

4. In addition to Caakunhume some people are seen wearing another necklace called lallele made out of cowrie shells or another one called iiboota made out of green leaves of a particular kind or the both.
5. Some are seen wearing a head-band called ootooha ^{or unweetaaye} made out of fibres from a particular variety of leaves while some others are seen with another head-band which is made out of red coloured cloth. Another head-band called piig oohaa made out of a particular variety of flower was also seen being worn by a girl.
6. They are seen wearing a waist-rope called oninno made out of white or red coloured thread. In addition to it some are seen wearing one or more than one waist-rope also.
(The significance of them is yet to be clarified)
7. Among all, a woman was seen with a band called tunya around her waist while a man was seen with a chest guard called keekad or Caawad around his chest.
