The proposal submitted is in response to the following actionable points emerged out from the meeting held on 1.6.12 at Raj Niwas under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Lt Governor for taking appropriate action.

- Imparting of intensive training to AAJVS staff by the officials of Police Department, Health Services, Forest and Anthropological Survey of India and
- 2) Sensitization of the nearby villagers of Jarawa Reserve Area

In this context the following actions are proposed for consideration and approval, please.

A) Imparting of intensive training to AAJVS staff by the officials of Police Department, Health Services, Forest and Anthropological Survey of India

 The Union Cabinet, Gol has approved the amendment of A&N PAT Regulation, 1956.

2) In order to educate the officials of AAJVS (Tribal Welfare Officers and Janjathi Sevak) about the implementation of the PAT Regulation, 1956 in a proper and effective manner, it has been decided to carry out the intensive training programme for the staff of AAJVS (Tribal Welfare Officers and Janjathi Sevak) with the help of Police Department, Health Services, Forest and Anthropological Survey of India.

B) The following officers of the above mentioned departments may be requested to impart training on PAT Regulations, Health awareness

and other issues related to Jarawa

a) The Superintendent of Police, South Andaman

- b) The Dy Director (Tribal Health), Directorate of Health Services
- c) The Assistant Anthropology (Physical), ASI, Port Blair

d) The Divisional Forest Officer.

e) The Director of Tribal Welfare, Port Blair

4) The venue for the proposed training may be fixed in the conference hall of the Directorate of Tribal Welfare.

5) The date for convening the training programme has been decided to fix in the second week of July, 2012. Hence, it is proposed that we may fix the above said training programme on 11th and 12th July, 2012.

The training may be fixed for 2 days with 4 sessions (morning and afternoon sessions). The proposed fixture are as under: -
