Code of Conduct for the Members of the Contact Expedition Team to the Sentinelese and the Jarawas.

- 1. The motive of the Organisation of the contact expedition to the Sentinelese is:
 - (a) To maintain the friendly relations established on 4th January, 1991;
 - (b) To make observations on the general conditions and behaviour of the Sentinelese at present; and
- (c) to keep surveilance against the poachers in and around the North Sentinel Island.
 - 2. The purpose of contact expedition to Jarawas is:
 - (a) To maintain and consolidate the friendly relations established by the Administration in 1974,
- (b) to make general observations/studies on the behaviour of the Jarawas without interferring in the normal life of the Jarawas.
 - (c) to prevent the poaching in the forest and in the shore waters near the Jarawa areas.
- 3. Only the authorised team shall go to the tribal areas for establishing contacts with the Jarawas and Sentinelese.
- 4. The expedition teams are to be organised on or about the full moon day, the natural calendar intelligible to the Jarawas for the visit.
- 5. Each member of the team should be free from all possible communicable diseases lest he/she spreads them among the tribes during the contact with them. To ensure this, they shall be medically screened before launching of the expedition.
