3. Although none of the Sentinelese were seen carrying bows and arrows but almost all the members except infants were keeping either two sharp knives or one sharp adze with knife which sometimes they were hiding in their chest guards.
4. Sentinelese were seen in a better condition of health, height and sturdiness.
5. Only one temporary hut near the seashore was observed, which was 5 feet high, 8 feet length and breadth of 5 feet, covered with dhani patti on upper side only.
6. Fishing nets and cane baskets which was quite similar to Jarwas were also observed, used to carry the gift items to their settlements.
7. The three dug-out-canoes were present during our visit, which were more or less similar to the onge canoe, but shorter in length and breadth with the balancer tied atleast at 5 to 6 places. It is used for transportation, fishing and hunting around the island, Sentinelese canoe was seen carrying two-three Sentinelese at a time.
8. Few adult female were also observed putting the head bands of flowers probably of Alexandrian laurel (Callophyllum inophyllum) which also possess scented smell generally found in sea shores.

SUGGESTIONS

1. Duration of visit to Jarawa area shall be increased from one hour to two hours and the visit of thier settlement area is important to study their material culture and ethno-biology.
2. Instead of giving only the red cloths, the other coloured cloths near to red like orange, dark mahroon, yellow, pink may also be tried in few expeditions to see the change of their behaviour.
3. The close up photography of every Jarawa face shall be carried out for thier identification and to study the migration pattern, which will also help in ascertaining the exact population of Jarawa.
