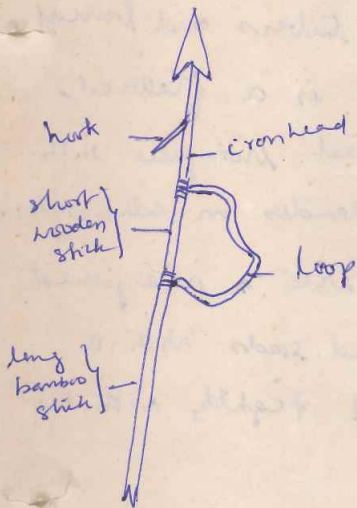


4. Arrow₃ called Caahotteyan. It is an iron-headed, detachable, looped arrow attached with two sticks, one wooden and another bamboo, and is solely used for shorting pig. The iron-head is a flattened one with sharpened blades on either sides. One end of the iron-head ends with sharpened tip. The other side also ends with sharpened tips on either sides of the blades before being reduced into a slender rod with a pointed hook protruding downwards. This rod is tied tightly with the one end of the short wooden stick. The other end of this short wooden stick is carved accordingly to fit itself into the socket carved at one of the end of the long bamboo stick. The other end of the bamboo stick also carries a carving to facilitate the shorting process. The short wooden stick with the iron-head is temporarily detachable from the long bamboo stick but permanently they are connected by a loop.



5. Digging hoe₁ called Queen. It is purely made of iron. It is used for digging tubers and burial pits. Its one end ends with a flattened and sharpened blade. The other end reduces into a slender rod.
