	<p>vi) The Bush Police Camps (JPPs) were established in different locations to watch the movement of Jarawas and to save the lives of civilians. Recently the Jarawas have started visiting the settlement areas without weapons and they are not attacking the people but it is premature idea to take decision to abolish all the JPPs immediately as the attitude of Jarawas is to be watched and studied further keeping the safety of lives of civilians. Moreover, when the Jarawas come out from the jungle, they come to the JPPs where the police personnel make arrangements to give them gift items with AAJVS and they also make arrangements to send them back to their habitat.</p> <p>Regarding panultimate para of the representation, it is stated that whenever the Jarawas come to the villages, they are given gift items immediately and arrangements are made to send them back to their habitat immediately. We are taking all efforts to prevent contact of non-tribals with Jarawas. For this purpose committees are constituted by the Chairman, AAJVS at Kadamtala, Tirur and Ferrargunj to take care of Jarawas and to take all efforts to prevent their mingling with non-tribals and for the safeguard of their entity and originality.
