

the boat the Jarawa started singing and dancing and some of them jumped into the life boat to collect gift items. We found forty Jarawa on the beach and our lifeboat had a safe landing point on the beach at a Yadita Point. Sexwise & agewise of the Jarawa contacted are as below :-

Male	-	4 (adult)	Male	-	15 (child 6-12 years)
Female	-	8 (adult)	Female	-	6 (child 6-12 years)

There were three & four infant males & females respectively.

They were very much excited when we reached the shore. All the gift items like coconut, red cloth, banana, choppers (iron daos), utensils were collected by the Jarawa from the boat and kept them on the beach near the jungle. They were very happy. We stayed with the Jarawa for 4 hours. Majority of the males and females Jarawa painted their faces with white and red ochre. Women and children wears armlets, waistbelt made of locally available leaves. Shells and red coloured beads twisted in nylon fibre thread are worn as waist belt by children. The doctor applied medicines in their ~~wound~~ wounds. We left Yadita Point area and came back to Tarmugli at 12.30 P.M.

After half an hour the ship started towards North Sentinel island. After two hours of journey, we saw six Jarawa coming to sea shore near Bluff island. At about 3 P.M. we made contact with the Jarawa at Cape Bluff on the northern tip of South Andaman in West
