practice.

For an egalitarian society social intercourse among various castes is of prime importance. This inter caste amity is further strengthened with inter caste marriage and Government have announced incentives in this regard. But in the instant study 424 (54.09%) the Harijans did not prefer inter caste marriage and 364 (45.90%) beneficiaries preferred such marriage.

For a healthier family life, the small family norm has been largely accepted. The media plays a great role in this regards. Unless some drastic measure to contract the population explosion is taken, the phenomenon may cause havoc to the population in the near future. The beneficiaries felt the urgency of controlling the families and as many as 716 (90.29%) were accepting the family planning practices. Only 77 (9.70%) beneficiaries were reluctant to accept the family planning practices.

The beneficiaries as they are city dwellers, believed in the modern health care system. The study showed that 699 (88.15%) availed modern medicine. This avoidance, perhaps was due to high cost of modern health practices coupled with poverty condition.

The practices of traditional medicine is fast losing ground among the Scheduled Castes. In the present study 644 (81.21%) were not accepting the traditional medicine and only 149 (18.78%) were using the traditional medicine

The National Schemes for Rehabilitation of the Scavengers and Their Dependents should have been largely accepted by the most down trodden people of the society without any reservation. But the study showed only 516 (65.06%) beneficiaries were appreciating the scheme containing ingredients of uplifting the Harijans. On the other hand 277 (34.93%) beneficiaries found fault with the scheme, particularly in respect of implementing stage.

However, the benevolent scheme gave much relief in various sectors of family management. As many as 475 (59.89%) beneficiaries could improve the household paraphernalia's and 305 (38.46%) beneficiaries could spend amounts for the education of their children. Improvements took place in health and sanitation (23.32%), housing condition 25.47%), drinking water facilities (16.39%) and in clothing (8.07%) (Table – 25).

Tangible improvement could have been noticed that the Harijan (at least the section engaged in cleaning) avoided the practice of taking locally brewed rice beer or cheap alcohols.

## CHAPTER – IV

### FINDINGS OF THE STUDY

The Evaluation study on the National scheme for Liberation and rehabilitation of the Scavengers and Their Dependents (NSLR) conducted on 793 beneficiaries of nine Harijan Colonies spread over the city of Guwahati during 2005-2006 indicated that female beneficiaries have come to the fore front in respect of trade and commerce business activities. This is a new trend in as much as the womenfolk till a decade or two back rarely entered into business. The phenomenon appears to be conspicuous when we find Harijan women, who are characteristically shy in the matter of public relations and who prefer to avoid the non Harijan male persons, entering into trade affairs in a big way. Thus in the instant case there are 461 (58.13%) women beneficiaries against 332 (41.86%) male beneficiaries.

Most of the beneficiaries numbering 335 (42.24%) are in the age group 21-30 years. There are only 12 males and 12 females beneficiaries in the age group 51 + years.

Women beneficiaries were more in the class V – VIII standard i.e. 112 females against 77 males. In other categories, of course males have high percentages. There are 3 male and 2 female Graduates among the Harijan beneficiaries.

Illiterate persons are more among women (22.32%) in comparision to men (4.66%).

Dry fish business attracted highest number of beneficiaries (15.76%) followed by Pan shop (12.86%).

It is seen that 129 (16.25%) males and 104 (13.11%) females are engaged in Government jobs while 23 males and 14 females are engaged in self employment. 97 males and 71 females are doing business.

Out of 793, 134 (16.90%) beneficiaries crossed the poverty line after implementation of the scheme.

Before implementation of the scheme there were 228 (28.75%) beneficiaries in the annual income slab of Rs.30,000.00 and above while the figure increased to 313 (39.47%) after implementation of the scheme.

112 (14.12%) beneficiaries failed to implement the schemes allotted to them.

Female beneficiaries preferred Pan shop, Sationery, Dry fish, Knitting and Embroidery, Cutting and Tailoring trades.

The margin money scheme had a positive impact on 134 (16.90%) beneficiaries enabling them to cross the poverty line.

Schemewise the Pan shop dealers showed much improvement as 36 beneficiaries out of 102 could cross the poverty line.

Quite a large number, 513 (64.69%) beneficiaries are found in the income slab of Rs.20,000.00 – Rs.30,000.00 and above.

In respect of annual income after implementation of the scheme there is an improvement as 451 (56.87%) beneficiaries are in the annual income slab of Rs.20,000.00- Rs. 50,000.00 and above. These figures are drawn from those beneficiaries who had actually implemented the scheme.

As many as 495 (65.42%) beneficiaries discontinued business due to various reasons like poverty, lack of interest etc. 36 (4.53%) beneficiaries deviated to new schemes. 35 (4.41%) beneficiaries opted for new schemes without permission and 14 (1.76%) beneficiaries deviated without permission and 14 (1.76%) beneficiaries deviated to new scheme with permission.

As many as 685 (86.38%) beneficiaries felt the loan amount to be insufficient compelling them to contribute Rs.3,000.00 each for their schemes.

75 (9.45%) beneficiaries incurred additional loan during operation of the scheme.

Instalments of repayment were paid amounting to Rs.110,60,50.00 and an amount of Rs.6,99,800.00 remained outstanding.

48 (6.05%) beneficiaries did not repay due to poverty and 33 nos. (4.16%) did not repay intentionally. 32 (4.03%) did not repay due to lack of knowledge . Middle man played a major role in the loan transactions.

519 (65.19%) felt the loan amount as sufficient while 34.81% considered the loan as insufficient.

403 (50.81%) beneficiaries received beneficiaries failed to achieve their goal.

Only 32 (4.03%) beneficiaries received beneficiary card

370 (46.65%) beneficiaries got residential benefits provided by the Guwahati Municipal Corporation.

451 (56.87%) reported that the scheme benefited them.

357 (45.01%) beneficiaries were of the opinion that untouchability still prevails.

424 (54.09%) scavengers did not prefer inter caste marriage.

As many as 716 (90.29%) beneficiaries forwarded the Family Planning Scheme.

699 (89.15%) preferred modern medicine and 644 (81.21%) lost faith in traditional healing practices. 516 (65.06%) welcomed the NSLR schemes while 277 (34.93%) found fault in respect of implementation of the scheme.

The scheme provided scope to improve material objects (59.89%); education of children (38.46%), health condition (23.32%), housing (25.47%), drinking water (16.39%).

## CHAPTER – V

### **INVESTIGATOR'S REMARK**

#### **The Morakhali Housing Colony**

The surrounding is unhealthy while the new constructions have better facilities "we got a very bad external impression as it is almost impossible to stay there for investigation." The internal condition of the houses, however had modern touch with colour T.V., C.D. players, Gas stove, mobile phone etc.

"Most of the beneficiaries did not start the trades. Some started but soon left. The local leaders deprived the simple and unsophisticated scavengers. The corporation officials did not issue beneficiary cards, nor they visited the trades.

#### **Gotanagar Housing Colony, Maligaon**

Most of the beneficiaries did not invest the loans in trades. Many refused to give details of their trades because they utilized the loan for other purpose. The local leaders played a major role in the loan transactions and loans were not distributed properly. 'Some beneficiaries were untraced while a few lower aged persons got the loan benefits.

#### **Fatasil Ambari Housing Colony**

Loans were used for other purposes. Needy scavengers did not get loans. There were bogus loanees. "When I went to bank, I found that all the loans were sanctioned. The receipts with signature were there". The scheme is a failure as a whole.

#### **Dispur Last Gate Housing Colony**

Loans were not properly utilized. Loanamounts were spent on luxury items of household. "Loans are received by those who are above the poverty lines. Most of the beneficiaries complained that they received only the subsidy amount. The middle men took 3 to 4 thousands. In some families there are 3 to 4 beneficiaries. Most of the women beneficiaries got married and left the place for other states. There are many government service holders among the beneficiaries.

#### **Pandu Loco Colony, Maligaon**

Loan amount is too little. Most of the beneficiaries failed to start business.

#### **G M C Colony, Chabipul**

Most of the beneficiaries got only subsidy portion of loans. Middle men charged 3 to 4 thousand from each beneficiary. None is below the poverty line.

## CHAPTER – VI

### CONCLUSION

The well meaning of National Scheme for Liberation and Rehabilitation of Scavengers and Their Dependents could have brought a metamorphic change among the most depressed and social out caste section of the society, had the implementing authorities taken steps for mid term or concurrent evaluation followed by follow up action. The study revealed a picture of mixed success and failure. Instances are galore regarding utilization of the loan amount for others purposes, receipt of only the subsidy amount, amount not sufficient, beneficiary cards not issued, Corporation did not visit, harassment by officials, beneficiaries could not be traced in the address supplied by the Corporation, middle men played a distinctive role in loan transaction, beneficiaries left the place to unknown destination after receiving the loan et.al.

The scavengers are not well versed in the critical sphere of trade and commerce. Traditionally business was not in their blood and the new ventures are foreign to their psyche and style of life. Besides they are so hard pressed that the loan amount was consumed to meet the day to day needs and they hardly realized that business allotted to them would fetch them good earning in the long run.

The schemes chalked out for the scavengers are quite satisfactory and the Corporation's efforts to rehabilitate the scavengers are praise worthy. As shown in the findings of the survey, almost all the beneficiaries wanted more such schemes as they could improve much in respect of material cultural objects, increased annual income health and health seeking behaviour, education of their children, drinking water, clothings etc. The women folk are coming out to accept the challenges of time which is reflected in the sizeable number of trades allotted to them.

We may suggest the following measures for successful implementation of the benevolent scheme.

1. There should be mid term Evaluation of the implementation of the scheme.
2. The Corporation Officials should visit the beneficiaries and offer necessary guidance to the traders who are quite novice in the line.
3. Motivation regarding the essentiality of the scheme and long run economic gain should be emphasized.
4. There should be a preliminary survey of this socio-economic condition of the scavengers so that the actual needy scavengers get the loan benefits.

5. Middle men should be eliminated. The field staff of the Corporation and Financial Institutions should extend necessary help to the beneficiaries regarding loan formalities.
6. Defaulters should be brought to book, otherwise morale of the timely depositors would be slackened.
7. A sizeable section of the beneficiaries complained of insufficiency of the loan amount requiring them to take additional loan from bank/other sources. The Corporation official may assist the beneficiaries after making proper assessment.
8. Beneficiary cards should be issued to all beneficiaries.
9. Quite a large section of the beneficiaries complained of receiving only the subsidy portion of the loan. There should be proper vigil in this regard.

Similarly loans should be realized from willful defaulters and women beneficiaries leaving the place after receiving the loan regarding more scheme among them
