No new observations were noticed about Physical features health and nutrition, except that they were seen eating riped bananas raw i.e. without reasting it.

New observations about Material Culture and Behaviour:

Shri Bakhtawar Singh coaxed one of the Jarawas to take us to their huts. Four of us visited their huts, led by one Jawawa.

- The man was relectant/apprehensive to take us to their hutments. He cross checked my camera twice with some doubts.
- Near the place of hutment, hanged on a tall tree was some plastic, thermocal pieces, a sort of boundry mark(Photograph).
- There were a total of small and one medium size lean type huts.
- There was no body else in the huts.
- There was one big iron utencil and a few small wteel and aluminium bowls.
- there were few plastic cans and bottles containing water
- B.Singh sww a few arrows in the roof of one hut covered/ hidden in between leaves.
- Reluctant to show us honey. But when persisted, he did.
- There were many honey carriers with honey and pieces of honey comb in it. It was covered with leaves individually and all the honey carriers collectively were also covered with leaves at two places.
- Honey carriers were similar to those of onges with wax coatings but were very beautiful with streaks of some yellowish thread like weaving on the outer side.
- I Live fire smoke was seen. It was the same point where they were first sighted but they have walked down some distance for the contact.
- Between the sea shore and place of hutments many broken shells and jaw bones were scattered in a wide clear ground.
- B.Singh asked for 'INCHU', the host brought a plastic bottle full of water and gave it to him.
