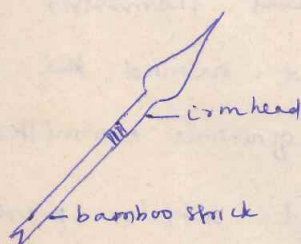
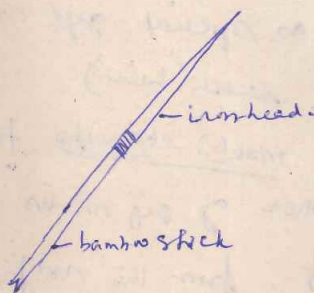


a load of implements of their economic activity some with glittering iron-heads were seen inside the hut. Some mooli el-taads started explaining the distinct utility of these different implements.

1. Bow called aa. It is purely made of wood, and is used for shooting pig, deer and fish. They are made into bigger ones and smaller ones. The smaller ones <sup>are meant</sup> ~~are~~ for the boys to shoot fish.



2. Arrow<sub>1</sub> called toocyaalitwaa. It is an iron-headed <sup>attached with a bamboo stick and is</sup> arrow used for shooting pigs and deer. The iron-head is a flattened one with sharpened blades on either sides. The one end of the iron-head ends with a sharply pointed tip. The other end bluntly reduces into a single slender rod. This rod is tied tightly <sup>the one end of the</sup> with a bamboo stick. The other end of the bamboo stick is carved accordingly to facilitate the shooting process.



3. Arrow<sub>2</sub> called toom. It is also an iron-headed <sup>attached with a bamboo stick</sup> arrow but is used solely for shooting fish. The iron-head is a slender rod. It ~~is~~ <sup>sharply</sup> ends with a pointed tip. The other end is blunt and is tied with the one end of <sup>the</sup> bamboo stick. The other end of the bamboo stick carries a carving to facilitate the shooting process.
