Secretary (Tribal Welfare), departed from Port Blair on
29.10.1993 on its mission of establishing friendly contacts
with the sentinelese and Jarawas. The team consisted of
Shri S.A.Awaradi, Director (Tribal Welfare) who is himself a
practicing Anthropologist; Shri Sashank Kumar, Executive
Secretary, AAJVS with considerable background in Anthropology;
Shri Hari Gopal Das, Dy.S.P.; Dr. Shafique Quader, Chief
Medical Officer; linguists Dr. Gyana-Sundaram and Dr. Ranganathan
Who are currently proposed to primers in Onge and Andama pell languages;
from CIIL, Mysore, Dr. Srinath (linguist) and Shri Battacharjee
(Photographer) from ASI; and Shri Bhaktawar Singh, Rtd. Dy.SP
with a record number of contacts with these tribals to his
credit.

In the morning of 30th October, the team established

two contacts with the Sentinelese, who are offen calkdthe last

bastion of the Andaman Negrito, at the North Sentinel Island.

Being unsure of the behaviour of the Sentinelese the contact

was made from a distance. The first contact was made at around

0930 hrs which lasted for 15 minutes. Approximately 40 males,

females and childrens came on to the beach and followed the

Sailing parallel to the beach,

out boat, wimner a for almost a kilometer to collect the

coconuts which are generally given away as Gift.

As a result of their non-agressive behaviour and a positive response during the first contact the need for a second contact was felt. The second contact was made at around 1100 hrs which lasted for almost 35 minutes. While the contact team was un-loading the coconuts into the water near the beach one of the Sentinele was quick enough to jump into the water and on to the out boat. The team members were scared by the hand axe and the dangling knife carried by the Sentinele. He manager to un-load all the bags of coconuts within seconds like a plunderer. After un-loading he jumped back into the water and went away. Thereafter the team members in the out boat
