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FOREWORD

The enactment of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 (Forest Rights Act) and Rules 2008, is an important watershed in the history of tribal empowerment in India especially relating to tenure security on forests and forest land. The enactment of Forest Rights Act marked a historic journey to recognize and vest Forest Rights to the marginalised and vulnerable tribals and other traditional forest dwellers who are dependent on forests for their sustenance and their existence.

The law has special significance for Odisha where as much as 39.31% of land area is classified as legally recorded forests. The state is home to as many as 62 Scheduled Tribes, including 13 Primitive Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs), who constitute over 22.8% of its population and are critically dependent on forest lands for their livelihoods and survival.

Forest Rights Act, for the first time, recognizes the "rights over community tenures of habitat and habitation for primitive tribal groups and pre-agricultural communities". Recognition of habitat rights of PVTGs under FRA will help in protection of their culture, customs and identity by providing them security of tenure over their customary habitat.

The current initiative of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Research & Training Institute (SCSTRI), Government of Odisha in Mapping the Potential Habitat Rights of PVTGs under FRA will aid in devising district and micro-project specific strategies for recognition of habitat rights in a time bound manner. I am confident that the Potential Habitat Rights Atlas of PVTGs in Odisha will bring greater focus and targeted interventions in effective implementation of Forest Rights Act in the State.

I congratulate Prof. (Dr.) A B Ota, Director & Special Secretary, SCSTRTI and his associates for this laudable initiative.

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PREFACE

The enactment of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 (Forest Rights Act) and Rules 2008, is an important watershed in the history of tribal empowerment in India especially relating to tenure security on forests and forest land. The law has special significance for Odisha where as much as 37.34% of land area is classified as legally recorded forests. The state is home to as many as 62 Scheduled Tribes including 13 Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs).

The historic Forest Rights Act of 2006 for the first time provided scope for the recognition of the PVTGs' forest and habitat rights which includes right to 'community tenures over the habitat' of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) and pre-agricultural communities.

Mapping of Potential Habitat Rights of PVTGs under FRA is an attempt to make a preliminary assessment of the potential forest area over which habitat rights can be recognized in Odisha under the Forest Rights Act (FRA). The estimate offers a baseline for informing implementation, planning, and setting targets for habitat rights recognition of PVTGs under the FRA. PVTGs have customary habitats which are eligible for rights recognition under Habitat Rights provisions of FRA. However, it is not possible to estimate the habitat rights areas of the PVTGs without actual mapping of the customary boundaries based on the traditional access and practises of each of the PVTGs.

The **Habitat Rights Atlas** has attempted to make a preliminary assessment of the potential habitat area of PVTGs in Odisha over which habitat rights can be recognised under FRA. The Atlas covers Micro Project wise GIS map plates showing estimate of Potential Habitat Rights of PVTGs. GIS maps of Potential Habitat Rights for 11 PVTGs covering 17 Micro Projects have been developed and provided in the Atlas. For 2 PVTGs (Lodha and Lanjia Saora), habitat rights maps were not prepared as both the PVTG communities claimed to have no habitat rights to be claimed under FRA.

The Habitat Rights Atlas can be used as a monitoring tool by the District and State Authorities to track the progress of habitat rights claim making. Micro Project wise number of PVTG habitations have been mapped along with estimation of potential forest area over which Habitat Rights can be recognized under FRA.

The Habitat Rights Atlas is a first-of-its kind attempt to assess the Habitat Rights potential of PVTGs in the State which will allow the government, policy makers to assess the extent to which the law has been implemented. The Atlas can be used to devise district and micro project specific appropriate strategies for completion of habitat rights determination process in a time bound manner.

The Atlas can act as an effective monitoring as well as planning tool for tracking the FRA implementation and planning for the livelihood enhancement and development of the Scheduled Tribes and PVTGs in particular.

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
REVIEW OF THE REPORT

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

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BACKGROUND

The Forest Rights Act (FRA) is a milestone in the legislative history of independent India. This is due to its mandate to 'undo the historical injustice' done to millions of forest dwelling tribal and other communities whose pre-existing rights were not recognised during the consolidation of state forests. The FRA recognises diverse individual and community forest rights. This includes the right to 'community tenures over the habitat' of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) and pre-agricultural communities.

There are 75 centrally recognised PVTGs in the country. These communities have faced the maximum alienation from their customary forested habitats at least for 150 years with initiation of permanent settlement by the British followed by unabated alienation after independence. PVTGs are among the most marginalised and vulnerable groups in India today. They are often not settled agriculturists, are often regarded with hostility or indifference by other communities (including other tribal communities), tend to live in remote areas and are outside most systems of education and social provisions in the country.

Odisha houses 13 PVTGs – highest among all the States and Union Territories of India. The PVTGs inhabit in 1683 villages/settlements distributed in 285 Gram Panchayats (GPs) under 42 Blocks and 14 districts of Odisha. There are as many as 1,79,742 households with total population of 7,73,092¹.

For all-round development of PVTGs, 20 Micro Projects are operating

in the State out of which 14 Micro Projects are located within the Scheduled Area and remaining 6 are located outside the TSP area. PVTG families are being assisted by Micro Projects under various schemes like agriculture, horticulture, soil conservation, animal husbandry etc. Besides basic infrastructure facilities drinking water, education, health, link roads are being provided in Micro Project Areas with focussed attention.

Special development projects and agencies have been launched for their development although none of these has attempted to recognise and secure their rights over their habitats and resources or prevent their further alienation and marginalization.

HABITAT RIGHTS AND FRA PROVISIONS

The historic Forest Rights Act of 2006 for the first time provided scope for the recognition of the PVTGs' forest and habitat rights. Section 2 (h) of the FRA defines habitat as: 'Habitat includes the area comprising the customary habitat and such other habitats in reserved forests and protected forests of primitive tribal groups and pre-agricultural communities and other forest dwelling Scheduled Tribes'.

The definition thus extends the recognition of habitat rights to other STs in addition to PVTGs and pre-agricultural communities. Section 3 (e) recognises: 'Rights including community tenures of habitat and habitation for primitive tribal groups and pre-agricultural communities'. Section 5 (c) of FRA empowers forest right holders and their institutions to: 'Ensure that the habitat of forest dwelling Scheduled Tribes and other traditional forest dwellers is preserved from any form of destructive practices affecting their cultural and natural heritage'

Thus, the FRA and its Rules give special emphasis on ensuring recognition of the habitat rights of PVTGs and pre-agricultural communities.

STATUS OF HABITAT RIGHTS RECOGNITION AND KEY ISSUES AND CHALLENGES

It has been about 13 years since the FRA came into force, however, only instances of claims of Habitat rights have been reported from Juangs and Mankidias in Odisha, Baiga in Madhya Pradesh and Maria Gond from Maharashtra. But till date, no habitat right of PVTG across the country is reported to have been recognized.

There are inherent challenges and operational difficulties in extending recognition of Habitat Rights to PVTGs. Lack of clarity about the meaning of 'habitat' and related rights under the FRA, in particular the right to community tenures of habitat, lack of clarity about the procedure for the recognition of the habitat rights of PVTG communities given that their claims may extend across multiple settlements over a large geographical area are some of the key bottlenecks with regard to implementation of FRA provisions related to habitat rights recognition.

In the above context, it is felt that a detailed guideline on determination and recognition of habitat rights under FRA is required on a priority basis which will help the States in mapping and recognition of habitat rights of PVTGs.

Keeping this in view, SCSTRTI has undertaken the research study on mapping of potential habitat rights of all the 13 PVTGs in Odisha and has developed step wise detailed process guidelines on determination and mapping of potential habitat rights of PVTGs under FRA. Further, SCSTRI, Bhubaneswar as Nodal Resource Centre on FRA has prepared a Resource Pool on FRA and, if required, can extend technical support to TRIs of other states for preparation of potential habitat rights claims by the respective States.

FOREST RIGHTS ACT AND RIGHTS OF PARTICULARLY VULNERABLE TRIBAL GROUPS:

Many development initiatives have been carried out in the past with special attention for the all-round betterment of PVTGs and also continuing today to reduce vulnerability through assured livelihood security of the PVTGs. However, one of the extremely critical and vital issues i.e., tenure security over resources, very much indispensable for the livelihood security and development of PVTGs, did not draw attention in the process of development planning and policy making for decades. Because for the traditional communities without having security of tenure over those resources upon which they have been customarily and critically depending, thinking of their livelihood security and development have been an insignificant endeavour. The processes of exclusion from those rights have been a major challenge to their food security and livelihood. Therefore, after long-time, to make solution for those issues, the nation has enacted The Scheduled Tribes and other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act 2006 for undoing "the historical injustices" under which there are special provisions to recognize the "rights over community tenures of habitat and habitation for primitive tribal groups and pre-agricultural communities,". This would help in reducing all types of exploitation through protection of their culture, customs, identity, and territory and can provide them security of tenure over their customary habitat, over forest resources and livelihood. The law has also empowerment to protect, regenerate or conserve or manage any community forest resources, wildlife and biodiversity for sustainable use, in which the PVTGs and indigenous forest dwelling communities have contributed significantly by using their knowledge potential in a more holistic and sustainable manner.

Section 3(1)(e) of the Act provides for rights including community tenures of habitat and habitation for primitive tribal groups and preagricultural communities. The process of determination of rights as provided in the rules prescribes a special procedure to deal with the rights of the PVTGs. Rule 12 (d) provides that the claims from member of a primitive tribal group for determination of their right to habitat can be made through their community or traditional community institution and that the FRC has to ensure that the claims are verified when such communities or their representatives are present. Further Rule 8 (b) requires the DLC to examine whether claims from the PTGs have been addressed as per the objectives of the Act.

OBJECTIVE OF THE STUDY:

The specific study objectives are:

- To map the nature and extent of the habitat rights of each of the 13 PVTG in Odisha and prepare habitat rights claims for each of the PVTG community
- To develop guidelines along with compilation of evidences for recognition of habitat rights
- To extend technical support/advice to TRI of other States for preparation of potential habitat rights claims by the respective States

The first objective of the study is broadly divided into two broad categories mentioned below:

1. Identifying the nature and extent of the habitat of a concerned PVTG.

- Understanding the concept of Habitat of PVTGs
- Mapping of Potential Habitat Area of each of the PVTG
- Discussion with Traditional Leaders and PVTG groups in mapping the habitat boundary
- 2. The Determination and recognition process of Habitat rights under FRA:
 - What is the procedure that the community and different authentic body under the Act should follow to ensure the recognition of habitat rights for PVTGs
 - How can the traditional institutions of the PVTG be incorporated in the decision making process
 - What records would SDLCs & DLCs need to provide and in what manner.
 - In what manner can the SDLCs & DLCs facilitate the preparation and filing of claims to this right.

STUDY UNIVERSE

All 13 PVTGs of Odisha spread across 20 Micro Project Agencies have been covered under the study for the purpose of mapping of potential habitat rights of each PVTG.

METHODOLOGY FOR MAPPING OF POTENTIAL HABITAT RIGHTS

Parameters for identifying the nature and extent of habitat rights of a concerned PVTG

1. Ecological Parameters: [Natural Markers]

- Land
- Water (Riverbank, Stream)
- Mountains
- Movement of wild animals
- Movement of inhabitants
- Land Contour

BASIS OF MAPPING AND DETERMINATION OF HABITAT RIGHTS²

I. INFORMATION RELATED TO CLAN: CLAN IDENTITY

Most PVTGs (and other tribal groups/ castes) are divided into clans which are exogamous i.e.no marriages can happen between persons from the same clan as they are considered to be brothers and sisters. These clans draw their identity from certain geographical locations which often house their deities or from certain natural entities which may include plants and wildlife. Their religious rights over such geographical locations need recognition, their right to protect and conserve such natural entities (as enshrined in their clan beliefs and practices/behaviour) needs recognition and such places of their religious and spiritual importance (irrespective of their geographical distance from their actual settlement) should be granted protection from any action that might lead to their any modification or destruction of such place in part or full.

II. INFORMATION ABOUT THEIR SOCIAL AND CULTURAL SITES:

The PVTGs observe social and cultural rituals by organising fairs (melas) at different intervals and at different places. The periodicity of

such social and cultural rituals and their location of the place is often dynamic and changes at varied frequency. In many cases, some local haat (village markets) specific to a PVTG community also constitutes the place. Given their traditions, such places will get shifted over time with new places being added to the list.

As a part of their habitat rights, it is imperative that while rights over existing cultural sites and the right to organise them as per their beliefs and customs need recognition, the right to decide and identify newer sites within their habitat for holding their rituals/ cultural events in future would also require recognition. The PVTGs' traditional institutions need to be empowered to decide whether any major land use change in the area should be permitted or not. This would imply extending the requirement for gram sabha consent for forest diversion needed in other areas to the entire habitat. It is important to mention here that all rituals, social and cultural activities and events of PVTGs are deeply connected with forests and other elements of nature.

III. INFORMATION ABOUT THEIR LIVELIHOODS AND SITES OF LIVELIHOOD:

This may include sites of their agroforestry based ancestral farming practices (referred to as podu, bewar, dongar chas etc. in local parlance), areas from where items are gathered and extracted from forests, sites for gathering medicinal plants etc. There is need for recognition of their forms of livelihood practices based on forest and geographical sites which support such livelihoods. The practice of cultivation on hill slopes or hill tops in rotation is found in varying degrees amongst different PVTGs. While communities living in lower hills or plains were successfully forced by the government to abandon such practices due

to these being considered ecologically destructive, in many locations where plain land is absolutely missing, this practice is still prevalent and provides a crucial source of their livelihood as also evident from the field studies. It becomes important that any such existing practices of traditional farming area should be recognised and the existing nature of de facto rights currently enjoyed (individual or communal) over such areas under such cultivation should be are recognised in its present form.

IV. INFORMATION ABOUT OTHER IMPORTANT LANDMARKS:

These can include like hills, rivers, streams, vegetation, grasses, particular tree species etc. which provide other land marks for delineating the boundaries and extent of their territory, the sub-territories and their social, cultural, religious, economic and political linkages.

V. INFORMATION ABOUT THEIR SONGS AND NARRATIVES:

Places, objects, beliefs, rituals described in the songs and narratives of PVTG communities provide important information about the traits of their habitat.

VI. TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE:

The PVTGs, especially their elderly population have a huge repository of knowledge about medicinal plants, sites where they are most available, wildlife, behaviour of wildlife, their corridors etc. While they are reluctant to divulge details of their medicinal knowledge, they are inclined to suggest different geographical sites or forests where there is rich concentration of medicinal plants or forest areas/zones having good wildlife population and types of wildlife. Their rights over indigenous knowledge about their ecology of their habitat need due recognition

and should form the basis of its governance and management of such areas where they have a significant stake.

VII. ARCHIVAL/SECONDARY MATERIAL:

This also provides historical information about the settlement of particular PVTG communities which can also be used sourced as evidence for filing their claim. In addition to this, Copies of any old records available with the villagers (e.g. pattas or rights allowed by an ex-King) and traditional leaders should also be collected in support of claims. The concerned DLCs should source such material and make them available to all concerned gram sabhas. Copies of all such materials should be made available to the concerned Gram Sabhas/FRCs prior to the initiation of the consultation and claim filing process.

PROCESS STEPS TO PREPARE THE HABITAT ATLAS OF PVTGs IN ODISHA

The following steps had been pursued to map the potential maps of the habitat rights.

MAPPING OF HABITAT RIGHTS OF PVTGs

STEP 1: INITIATION OF THE HABITAT RIGHTS MAPPING PROCESS

- The research team discussed with Special Officers of the respective Micro Project Agencies regarding the habitat rights mapping process of the PVTGs.
- Consultation workshops were held with the District Officials (PAITDAs, DWOs, Special Officers, DLC, SDLC members etc.), Civil Society Organisations, Domain Experts, Traditional Leaders etc. regarding concept of habitat rights of PVTGs and process of determination of habitat rights under FRA

District Officials communicated the initiation of the process
of determining habitat rights to the PVTGs. Communication
regarding the initiation of PVTG Habitat Rights recognition
process was made by the district officials by providing
information about the communities whose rights are thus
to be determined through locally used traditional means of
communication to inform people. Gram Sabha presidents of
the respective settlements, civil society organisations, PVTG
leaders, or village messengers were involved to publicise and
communicate the information

STEP 2: DETERMINING HABITAT RIGHTS IN CONSULTATION WITH THE TRADITIONAL INSTITUTIONS OF PVTGs

- A meeting was organized with the traditional institutions (socialcultural-political-economy) of the PVTGs and Gram Sabha presidents for the purpose of mapping and determination of habitat rights
- The research team and the district administration consulted the Gram Sabha presidents and traditional leaders to identify a suitable place for consultations to initiate the process of determining habitat rights with ensuring the participation of women in these consultations.

Following aspects were discussed in the consultations:

 Identifying socio-cultural and livelihood activities performed in the area to be claimed under habitat rights. These habitat rights could be claimed over a larger area or divided into smaller areas which could be separately claimed under habitat rights based on the decision of the traditional leaders during the consultations.

- Identifying the area to be claimed under habitat rights and prepare a tentative map marking out the boundary and landmarks of socio-cultural and livelihood needs of the PVTGs.
- Identifying the rights under the FRA of non-PVTGs residing in the area identified to be claimed under habitat rights.
- Identify habitat rights claims made over areas covering more than one district or state.
- List out the documents needed for claiming the habitat rights.

STEP 3: COMPILATION AND CONSOLIDATION OF THE PVTG HABITATIONS/VILLAGES

District and Micro Project wise PVTG villages/habitations were consolidated using the Census 2011 data and the baseline survey report of the year 2015 & 2018 conducted by SCSTRTI, ST & SC Development Department, Govt. of Odisha. PVTG villages along with the population, geographical areas and revenue forest were compiled from the Census 2011 data and baseline survey report 2015 & 2018.

The village details tables from the census provides the extent of forest land and other land within the village boundaries. This data is collected by the Census from the official land records and therefore provides the best proxy for actual legal status of forests inside village boundaries as per the land records. (Village Details provided in Annexure)

STEP 4: ESTIMATING POPULATION FOR HABITAT RIGHTS RECOGNITION:

Using the Census 2011 data and baseline survey report conducted by SCSTRTI in 2015 & 2018, the estimated population of the PVTGs in

the villages within the habitat was calculated. This estimated PVTG population figure is an approximation of the number of PVTG people whose habitat rights can be recognized under FRA.

STEP 5: ESTIMATING THE POTENTIAL HABITAT AREA:

A. ASSESSING REVENUE FOREST AREAS WITHIN VILLAGE BOUNDARIES

- ➤ The forest area potential for recognition of habitat rights under FRA in Odisha has been estimated using the data available in the State of Forest Report, 1999 of the Forest Survey of India and Census 2011.
- ➤ The PVTG village details tables from the Census provide the extent of forest land within the village boundaries. This data is collected by the Census from the official land records and therefore provides the best proxy for actual legal status of forests inside village boundaries as per the land records.
- An assumption has been made, following the methodology used in FSI, 1999, that inclusion of forests within revenue village boundaries reflects and legitimizes the use, interaction and dependence of the village communities (of PVTGs/STs and other traditional forest dwellers) on such forests. This assumption is also based on the fact that rules under FRA require the district level committees to ensure that habitat rights are recognized in all these habitations where PVTGs are residing and are traditionally, socio-culturally and economically dependent on the forests.

B. ASSESS FORESTS OUTSIDE REVENUE VILLAGE BOUNDARIES

The second step assessed additional forest areas which are outside the revenue boundaries and are customarily used by the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) and thus eligible for habitat rights recognition under the FRA.

- ➤ It is estimated that the habitat rights of PVTGs to be claimed by their traditional institutions/leaders under FRA includes all potential villages inhabited by the respective PVTGs.
- ➤ The Census data provides information on forest land located within revenue village boundaries, but doesn't include forest areas outside revenue village boundaries which may be coming within the customary boundary of the concerned habitat and therefore can be claimed for habitat rights under FRA.
- ➤ The habitat rights maps were drawn in consultation with the traditional leaders/institutions of the PVTGs along with the FRC members, PVTG members etc. Gram Sabha meetings were held covering all the PVTG villages/habitations and the hand drawn habitat maps were approved by the Gram Sabhas.
- ➤ A tentative hand drawn social map of the area to be claimed under habitat rights was prepared marking out the boundary and landmarks of socio-cultural and livelihood needs of the PVTGs.
- ➤ The hand drawn habitat maps were superimposed with toposheets and the potential forest area covered outside the village boundaries was calculated

Using this method, it is estimated that the area of forest lying outside village cadastral boundaries and eligible to be claimed as habitat rights under FRA in Odisha is at least 0.9 mha.

C. POTENTIAL HABITAT RIGHTS AREA OF PVTG (MICRO PROJECT WISE)

- ➤ Using the above methodology, the GIS based potential habitat maps of 11 PVTG communities across 17 Micro Projects have been developed. In case of 2 PVTGs (Lanjia Saora and Lodhas) habitat maps were not prepared as both the PVTG communities claimed not to have any habitat rights concept. (Resolution of Traditional leaders and community members of Lodhas and Lanjia Saora have been annexed in the report.)
- Micro Project wise potential habitat rights maps were developed covering all the PVTG habitations as well as the forest and non forest areas over which the PVTGs are traditionally and culturally dependent and interact for their livelihood, social, and cultural practices
- The potential habitat area which can be claimed under FRA comes around 1.1 mha ha (includes Revenue Forest Area and Forest Areas beyond village boundaries) over which the PVTGs are customarily dependent upon. (Refer Table 2)

PURPOSE AND UTILITY OF THE HABITAT RIGHTS ATLAS

'Habitat Rights' of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) and pre-agricultural communities under Forest Rights Act constitute rights over customary territories used by the PVTGs for habitation, livelihoods, social, economic, spiritual, sacred, religious and other purposes.

PVTGs have customary habitats which are eligible for rights recognition under Habitat Rights provisions of FRA. It is not possible to estimate the habitat rights areas of the PVTGs without actual mapping of the customary boundaries based on the traditional access and practises of each of the PVTGs.

The Atlas has attempted to make a preliminary assessment of the potential habitat area of PVTGs in Odisha over which habitat rights can be recognised under FRA. The estimate provided offers a baseline for planning and effective implementation of habitat rights recognition under the FRA and allows policy makers to monitor and evaluate the extent to which the law has been implemented.

MONITORING & PLANNING TOOL

The Habitat Rights Atlas can be used as a monitoring tool by the District and State Authorities to track the progress of claim making. PVTG wise number of potential habitat villages have been estimated along with approx. forest area over which Habitat Rights can be recognized under FRA. The progress made against the estimated potential can be reviewed and real time tracking can be done to ensure effective implementation of the Act. The Atlas can be used to devise district and micro-project specific appropriate strategies for completion of habitat rights determination process in a time bound manner.

N.B:

- The potential habitat rights area mentioned in the report covers the potential habitat areas of 9 PVTGs across 14 Micro Projects.
- 2 PVTGs (Lanjia Saora and Lodhas) the habitat rights maps are not required as both the PVTG communities claimed to have no habitat rights.
- Though the habitat rights map of Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh have been prepared in consultation with the traditional leaders but habitat rights area in these cases could not be determined as Gram Sabha meetings could not be held in Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh villages.

KEY OUTCOMES OF THE STUDY

1. Atlas of Potential habitat rights map for each PVTG in Odisha

As a key outcome of the study, Potential Habitat Rights Atlas of PVTGs in Odisha has been developed. GIS maps of Micro Project wise Potential Habitat Rights of 11 PVTGs have been developed and provided in the report. For 2 PVTGs (Lodha and Lanjia Saora), habitat rights maps were not prepared as the concept of habitat rights hardly exist in both the communities as claimed by their respective traditional leaders/institutions. (Chapter IV)

2. Guidelines for determination and mapping of habitat rights of PVTGs under FRA

Draft guidelines for determination of mapping of habitat rights of PVTGs under FRA has also been prepared as an out outcome of this study. The draft guidelines outlines the process steps from initiation of mapping of habitat rights in consultation with the PVTG communities and their traditional institutions/leaders to filing and submission of claims at SDLC/DLC as appropriate after approval by the respective Gram Sabhas/SDLCs. (Chapter V)

3. Submission of Habitat Rights Claims at SDLC level after approval by Gram Sabhas

Going beyond the objectives of the study, an attempt was made to process and file the habitat rights claims at SDLC. During the study tenure, the habitat rights claims of 9 PVTGs across 14 Micro Projects have been submitted at SDLC after due approval by the respective Gram Sabhas. The habitat claims were prepared in the Form-B and Form-C which has been prescribed under FRA Amendment Rules 2012. The details of Micro Project wise status of habitat rights claims of PVTGs has been covered in the report. (Chapter VI)

4. Creation of Resource Pool to provide technical support to TRIs of other States, as and when required

A Resource Pool on Forest Rights Act has been suggested who can provide technical support to TRIs of other states on Forest Rights Act and filing of claims (CR, CFR, Habitat Rights etc) under FRA. Apart from domain experts who can extend technical support and impart trainings at State and National level, a set of resource persons and community level experts/practitioners have also been provided who can help impart trainings at community level and help the communities in facilitating the claim making process under FRA. (Chapter VII)

LIMITATIONS OF THE STUDY

- The mapping of Habitat Rights of Dongaria Kondhs and Kutia Kondhs spread across 3 Micro Projects (DKDA Parsali, DKDA Chatikona and KKDA Lanjigarh) in 2 districts (Rayagada and Kalahandi) was done in consultation with the traditional leaders of both the PVTG communities.
- However, due to the sensitivity of the Niyamgiri case, it was not possible for the research team to carry out the determination of habitat rights process in the Dongaria Kondha and Kutia Kondh villages. The village level (Gram Sabha) meetings could not be held in the Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh villages for discussion and finalisation of habitat claim making process. Hence the habitat rights claims of Dongaria Kondhs across 2 Micro Projects and Kutia Kondhs in 1 Micro Project could not determined and filed at SDLC level.
- During the interaction with the Lodha and Lanjia Saora communities and their traditional leaders, it was found that

concept of habitat rights hardly exist and they are not willing to file habitat rights claims under FRA. Hence the potential habitat rights maps does not cover Lanjia Saora and Lodhas. Resolutions of both the communities have been taken but still the Special Officers of the 3 Micro Projects (LSDA Sernago, LSDA Puttsingh and LDA Morada) are requested to verify and certify the above.

• The potential habitat rights area mentioned in the report (habitat atlas developed as a part of the report) covers the potential habitat areas of 9 PVTGs across 14 Micro Projects. 2 PVTGs (Lanjia Saora and Lodhas) the habitat rights maps are not required as they claimed to have no habitat rights. Though the habitat rights map of Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh have been prepared in consultation with the traditional leaders but habitat rights area in these cases could not be determined as Gram Sabha meetings could not be held in Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh villages.



CHAPTER 1 INTRODUCTION



INTRODUCTION:

The Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 came into force on January 1, 2008, after the gazette notification of the Rules of Forest Rights Act. The Act recognizes and vests the forest rights of the forest dwelling Scheduled Tribes, Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups and other traditional forest dwellers over the individual forest rights, community rights of the forest, rights to protect and manage the community forest resources, and the forest rights on ancestral lands and their habitat which were not adequately recognized during the colonial period. This Act claims to address the historical injustice on the forest depending dwellers. The most significant and critical rights which has been given in this Act is the rights including community tenures of habitat and habitation for Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups and Pre-agricultural communities under section- 3.1 (e) of the Act. This Act attempts not only to address this historic injustice but also empowers the rights holding communities to "protect, conserve, regenerate or manage" their community forest resources for sustainable use.

In the country, there are 75 recognised PVTG communities. Originally, they were categorised as Primitive Tribal Group (PTG). This centrally recognized special category from among the Scheduled Tribe was constituted during the 4th five-year plan based on the report of the Dhebar commission (1960-61) and other studies which suggested that developmental inequalities exits among tribal communities. The communities were identified based on the recommendations of Tribal Research Institutes (TRIs) of the respective state governments and by 1993-94, 75 groups had been identified and placed on the list of PVTG. These communities have faced the maximum alienation from their

customary forested habitats at least for 150 years with initiation of permanent settlement by the British followed by unabated alienation after independence.

Odisha houses 13 PVTGs – highest among all the States and Union Territories of India. The PVTGs inhabit in 1683 villages/settlements distributed in 285 Gram Panchayats (GPs) under 42 Blocks and 14 districts of Odisha. There are as many as 1.79,742 households with total population of 7,73,092³.

For all-round development of PVTGs, 20 Micro Projects are operating in the State out of which 14 Micro Projects are located within the Scheduled Area and remaining 6 are located outside the TSP area. PVTG families are being assisted by Micro Projects under various schemes like agriculture, horticulture, soil conservation, animal husbandry etc. Besides basic infrastructure facilities drinking water, education, health, link roads are being provided in Micro Project Areas with focussed attention.

Special development projects and agencies have been launched for their development although none of these has attempted to recognise and secure their rights over their habitats and resources or prevent their further alienation and marginalization.

Habitat Rights under FRA

The historic Forest Rights Act of 2006 for the first time provided scope for the recognition of the PVTGs' forest and habitat rights. Section 2 (h) of the FRA defines habitat as: 'Habitat includes the area comprising the customary habitat and such other habitats in reserved forests and protected forests of primitive tribal groups and pre-agricultural communities and other forest dwelling Scheduled Tribes'.

The definition thus extends the recognition of habitat rights to other STs in addition to PVTGs and pre-agricultural communities. Section 3 (e) recognises: 'Rights including community tenures of habitat and habitation for primitive tribal groups and pre-agricultural communities'. Section 5 (c) of FRA empowers forest right holders and their institutions to: 'Ensure that the habitat of forest dwelling Scheduled Tribes and other traditional forest dwellers is preserved from any form of destructive practices affecting their cultural and natural heritage'

Thus, the FRA and its Rules give special emphasis on ensuring recognition of the habitat rights of PVTGs and pre-agricultural communities.

The meaning of "Habitat" under FRA, 2006 of the section 2 (h) defines that, habitat includes the area comprising the customary habitat and such other habitats in reserved forests and protected forests of Primitive tribal groups and pre-agricultural communities and other forest dwelling Scheduled Tribes'. The habitat includes the places where tribal and other traditional forest dwellers have ancient connections in spiritual, cultural, social and livelihood matters. Spiritual connection implies an area which is important to fulfil the socio-cultural needs of the community. This area includes burial grounds, birth places, temples, deities, lands perceived as abodes of deities including ancestors, sacred lands, plants, and areas used for festivals and processions. This area also includes places of customary land use for livelihood generation such as forest produce collection, fishing sources, seasonal cultivation areas, and collection of medicinal plants. Other aspects of habitat rights are protection of forests and sacred wildlife. Habitat Rights can be defined as a bundle of rights comprising of these connections with the landscape of livelihood, social, and cultural practices embedded in the territory that forms their habitat.

Therefore, the following are included in habitat rights:

- Right to perform all customary religious or cultural practices related to their clans
- Right to protect and conserve places important for religious and spiritual purposes such as sacred groves, the rights over the passage to abodes of deities in forests, hill tops, source of rivers and other remote parts of forests
- Right to practice indigenous farming systems and other livelihood activities including seasonal resource use
- Habitat rights exclude any traditional right of hunting or trapping or extracting a part of the body of any species of wild animal

Status of habitat rights recognition and Key Issues and Challenges

It has been about 13 years since the FRA came into force, however, only instances of claims of Habitat rights have been reported from Juangs and Mankidias in Odisha, Baiga in Madhya Pradesh and Maria Gond from Maharashtra. But till date, no habitat right of PVTG across the country is reported to have been recognized.

Key Issues and Challenges

There are inherent challenges and operational difficulties in extending recognition of Habitat Rights to PVTGs. Some of the key bottlenecks with regard to implementation of FRA provisions related to habitat rights recognition are:

 Lack of knowledge, clarity and awareness about the rights of PVTGs under the Act, including in particular the right to community tenures of habitat. This lack of awareness and clarity applies both to government officials and to the communities themselves.

- Lack of clarity about the meaning of 'habitat' and related rights under the Forest Rights Act.
- Lack of clarity about the procedure for the recognition of the habitat rights of these communities given that their claims may extend across multiple settlements over a large geographical area.
- Low literacy levels and lack of legal awareness among PVTGs, making the claim filing process particularly difficult.
- Tendency to rely on forest records during the rights recognition process, when these are irrelevant to most forest rights and especially so in the case of PVTGs, most of whose rights and activities were either never recorded or were recorded elsewhere (such as in gazetteers, anthropological studies, princely state records, etc.).
- Resistance to the recognition of PVTG rights by other interests and a lack of clarity among officials about the implications of overlap between PVTG rights and those of other communities, individuals and agencies.
- At places, where traditional boundaries clash with district and state boundaries, there is no clarity on how the State will address the issue

 It needs to be determined how habitat rights would be claimed in forests and concerns regarding lack of clarity with regard to habitat rights at different levels have also been expressed in several regional consultations on FRA organised by Ministry of Tribal Affairs in the last couple of years.

RATIONALE OF THE STUDY

There are inherent challenges and operational difficulties in extending recognition of Habitat Rights to PVTGs. Lack of clarity about the meaning of 'habitat' and related rights under the FRA, in particular the right to community tenures of habitat, lack of clarity about the procedure for the recognition of the habitat rights of PVTG communities given that their claims may extend across multiple settlements over a large geographical area are some of the key bottlenecks with regard to implementation of FRA provisions related to habitat rights recognition.

In the above context, it is felt that a detailed guideline on determination and recognition of habitat rights under FRA is required on a priority basis which will help the States in mapping and recognition of habitat rights of PVTGs.

Keeping this in view, SCSTRTI has undertaken the research study on mapping of potential habitat rights of all the 13 PVTGs in Odisha and has developed step wise detailed process guidelines on determination and mapping of potential habitat rights of PVTGs under FRA. Further, SCSTRI, Bhubaneswar as Nodal Resource Centre on FRA has prepared a Resource Pool on FRA and, if required, can extend technical support to TRIs of other states for preparation of potential habitat rights claims by the respective States.



CHAPTER II PROVISIONS OF HABITAT RIGHTS UNDER FRA AND OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY



PROVISIONS UNDER THE FOREST RIGHTS ACT & RULES WITH REGARDS TO HABITAT RIGHTS AND CLARIFICATIONS ISSUED BY MINISTRY OF TRIBAL AFFAIRS, GOI

The preamble of the Act reaffirms recognition and vesting of forest rights on ancestral lands and habitat.

In the FRA and Rules, following are the main provisions that refer to the PVTGs or habitat rights.

- Section 2(h) of the FRA defines the habitat as follows: 'habitat'
 includes the area comprising the customary habitat and such
 other habitats in reserved forests and protected forests of
 primitive tribal groups and pre-agricultural communities and
 other forest dwelling Scheduled Tribes.
- Furthermore, among the rights listed that can be recognized through the FRA, Section 3(e) mentions the: rights including community tenures of habitat and habitation for primitive tribal groups and pre-agricultural communities.
- Section 5(c) empowers the forest right holders and their institutions to: ensure that the habitat of forest dwelling Scheduled Tribes and other traditional forest dwellers is preserved from any form of destructive practices affecting their cultural and natural heritage.
- Forest Rights Rules 5(c) and 7(c) refers to the representation of the PVTGs in the Sub-Divisional Level (SDLCs) and District Level Committees (DLCs). Rule 5(c) mentions about the composition of the SDLC: It mentions that 'three members of the Block or Tehsil level Panchayats to be nominated by the District Panchayat

of whom at least two shall be the Scheduled Tribes preferably those who are forest dwellers, or who belong to the primitive tribal groups and where there are no Scheduled Tribes, two members who are preferably other traditional forest dwellers, and one shall be a woman member; or in areas covered under the Sixth Schedule to the Constitution, three members nominated by the Autonomous District Council or Regional Council or other appropriate zonal level, of whom at least one shall be a woman member; and

- Further, Rule 7(c) indicates the composition of the DLC: it mentions that three members of the district panchayat to be nominated by the district panchayat, of whom at least two shall be the Scheduled Tribes preferably those who are forest dwellers, or who belong to members of the primitive tribal groups, and where there are no Scheduled Tribes, two members who are preferably other traditional forest dwellers, and one shall be a woman member, or in areas covered under the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution, three members nominated by the Autonomous District Council or Regional Council of whom at least one shall be a woman member.
- Rule 8(b) refers to the functions of the DLC and provides that the DLC shall: examine whether all claims, especially those of primitive tribal groups, pastoralists and nomadic tribes, have been addressed keeping in mind the objectives of the Act.
- Rule 12(1)(d) mentions the process of verifying claims by the Forest Rights Committee where the FRC shall: ensure that the claim from member of a primitive tribal group or pre-agricultural community for determination of their rights to habitat, which

may either be through **their community or traditional community institution**, are verified when such communities or their representatives are present;

• In the process of recognition of community rights, Rule 12B(1) mentions that: The District Level Committee shall, in view of the differential vulnerability of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups as described in clause (e) of sub-section (i) of section 3 amongst the forest dwellers, ensure that all Particularly Vulnerable tribal Groups receive habitat rights, in consultation with the concerned traditional institutions of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups and their claims for habitat rights are filed before the concerned Gram Sabhas, wherever necessary by recognizing floating nature of their Gram Sabhas.

CLARIFICATIONS PERTAINING TO THE RECOGNITION OF HABITAT RIGHTS UNDER THE FRA IISSUED BY MOTA, GOI

In addition to the above provisions under the Act and Rules, the Ministry of Tribal Affairs also issued additional clarifications pertaining to the recognition of habitat rights under the FRA on **23 April, 2015,** which were as follows.

1. This has come to the notice of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs that the Hindi version of the FRA has translated the word 'habitat' under Section 3(1)(e) as 'aawas' which is commonly understood as house or homestead. This has created confusion and due to misinterpretation, many States have equated the term 'habitat' to mean proving housing facilities as under Indira Awas Yoiana and other such housing scheme. The Ministry would like to state that the FRA clearly lays down the definition of 'habitat' under Section 2(h), and further

describes the forest right to such habitat under Section 3(1)(e). Rule 12(1)(d) of the Forest Rights Rules further requires Forest Rights Committee to ensure that the claims from Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) are verified when such communities or their representatives are present.

- 2. Further, the right to community tenures of habitat and habitation may be recognized over customary territories used by the PVTG for habitation, livelihoods, social, economic, spiritual, sacred, religious and other purposes. In some cases, the habitats of PVTGs may overlap with forests and other rights of other people/communities.
- 3. Rule 8 of the Forest Rights Rules (as amended on 6.9 2012) envisages the role of the District Level Committee (DLC) to examine, whether all claims, especially those of primitive tribal groups (Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups), pastoralists and nomadic tribes, have been addressed keeping in mind the objectives of the Act.
- 4. It has further been provided in Forest Rights Rule 12(B)(1) that, the DLC shall in view of the differential vulnerability of PVTGs, ensure that all PVTGs receive habitat rights in consultation with the concerned traditional institutions and their claims for habitat rights are filed before the concerned Gram Sabhas, wherever necessary, by recognizing floating nature of their Gram Sabhas.
- Where the claims of PVTGs have already been filed, the DLCS should take steps to ensure recognition of their rights along with mapping of the area of each claim over which their rights have been recognized.

6. Therefore, the state Governments need to make all-out effort to recognize the habitat rights of the PVTGS and intimate the Ministry of Tribal Affairs on the steps taken towards recognition of the rights in the periodic reports submitted by them.

OBJECTIVE OF THE STUDY:

The specific study objectives are:

- To map the nature and extent of the habitat rights of each of the 13 PVTG in Odisha and prepare habitat rights claims for each of the PVTG community
- To develop guidelines along with compilation of evidences for recognition of habitat rights
- To extend technical support/advice to TRI of other States for preparation of potential habitat rights claims by the respective States

The first objective of the study is broadly divided into two broad categories mentioned below:

- 1. Identifying the nature and extent of the habitat of a concerned PVTG.
- Understanding the concept of Habitat of PVTGs
- Mapping of Potential Habitat Area of each of the PVTG
- Discussion with Traditional Leaders and PVTG groups in mapping the habitat boundary
- 2. The Determination and recognition process of Habitat rights under FRA:
- What is the procedure that the community and different authentic body under the Act should follow to ensure the recognition of

habitat rights for PVTGs

- How can the traditional institutions of the PVTG be incorporated in the decision making process
- What records would SDLCs & DLCs need to provide and in what manner.
- In what manner can the SDLCs & DLCs facilitate the preparation and filing of claims to this right.

STUDY SAMPLE:

All 13 PVTGs of Odisha spread across 20 Micro Project Agencies has been covered under the study for the purpose of mapping of potential habitat rights of each PVTG.

- Core village: important villagers that include elders, women leaders, opinion makers, PRI representative from the village (covering these sections across three generations), youth club members/ leaders, village animators under any government program, any village level worker associated with the microproject program.
- Knowledgeable traditional leaders from the region (including those beyond study village/s), members/leaders of the traditional institutions representing socio-political organizations of the community (e.g., clan leaders, collective of the leaders at the habitat level)
- Officers/ staff of micro-project

- NGO members working in the locality and on PVTG issues at multiple level
- Officers of tribal and forest department
- Local academicians/ scholars/ historians having done work on concerned PVTG
- PRI leaders from the region
- Local political leaders
- Activists/ activist forum working on PVTG issues
- Leaders/ members of any other PVTG people's forum

Data Collection Tools

Primary Sources: The key data collection tools include FGDs with different generations, unstructured interviews with multiple stakeholders, In-dept interviews, participant observation, Focus Group Discussion and Observation Method. GPS and GIS analysis have been used to understand the geographical landscapes, density and quality of forests, key natural landmarks etc. Data were cross-checked the process was based on information from at least three sources. (more validation will be done from the field after the lockdown period over)

Secondary sources: Census Report, State Library & Archives, Anganwadi Center, DSO, Survey of India and other Govt. Office.



CHAPTER III CONCEPT OF HABITAT AND METHODOLOGY OF MAPPING OF HABITAT RIGHTS

CONCEPT OF HABITAT AND SIGNIFICANCE OF HABITAT RIGHTS FOR PVTGs

CONCEPT OF HABITAT⁴

The term habitat means "the natural home or environment of an animal, plant or other organisms. And this terminology is mostly used for conservation purpose. For example, section 2(15) of the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972 defines the terminology of "habitat". It mentions that "habitat" includes land, water or vegetation which is the natural home of any wild animal;

Section 2 (h) of the FRA defines habitat as: 'Habitat includes the area comprising the customary habitat and such other habitats in reserved forests and protected forests of primitive tribal groups and preagricultural communities and other forest dwelling Scheduled Tribes'.

In case of Indigenous Communities, the term 'ancestral domain' or 'ancestral land' or 'traditional territories' is being used in different countries, which represents their identity and existence deeply connected with their spiritual, cultural, social and economic activities to a territory. For example, Republic Act No. 8371(of 1997) of Republic Philippines defines 'ancestral domain' under section 3(a) of the Act. It refers to all areas generally belonging to Indigenous Cultural Communities/Indigenous Peoples (ICCs/IPs), comprising lands, inland waters, coastal areas, and natural resources therein, held under a claim of ownership, occupied or possessed by Indigenous Cultural Communities/Indigenous Peoples (ICCs/IPs), by themselves or through their ancestors, communally or individually since time immemorial, +++ and which are necessary to ensure their economic,

social and cultural welfare. It shall include ancestral lands, forests, pasture, residential, agricultural, ++ hunting grounds, burial grounds, worship areas, bodies of water, mineral and other natural resources, and lands which may no longer be exclusively occupied by ICCs/IPs but from which they traditionally had access to for their subsistence and traditional activities++".

The study undertaken by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs in 2014, mentions the concept of Habitat as follows:

Habitat for the PVTGs refers to an area where these communities have both spiritual and material connections. Spiritual connection implies an area which is important to fulfil the socio-cultural needs of the community. This area includes burial grounds, birth places, temples, deities, ancestral lands, or areas used for any other socio-cultural purposes, such as festivals and processions. This area also includes places of customary land use for livelihood generation such as forest produce collection, fishing sources, cultivation areas, and seasonal migratory lands.

Habitat rights can be defined as a bundle of rights comprising of these connections with the landscape: livelihood, social, and cultural practices embedded in the territory that forms their habitat. Habitat rights regime is mediated by the traditional institutions and leadership base of the PVTGs who are crucial in the affairs of the PVTGs/ scheduled tribes. Many of these rights are not necessarily exclusive to one community and may be shared with other communities living in the habitat area based on age old traditions of mutuality and reciprocity.

Habitat thus constitutes 'such areas or territories or landscapes, which represents their identity and existence deeply connected with their spiritual, cultural, social and economic activities/world.'

Habitat rights may include:

- 1. Right to perform all customary religious or cultural ceremonies in the landscape related to their clans.
- 2. Right to protect and conserve the natural entities, sacred sites, places important for religious and spiritual purposes located within and outside of their customary territories;
- 3. Right to practice traditional cultivation systems and other livelihood generating activities including seasonal resource use.
- 4. Right to organise customary social events.

Following markers can be used to identify the nature and extent of habitat rights of PVTGs.

Geographic markers: These will demarcate the boundary and represent the geographic features of the area claimed as habitat rights of the PVTGs. These may include: water bodies (rivers, streams, ponds, wells), mountains or hills, land contour, seasonal vegetation type, and wildlife movement areas in the landscape.

Livelihood related markers: These will include the aspects important for the livelihood generation of the PVTGs in the area claimed as habitat rights. These markers may be grazing lands, cultivation lands (demarcated as shifting or settled), settlements or habitation units, seasonal forest resource collection, fishing areas, labour activities, and seasonal migration routes in the landscape.

Socio-cultural markers: These markers are important for the socio-cultural aspects of the PVTGs and include temples, festivals or procession areas, burial grounds, birth places, ancestral lands, songs

and myths related to the landscape, and other rituals associated with the landscape as identified by the PVTGs.

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN COMMUNITY FOREST RIGHTS (CFR) AND HABITAT RIGHTS

It is important to mention that the Forest Rights Act differentiates habitat rights with CFR rights. While CFR rights may pertain to one or group villages, habitat rights relate to an entire

community or tribe. The areas of differences are briefly summarised in the following table 4:

SIGNIFICANCE OF HABITAT RIGHTS RECOGNITION

The PVTGs share a history of dispossession and forest alienation. Across time due to historic and external conditions inflicted upon them the relative harmony got disturbed causing marginalization, migration and resettlements in some alien bio-cultural setup. This has had serious adverse impact on their identity threatening their very existence and survival. In this regard, recognition and restoration of their habitat rights becomes important to secure not only their livelihoods but to secure the very existence of such vulnerable PVTGs.

Given the understanding that Habitat Rights constitute a bundle of rights related to PVTG livelihoods, culture, society, religious practices and beliefs, medicinal knowledge etc., recognition of such rights would imply holistic development of such communities and revival of their lost identities. It is important to mention here that habitat rights are not just territorial but are an interwoven fabric of social, religious, cultural, economic and political rights underlying the life and livelihoods of PVTGs.

As recommended by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), recognising land tenures of indigenous communities and their management rights over forests can help tackle the adverse impacts of climate change. Internationally, the role of indigenous communities and the importance of legally recognising their rights is being increasingly recognised in climate change mitigation.

The recognition of habitat rights can play a vital role in safeguarding livelihoods and the culture of the PVTGs as well as in reviving traditional forest management practices not recognised under the current governance regime.

MAPPING OF POTENTIAL HABITAT RIGHTS AREA UNDER FRA: METHODOLOGY

Certain Parameters/markers had been considered for identifying the nature and extent of habitat rights of a concerned PVTG and prepare the habitat map. The following parameters/markers have been followed for mapping of potential habitat area and rights of each PVTG community. The indicators under each parameter were drawn up hypothetically based on the literature review to guide the field investigation. During the field work, it was realized that covering all the parameters would require a much longer period and a detailed anthropological work which was again beyond the scope of the present study, limited by time.

PARAMETERS FOR IDENTIFYING THE POTENTIAL AREA OF HABITAT RIGHTS OF A CONCERNED PVTG

ECOLOGICAL PARAMETERS: It is an established fact that an area with higher biodiversity provides greater livelihood security to the people. Keeping this in view the following parameters had been chosen.

Natural Markers

- Land
- Water (Riverbank, Stream)
- Mountains
- Movement of wild animals
- Movement of inhabitants
- Land Contour
- Seasonal Variation
- Vegetation

DEMOGRAPHIC PARAMETERS:

- Sex ratio
- Concentration of clan members (Ethnic Group) in the geographical space
- History of demographic composition of PVTG micro project area
- Uni-Clan- multi-clan multi-ethnic composition
- Mobility of human resource through traditional institution
- In migration out migration (Immigration- emigration)

ECONOMIC PARAMETERS:

- Grazing land
- Cultivation Shifting/settled
- Forest resource dependency
- Bovines

- Hunting
- Fishing
- Labour

MATERIAL & CULTURAL TRAITS [MATERIAL CULTURE, NON-MATERIAL CULTURE]

- Hunting & Fishing Rights and Rituals, Myth, Legends, Belief system, Magic, Folksongs
- Native Technology
- Art, Dress
- Purpose of the use of Natural Resources
- Tangible Cultural Traits

BASIS OF MAPPING AND DETERMINATION OF HABITAT RIGHTS⁵

I. INFORMATION RELATED TO CLAN: CLAN IDENTITY

Most PVTGs (and other tribal groups/ castes) are divided into clans which are exogamous i.e.no marriages can happen between persons from the same clan as they are considered to be brothers and sisters. These clans draw their identity from certain geographical locations which often house their deities or from certain natural entities which may include plants and wildlife. Their religious rights over such geographical locations need recognition, their right to protect and conserve such natural entities (as enshrined in their clan beliefs and practices/behaviour) needs recognition and such places of their religious and spiritual importance (irrespective of their geographical distance from their actual settlement) should be granted protection from any action that might lead to their any modification or destruction of such place in part or full.

II. INFORMATION ABOUT THEIR SOCIAL AND CULTURAL SITES:

The PVTGs observe social and cultural rituals by organising fairs (melas) at different intervals and at different places. The periodicity of such social and cultural rituals and their location of the place is often dynamic and changes at varied frequency. In many cases, some local haat (village markets) specific to a PVTG community also constitutes the place. Given their traditions, such places will get shifted over time with new places being added to the list.

As a part of their habitat rights, it is imperative that while rights over existing cultural sites and the right to organise them as per their beliefs and customs need recognition, the right to decide and identify newer sites within their habitat for holding their rituals/ cultural events in future would also require recognition. The PVTGs' traditional institutions need to be empowered to decide whether any major land use change in the area should be permitted or not. This would imply extending the requirement for gram sabha consent for forest diversion needed in other areas to the entire habitat. It is important to mention here that all rituals, social and cultural activities and events of PVTGs are deeply connected with forests and other elements of nature

III. INFORMATION ABOUT THEIR LIVELIHOODS AND SITES OF LIVELIHOOD:

This may include sites of their agroforestry based ancestral farming practices (referred to as podu, bewar, dongar chas etc. in local parlance), areas from where items are gathered and extracted from forests, sites for gathering medicinal plants etc. There is need for recognition of their forms of livelihood practices based on forest and geographical sites which support such livelihoods. The practice of cultivation on

hill slopes or hill tops in rotation is found in varying degrees amongst different PVTGs. While communities living in lower hills or plains were successfully forced by the government to abandon such practices due to these being considered ecologically destructive, in many locations where plain land is absolutely missing, this practice is still prevalent and provides a crucial source of their livelihood as also evident from the field studies. It becomes important that any such existing practices of traditional farming area should be recognised and the existing nature of de facto rights currently enjoyed (individual or communal) over such areas under such cultivation should be are recognised in its present form.

IV. INFORMATION ABOUT OTHER IMPORTANT LANDMARKS:

These can include like hills, rivers, streams, vegetation, grasses, particular tree species etc. which provide other land marks for delineating the boundaries and extent of their territory, the sub-territories and their social, cultural, religious, economic and political linkages.

V. INFORMATION ABOUT THEIR SONGS AND NARRATIVES:

Places, objects, beliefs, rituals described in the songs and narratives of PVTG communities provide important information about the traits of their habitat.

VI. TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE:

The PVTGs, especially their elderly population have a huge repository of knowledge about medicinal plants, sites where they are most available, wildlife, behaviour of wildlife, their corridors etc. While they are reluctant to divulge details of their medicinal knowledge, they are inclined to suggest different geographical sites or forests where there is



rich concentration of medicinal plants or forest areas/zones having good wildlife population and types of wildlife. Their rights over indigenous knowledge about their ecology of their habitat need due recognition and should form the basis of its governance and management of such areas where they have a significant stake

VII. ARCHIVAL/SECONDARY MATERIAL:

This also provides historical information about the settlement of particular PVTG communities which can also be used sourced as evidence for filing their claim. In addition to this, Copies of any old records available with the villagers (e.g. pattas or rights allowed by an ex-King) and traditional leaders should also be collected in support of claims. The concerned DLCs should source such material and make them available to all concerned gramsabhas. Copies of all such materials should be made available to the concerned Gram Sabhas/ FRCs prior to the initiation of the consultation and claim filing process.

STEPS TO PREPARE THE HABITAT ATLAS OF PVTGS IN ODISHA

The following steps had been pursued to map the potential maps of the habitat rights.

MAPPING OF HABITAT RIGHTS OF PVTGs

STEP 1: INITIATION OF THE HABITAT RIGHTS MAPPING PROCESS

- The research team discussed with Special Officers of the respective Micro Project Agencies regarding the habitat rights mapping process of the PVTGs.
- Consultation workshops were held with the District Officials (PAITDAs, DWOs, Special Officers, DLC, SDLC members etc), Civil

- Society Organisations, Domain Experts, Traditional Leaders etc. regarding concept of habitat rights of PVTGs and process of determination of habitat rights under FRA
- District Officials communicated the initiation of the process of determining habitat rights to the PVTGs. Communication regarding the initiation of PVTG Habitat Rights recognition process was made by the district officials by providing information about the communities whose rights are thus to be determined through locally used traditional means of communication to inform people. Gram Sabha presidents of the respective settlements, civil society organisations, PVTG leaders, or village messengers were involved to publicise and communicate the information

STEP 2: DETERMINING HABITAT RIGHTS IN CONSULTATION WITH THE TRADITIONAL INSTITUTIONS OF PVTGs

- A meeting was organized with the traditional institutions (socialcultural-political-economy) of the PVTGs and Gram Sabha presidents for the purpose of mapping and determination of habitat rights
- The research team and the district administration consulted the Gram Sabha presidents and traditional leaders to identify a suitable place for consultations to initiate the process of determining habitat rights with ensuring the participation of women in these consultations.

Following aspects were discussed in the consultations:

 Identifying socio-cultural and livelihood activities performed in the area to be claimed under habitat rights. These habitat rights could be claimed over a larger area or divided into smaller areas which could be separately claimed under habitat rights based on the decision of the traditional leaders during the consultations.

- Identifying the area to be claimed under habitat rights and prepare a tentative map marking out the boundary and landmarks of socio-cultural and livelihood needs of the PVTGs.
- Identifying the rights under the FRA of non-PVTGs residing in the area identified to be claimed under habitat rights.
- Identify habitat rights claims made over areas covering more than one district or state.
- List out the documents needed for claiming the habitat rights.

STEP 3: COMPILATION AND CONSOLIDATION OF THE PVTG HABITATIONS/VILLAGES

District and Micro Project wise PVTG villages/habitations were consolidated using the Census 2011 data and the baseline survey report of the year 2015 & 2018, conducted by SCSTRTI, ST & SC Development Department, Govt. of Odisha. PVTG villages along with the population, geographical areas and revenue forest were compiled from the Census 2011 data and baseline survey report 2015 & 2018.

The village details tables from the census provides the extent of forest land and other land within the village boundaries. This data is collected by the Census from the official land records and therefore provides the best proxy for actual legal status of forests inside village boundaries as per the land records. (Village Details provided in Annexure)

STEP 4: ESTIMATING POPULATION FOR HABITAT RIGHTS RECOGNITION:

Using the Census 2011 data and baseline survey report conducted by SCSTRTI in 2015 & 2018, the estimated population of the PVTGs in the villages within the habitat was calculated. This estimated PVTG population figure is an approximation of the number of PVTG people whose habitat rights can be recognized under FRA.

STEP 5: ESTIMATING THE POTENTIAL HABITAT AREA:

A. ASSESSING REVENUE FOREST AREAS WITHIN VILLAGE BOUNDARIES

- ➤ The forest area potential for recognition of habitat rights under FRA in Odisha has been estimated using the data available in the State of Forest Report, 1999 of the Forest Survey of India and Census 2011.
- ➤ The PVTG village details tables from the Census provide the extent of forest land within the village boundaries. This data is collected by the Census from the official land records and therefore provides the best proxy for actual legal status of forests inside village boundaries as per the land records.
- An assumption has been made, following FSI, 1999, that inclusion of forests within revenue village boundaries reflects and legitimizes the use, interaction and dependence of the village communities (of PVTGs/STs and other traditional forest dwellers) on such forests. This assumption is also based on the fact that rules under FRA require the district level committees to ensure that habitat rights are recognized in all these habitations where PVTGs are residing and are traditionally, socio-culturally and economically dependent on the forests.



B. ASSESS FORESTS OUTSIDE REVENUE VILLAGE BOUNDARIES

The second step assessed additional forest areas which are outside the revenue boundaries and are customarily used by the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) and thus eligible for habitat rights recognition under the FRA.

- ➤ It is estimated that the habitat rights of PVTGs to be claimed by their traditional institutions/leaders under FRA includes all potential villages inhabited by the respective PVTGs.
- ➤ The Census data provides information on forest land located within revenue village boundaries, but doesn't include forest areas outside revenue village boundaries which may be coming within the customary boundary of the concerned habitat and therefore can be claimed for habitat rights under FRA.
- ➤ The habitat rights maps were drawn in consultation with the traditional leaders/institutions of the PVTGs along with the FRC members, PVTG members etc. Gram Sabha meetings were held covering all the PVTG villages/habitations and the hand drawn habitat maps were approved by the Gram Sabhas.
- A tentative hand drawn social map of the area to be claimed under habitat rights was prepared marking out the boundary and landmarks of socio-cultural and livelihood needs of the PVTGs.
- The hand drawn habitat maps were superimposed with toposheets and the potential forest area covered outside the village boundaries was calculated

➤ Using this method, it is estimated that the area of forest lying outside village cadastral boundaries and eligible to be claimed as habitat rights under FRA in Odisha is at least 0.9 mha.

C. POTENTIAL HABITAT RIGHTS AREA OF PVTG (MICRO PROJECT WISE)

- ➤ Using the above methodology, the GIS based potential habitat maps of 11 PVTG communities across 17 Micro Projects have been developed. In case of 2 PVTGs (Lanjia Saora and Lodhas) habitat maps were not prepared as both the PVTG communities claimed not to have any habitat rights concept. (Resolution of Traditional leaders and community members of Lodhas and Lanjia Saora have been annexed in the report.)
- Micro Project wise potential habitat rights maps were developed covering all the PVTG habitations as well as the forest and non forest areas over which the PVTGs are traditionally and culturally dependent and interact for their livelihood, social, and cultural practices
- ➤ The potential habitat rights area which can be claimed under FRA comes around 1.1 mha ha (includes Revenue Forest Area and Forest Areas beyond village boundaries) over which the PVTGs are customarily dependent upon. (Refer Table 5)

N.B:

- The potential habitat rights area mentioned in the report covers the potential habitat areas of 9 PVTGs across 14 Micro Projects.
- 2 PVTGs (Lanjia Saora and Lodhas) the habitat rights maps are not required as both the PVTG communities claimed to have no habitat rights.
- Though the habitat rights map of Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh have been prepared in consultation with the traditional leaders but habitat rights area in these cases could not be determined as Gram Sabha meetings could not be held in Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh villages.

PURPOSE AND UTILITY OF THE HABITAT RIGHTS ATLAS

'Habitat Rights' of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) and pre-agricultural communities under Forest Rights Act constitute rights over customary territories used by the PVTGs for habitation, livelihoods, social, economic, spiritual, sacred, religious and other purposes. Odisha has 13 Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTG) spread across its 12 districts which is the highest among all the States and Union Territories of India. The PVTGs inhabit in 1659 villages/settlements distributed in 297 Gram Panchayats (GPs) under 48 part Blocks, 10 ITDAs and 14 districts of Odisha. There are as many as 58,254 households with total population of 2,43,234. For integrated development of PVTGs, 20 Micro Projects are operating in the State out of which 14 Micro Projects are located within the Scheduled Area and remaining 6 are located outside the TSP area.

All the 13 PVTGs have customary habitats which are eligible for rights recognition under Habitat Rights provisions of FRA. It is not possible to estimate the habitat rights areas of the PVTGs without actual mapping of the customary boundaries based on the traditional access and practises of each of the PVTGs.

The Atlas has attempted to make a preliminary assessment of the potential habitat area of PVTGs in Odisha over which habitat rights can be recognised under FRA. The estimate provided offers a baseline for planning and effective implementation of habitat rights recognition under the FRA and allows policy makers to monitor and evaluate the extent to which the law has been implemented.

MONITORING & PLANNING TOOL

The Habitat Rights Atlas can be used as a monitoring tool by the District and State Authorities to track the progress of claim making. PVTG wise number of potential habitat villages have been estimated along with approx. forest area over which Habitat Rights can be recognized under FRA. The progress made against the estimated potential can be reviewed and real time tracking can be done to ensure effective implementation of the Act. The Atlas can be used to devise district and micro-project specific appropriate strategies for completion of habitat rights determination process in a time bound manner.

LIMITATIONS OF THE STUDY

- The mapping of Habitat Rights of Dongaria Kondhs and Kutia Kondhs spread across 3 Micro Projects (DKDA Parsali, DKDA Chatikona and KKDA Lanjigarh) in 2 districts (Rayagada and Kalahandi) was done in consultation with the traditional leaders of both the PVTG communities.
- However, due to the sensitivity of the Niyamgiri case, it was not possible for the research team to carry out the determination of habitat rights process in the Dongaria Kondha and Kutia Kondh villages. The village level (Gram Sabha) meetings could not be held in the Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh villages for discussion and finalisation of habitat claim making process. Hence the habitat rights claims of Dongaria Kondhs across 2 Micro Projects and Kutia Kondhs in 1 Micro Project could not determined and filed at SDLC level.


- During the interaction with the Lodha and Lanjia Saora communities and their traditional leaders, it was found that concept of habitat rights hardly exist and they are not willing to file habitat rights claims under FRA. Hence the potential habitat rights maps does not cover Lanjia Saora and Lodhas. Resolutions of both the communities have been taken but still the Special Officers of the 3 Micro Projects (LSDA Sernago, LSDA Puttsingh and LDA Morada) are requested to verify and certify the above.
- The potential habitat rights area mentioned in the report (habitat atlas developed as a part of the report) covers the potential habitat areas of 9 PVTGs across 14 Micro Projects. 2 PVTGs (Lanjia Saora and Lodhas) the habitat rights maps are not required as they claimed to have no habitat rights. Though the habitat rights map of Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh have been prepared in consultation with the traditional leaders but habitat rights area in these cases could not be determined as Gram Sabha meetings could not be held in Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh villages.

- The potential habitat rights area mentioned in the report covers the potential habitat areas of 9 PVTGs across 14 Micro Projects.
- 2 PVTGs (Lanjia Saora and Lodhas) the habitat rights maps are not required as both the PVTG communities claimed to have no habitat rights.
- Though the habitat rights map of Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh have been prepared in consultation with the traditional leaders but habitat rights area in these cases could not be determined as Gram Sabha meetings could not be held in Dongaria Kondh and Kutia Kondh villages.

CHAPTER V DETERMINATION AND RECOGNITION OF HABITAT RIGHTS OF PVTGs

PROCESS STEPS (GUIDELINES)

DETERMINATION AND RECOGNITION OF HABITAT RIGHTS PROCESS STEPS

A. DETERMINATION OF HABITAT RIGHTS

Step 1: Initiation of the habitat rights claims process

The concerned DLCs shall ensure the following in this regard:

- 1. Designate the Special Officer, Micro Project as Nodal Officer to facilitate the process of habitat rights claims as deemed necessary.
- 2. Communicate the initiation of the process of determining habitat rights with the PVTGs in their local languages. Publicise and communicate the initiation of PVTG Habitat Rights recognition in the district by providing information about the communities whose rights are thus to be determined through locally used traditional means of communication to inform people. Gram Sabha presidents of the respective settlements, civil society organisations, PVTG leaders, or village messengers can be used to publicise and communicate this information.
- 3. In case a particular PVTG's habitat area is spread over more than one district, the concerned DLCs should coordinate with each other with support and advice of the ST & SC Development Department and the SC & ST Training & Research Institute
- 4. DLCs may invite resource persons from SCSTRTI, civil society organizations and other relevant domain experts to facilitate the training program.

Step 2: Determining habitat rights in consultation with the traditional institutions of PVTGs

- The designated Nodal officer, shall organize meetings with the traditional institutions (social-cultural-political-economy) of the PVTGs and Gram Sabha presidents for the purpose of mapping and determination of habitat rights
- 2. DLCs should consult the Gram Sabha presidents and traditional leaders to identify a suitable place for consultations to initiate the process of determining habitat rights. DLCs should ensure the participation of women in these consultations in case all traditional leaders are men.

Following aspects should be discussed in the consultations:

- Identifying socio-cultural and livelihood activities performed in the area to be claimed under habitat rights. These habitat rights can be claimed over a larger area or divided into smaller areas which can be separately claimed under habitat rights based on the decision of the traditional leaders during the consultations.
- Identifying the area to be claimed under habitat rights and prepare a tentative map marking out the boundary and landmarks of socio-cultural and livelihood needs of the PVTGs.
- Identifying the rights under the FRA of non-PVTGs residing in the area identified to be claimed under habitat rights.
- Identify habitat rights claims made over areas covering more than one state or district or PVTGs.



- List out the documents needed for claiming the habitat rights.
- 3. For claims made over areas covering more than one state or district or PVTGs/non-PVTGs, the respective DLCs should be informed and a meeting shall be conducted with the concerned government agencies, traditional leaders, and Gram Sabhas to resolve the possible conflicts and notify the concerned SLMCs, DLCs, traditional leaders, and Gram Sabhas of the resolution made. The concerned DLCs may invite resource persons from SCSTRTI, civil society organizations, and other experts to facilitate this consultation process.

Step 3: Filing and submission of claims

The Nodal officer shall facilitate the following procedure of filing habitat right claims:

- 1. After identifying the habitat rights being claimed and resolving any possible conflicts, concerned traditional leaders and FRCs should verify and approve the habitat rights claim and discuss them with the concerned Gram Sabhas for approval.
- 2. DLCs should provide all necessary documents required by the PVTGs while filing claims for habitat rights.
- 3. After finalizing the habitat rights to be claimed, a final map should be prepared by the FRCs and traditional leaders using toposheets or other maps, for which DLCs can be approached. DLCs will support the PVTGs in preparing the final map demarcating the habitat rights area. This map should mark out the geographic coordinates of the boundaries as well as important places of socio-cultural relevance and livelihood generation.

- 4. Gram Sabha resolution of endorsement and approval of habitat rights claimed should be attached to the finalised claim documents.
- 5. Gram Sabhas will send these claims to all concerned SDLCs and DLCs, in case the rights claimed cover inter-district or inter-state areas.

B. RECOGNITION OF HABITAT RIGHTS

Step 4: Recognition of claims

- SDLC should verify the claims as per the procedures outlined in the Forest Rights Rule and forward it to DLC for approval. DLC should also verify and approve the habitat rights claims as per the procedure outlined in the Forest Rights and issue habitat rights title after due approval.
- DLC should issue the habitat rights title in the name of all the villages/habitations falling within the recognised habitat territory/ boundary and the title should be handed over to the traditional institutions of the PVTGs
- 3. In case the habitat rights are claimed over areas spreading across districts or states, the respective DLCs will convening a special joint session to examine the claims and pass resolution. Otherwise, procedures outlined in the Forest Right Rules will be followed for verifying and recognizing the habitat rights.

Step 5: Preparation of Habitat Maps

1. After habitat rights are recognized, DLCs will prepare a final digitized geo-referenced map of the area recognized under habitat

rights indicating the boundary as well as the landmarks specified in the map submitted while filing for habitat rights. DLCs should seek support from state remote sensing agencies, and civil society organisations to prepare this map.

 After issuance of habitat rights title, DLC should ensure that the recognized habitat rights area is clearly demarcated & incorporated in the Government records within three months (Sec 12 A (9) of FR Rules) and copy of the RoR shall be provided to the right holder (Gram Sabhas and traditional institutions of the PVTGs)

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF GOVERNMENT AGENCIES IN HABITAT RIGHTS RECOGNITION PROCESS

DISTRICT LEVEL COMMITTEES AND SUB-DIVISIONAL LEVEL COMMITTEES

- 1. Prepare and consolidate the list of PVTG settlements. SCSTRTI should be contacted to prepare this list.
- 2. Organise local level awareness campaigns and training programmes as outlined above on habitat rights recognition in accordance with the directions issued by Ministry of Tribal Affairs.
- 3. Organise consultations with traditional leaders of PVTGs and Gram Sabhas on initiating the process of habitat rights recognition.
- 4. Ensure the participation of women in these consultations as well as resource persons from SCSTRTI and civil society organisations.
- 5. Provide all necessary assistance as mentioned under Rule 4(3) of the Forest Rights Rules and issue letters to SDLCs, SCSTRTI, and

- other relevant government agencies for facilitating the process of habitat rights recognition.
- 6. Liaise with adjoining DLCs and SDLCs where habitat rights claimed extend over the adjoining districts and sub-divisions.

GRAM SABHAS

- 1. Ensure that traditional leaders of PVTGs are identified properly and ensure their participation in the consultations.
- 2. Ensure participation of women in the consultation and training programmes if all traditional leaders of PVTGs are men.
- 3. Support DLCs in conducting the consultations and training programmes and ensure the participation of FRC members and traditional leaders in these.
- 4. Assist PVTGs in their Gram Sabhas in preparing and filing claims for habitat rights and approach DLCs to issue documents and maps needed for filing of the claims.
- 5. Ensure consultation among the FRCs of adjoining Gram Sabhas in case of overlapping habitat rights claims and reach a consensus among the concerned Gram Sabhas in consultation with the traditional leaders to resolve these conflicts. Where consensus is not reached, approach concerned SDLCs/DLCs for resolving the issues, including those that may arise with non-PVTGs whose rights may overlap with the habitat rights of PVTGs.

CHAPTER VI STATUS OF SUBMISSION OF HABITAT RIGHTS CLAIMS IN ODISHA

STATUS OF FILING OF HABITAT RIGHTS CLAIMS:

Under this study, the process of habitat rights claim making was done for the all the habitats of the PVTGs in Odisha. Series of awareness camp and meetings on FRA provisions and habitat rights for the traditional leaders of the PVTG communities in the region was organized by the study team. Consultations with District Welfare Officer (DWO) & PA, ITDA, Nodal Officer of Implementation of FRA and Special Officer (SO), of the micro-project offices, PVTG traditional leaders and the local NGOs were done on the process of the habitat rights claim making process. Village level meeting organized under the leadership of Sarapanch, PVTG leaders and an action plan was developed to initiate the habitat rights determination process. Rounds of Gram Sabha meetings were organized for determining the habitat rights in the PVTG communities. Hand map of the habitat area and rights over the habitat area was prepared the habitat leaders. The habitat claims were prepared in the Form-B and Form-C which has been prescribed under FRA Amendment Rules.

The below said evidences and documents were attached in the claim forms and then submitted at the concerned SDLCs:

- Resolution of the initiation consultation with the traditional leaders, district administration and local NGOs
- Gram Sabha resolutions
- Copy of Secondary documents collected from different research documents done by SCSTRTI, Bhubaneswar
- Different stories related to the PVTGs published in various print medias
- List of seasonal use of MFPs

All the habitat rights claims were submitted at SDLC as described below. In the study, the team found that there is no habitat concept presently in the community of Lodha in Mayurbhanj, Lanjia Soura in Gajapati and Rayagada and Birhor in Jajpur district. In their community, the said PVTGs are not practising any traditional socio-cultural practices related to their concerned habitats. The traditional leaders of the concerned PVTGs passed the resolutions in the presence of the PRI members, micro-project officers that they are not exercising any traditional practices related to their habitat commonly. Rather they would like to make claim for CR & CFR over their forest by the individual villages.
