



Jarawa (Alamalay) demand for Rice, clothes, Biscuits, Belt and shoes etc. Pradham has accordingly enlisted the items in his diary.

Self enquire the matter from the Jarawa with the help of Janjali Sevak and it was revealed that the Jaraws had a pre-plan to collect rice and clothes from the village area, Alamalay and twelve others had visited the Collingpur area during night time and invaded in to the house (they are not entered in to the house except two) and collect the clothes and iron materials from the Baranda and surrounding of the house, only two house they entered through window and taken some Rice, clothes.

Jarawas are in groups of two three person while they invaded in to the village -

- Alamalay and Kiangato - Taken items from. Two houses.
- Kunnu and Dathadu - — do — Two houses.
- Anjaalae and Enman - — do — Two houses.
- Mothaibatoy - — do — Two houses.
- Lekhthae and Dawai — do — one houses.
- Lewa, Emohonda, Toppie and Ellie — do — Two houses.

Total Eleven houses were invaded by the Jarawa as they agreed with, when enquire the matter at Thookona Chadda.

Reason responsible for frequent visits of the Jarawas to their neighbouring areas is yet to ascertain. Immediate step is being taken to restrict the calculated interaction between the Jarawa and the people of the neighbouring areas. Ph.
