- 5. The necklaces are prepared mainly with the single variety of shells, but during the present visit in some cases different varieties of sea shells were also used for the preparation of one necklace.
- 6. An adult Jarawa was wearing the chest-guard of plastic, which he might have got from the sea shore, indicates a little change in their traditional culture.
- 7. About nine temporary huts were found at contact point, of which few were broken and in one hut skulls of wild pigs were also hanging.
- 8. On 4.9.96, effort was made to contact them at the same place but none of the Jarawa was spotted. Hence, the contact party reached the Yadita Point, where the same group was present. But the number incressed to 24 due to addition of one pregnant woman and six children including one infant.
- 9. The other details about the ethno-biology were also noted, which requires the further confirmation.

## SUGGETIONS

- 1. Duration of visit to Jarawa area shall be incressed to full day to get their confidence with the familier group so that their main settlement area may be visited.
- 2. During the next visit, efforts should be made to mark the Jarawa with some code No. from special type of ink, which can not be removed atleast for next four months to assess their migration pattern and the population.
