Status Report on the Jarawa Tribe of Andaman Islands.

Introduction:

- (1). Andaman & Nicobar Islands constitute a Union Territory. These Islands were inhabited solely by the aboriginal tribes prior to the colonisation and establishment of Penal Settlement by the then British Government. The Penal Settlement grew over the decades from 1858 onwards. After Indian Independence the Bengali refugees were brought under the Scheme of the Govt. of India to rehabilitate them in these Islands. On account of the Rehabilitation and Colonisation programmes, the population of non-tribal people has increased manifold. As per 1991 Census the population of these Islands is 2,80,661.
 - (2). There are six Scheduled Tribes in A&N Islands. They are:-
