

Agenda item No.4 Measures to prevent Jarawa hostility.

In addition to the decisions taken with regard to Agenda Item No.1 above, it was decided as under:

- a) Forest and APND Camps along the areas reserved for the Jarawas should be shifted immediately as soon as the work is over.
- b) Regular inspection of settlements of primitive tribes should be undertaken by the officers of AAJVS, including its Executive Secretary. AAJVS should also ensure that the benefits of various welfare schemes reach the tribals.
- c) Reports containing observations and achievements made during the contact expeditions should be placed before the Executive Council.
- d) The Anthropological Survey of India should share the findings of their research with the Administration so that those may be used in formulating programmes and policies relevant to the development of the primitive tribal groups.
- e) The question of granting compensation to the victims of the Jarawa attacks should be examined by the Administration, keeping in view that the victims, who were encroachers of Govt land, should not be eligible for any compensation.
