

(d) Gift packets containing banana etc. were dropped few times in the Jarawa areas of South Andaman Island from the air. It appears that the Jarawas of South Andaman Island must have learnt that the out side people are helpful as they dropped the eatables. Thus the Enmay factor and gift dropping must have encouraged the Jarawas of South Andaman Island who come out of their territory in the day time. This is a deviation from their past activities when they used to come in the night to the villages to plunder and even to kill the people and animals.

(e) Jarawas once having seen the out side world and the material culture, they are attracting / allured to visit again and again villages.

(f) Probable shortage of food in the Jarawa areas as believed by some could also be one of the causes for the Jarawas to come out, though the experts with their specific observations of the Jarawas do not confirm the above belief.

(g) The researches by the Anthropologists and other experts would indicate the actual reasons for the Jarawas coming out of their area.

#### **Present Jarawa Situation :**

(9). The Jarawas of both South Andaman and Middle Andaman Islands have started coming out into the non-tribal villages. Jarawas plunders the villagers and their gardens. Jarawas particularly children are coming on to the Andaman Trunk Road, climbing on to the vehicles, traveling on the bus tops etc.

(10). Such activities of plundering by the Jarawas result in the loss to the villagers. Further Jarawas coming on to the roads and traveling in the open vehicles and bus tops is hazardous for their safety as they could be victims of the road accidents, apart from causing hindrance for the vehicular movement on Andaman Trunk Road.
