27	On receiving the reports from the Jarawa area, Shri. V. Palaiyan was called to the Office of AAJVS and asked to submit a report. His report is placed at page 64/C please. As per his report, the Jarawas were travelling from Jirkatang to Jhinga Nallah for extraction of honey. On seeing few Jarawas of Tirur at Mile Tilak village, they jumped from the Jeep. Later, they all went inside the Jungle for honey wood and for bow. At around 12:30 they returned back with honey, some coconuts and banana.
2	Since, the report of Shri. V. Palaiyan was not satisfactpory, self directed Shri. A. Gunasekana Pillai, Tribal Welfare Officer (HQ) to meet the villagers and the Jarawas and submit a detail report. His report may be seen at page 65-66/C please. As per his report they (Jarawas)have collected only 50 to 60 nos coconuts, Banana from the Agriculture Farm and few from two private farms. 40 nos Jarawas visited Mile Tilak on the day of incident and each could carry only two coconuts in hand if they have no other luggage in hand. In the instant case, the Jarawas have carried very limited nos of coconuts, banana and bettle nut. Therefore the claim of the villagers that Jarawas have taken 500 nos coconut, 3000 nos bettle nuts and 50 nos goath of banana is quite exaggerated and submitted for more compensation.
5	The Jarawas were persuaded and requested to not to enter into any village and take away any items. AAJVS will supply their requirements. The Jarawas insisted that they may be provided Banana and Rice regularly. AAJVS employees posted on the ATR have been directed to vigilant and not to allow such incident in future.
20	ES, AAJVS visited Mile Tilak and Jarawa camps on 20/12/2012 and a report has been prepared and placed at page 67+70/C for kind perusal please. During the course of my discussion.
