(44) The reported incident took place on 10th December 2012 and after a gap of ten days this report has reached the undersigned. Shri V.Palayan failed to prevent/persuade Jarawas entering into Mile Tilak village. Further, only on instructions from the Headquarters he chose to file the report after four days (i.e on 14/12/2012). He may be shifted from his present place of posting and a suitable substitute who knows Jarawa language be transferred and posted. The conclusion that has been arrived at by the officers that there was shortage of resources in Jarawa reserve area and that we should supply the Jarawas bananas and coconuts does not appear to have been backed up by scientifically collected data. Dr. Vishwajit Pandya, Member, Group of Experts is available in Port Blair. His assistance may be obtained to verify the factual position and a report be submitted. In the meanwhile Revenue Department may be addressed to provide compensation to the villagers.
