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again shot at us which also fell in water near the boat. When we reached beyond the range of their arrow shot we found them dancing and laughing. We then proceeded to the other end of the shore and placed the remaining coconuts on the shore and returned to the boat Tarmugli. This time no Sentinelese were available there. The whole operation was covered by the film unit. At about 9.30.a.m. we set sail for Lakra Lungta in Middle Andaman for our next mission of jarawa contact. By evening we ~~anchorage at Lakra Lungta at midnight was~~ anchored at Port Campbell which was found to be a safe anchorage as anchorage at Lakra Lungta at midnight was unsafe due to presence of rocks in that area. At midnight again we set sail and reached Lakralungtta at 5.30.a.m. on 13.2.1987. Few of the party proceeded to shore in one dunghi with part of the gifts. About 17 Jarawas consisting of three men, seven women and seven children, were found on shore. They were cheerful and excited in seeing the party members. They were brought in dunghi to ship. They were given rice, plantation etc. After spending some time, L.G. and the members of the party along with the Jarawas proceeded to shore. On shore the party visited few huts. The Jarawas started singing and dancing with L.G. and others. The film unit shot some strips of the contact operation. After a couple of hours the party left for ship. At about 9.30.a.m. we sailed back to Port Blair and reached port Blair at 7.00.p.m.

The contacts of both Sentinelese and Jarawas were successful and interesting but for the unexpected and unpleasant incident of Sentinelese getting provoked to send arrows towards a friendly mission.
