Note : Please note that the Jarawa words are given in square brackets [] to indicate the actual pronunciation of the words.)

[a]	in	[ka:ya]	‘mother’
[a:]	in	[a:~a:w ɔ]	‘bow’
[i]	in	[iñco]	‘to drink’
[i:]	in	[i:tt̪hɔ]	‘frog’
[u]	in	[curukwa:ra]	‘Andaman Teal’
[u:]	in	[u:kɔ le]	‘turtle’
[e]	in	[erugeyi]	‘crocodile’
[e:]	in	[e:tt̪ā]	‘bottle’
[o]	in	[omo:ha]	‘sleep’
[o:]	in	[o:ya]	‘one’
[ɔ]	in	[ɔniña:nbo]	‘nose’
[ɔ:]	in	[ɔ:ni:ya]	‘to laugh’
[æ]	in	[ɔ :ñæ:b]	‘woman’

Examples for consonants:

[p]	in	[po:tho]	‘net’
[ph]	in	[phɔ:]	‘gone, went way’ or ‘go’
[b]	in	[biṭibiṭi]	‘bad’
[t]	in	[ti:ta]	‘eating’
[th]	in	[thu:wɔ]	‘spitting’
