

On further inquiry it is learnt that passengers of bus and tourist vehicle, stopping the vehicle at Jarawa area and throwing eatable items such as biscuits, banana etc through the windows of the vehicles. Jarawas collecting these items and also entering inside the vehicle with the intention to get more eatable items from the passengers of bus. This system is to be stopped. Police personnels are on ATR for controlling the Jarawas, but now it is necessary to control the non-tribals who are passing through Jarawa area not to throw or give any items to Jarawas for which checking are to be carried out. This subject was discussed in detailed with Dy. S.P and he gave necessary instructions to Police Personnels of Jirkatang Outpost and Middle Strait that the vehicles will be permitted only in the prescribed time with police protection so that passengers and Jarawas can be controlled by the Police Personnel.

One Jarawa aged about 40 years was found sick and sent him alongwith <sup>one</sup> ~~his wife~~ as attender in the Special Ward of GB Pant Hospital, Port Blair. *... got admitted*

We also visited the Jarawa camp at R. K. Nallah. Plenty of food items such as pig, fish, tubers and banana provided from AAJVS found available in their hut. We left Jarawa area at 1700 hrs and reached Port Blair at 1900 hrs.
