## REPORT



This office received a report from Shri. V. Palaiyan, Janjati Sevak, Jirkatang that on 10/12/2012 some Jarawas entered into the revenue village of Mile Tilak for extraction of honey and wood for making bows. While returning from the Jungle, they entered into the private farms and collected few coconuts, banana and bettlenuts. On this self directed Shri. V. Palaiyan to submit a fact funding report which has been received on 14/12/2012.

Shri. V. Palaiyan reported that on the 10/12/2012 a group of 40 nos Jarawas camping on the Andaman Trunk Road requested him for shifting them to Jhinga Nallah for extraction of honey. Accordingly, he arranged the contract jeep. They crossed Jirkatang No: II Jarawa Protection Post at around 0930 hrs on the way to Jhinga Nallah. two police personnel from Jirkatang and two from Mile Tilak accompanied them. When they reached Mile Tilak, they saw few Jarawas standing on the road side. These Jarawa came from Tirur. He reported that the Jarawas entered into village of Mile Tilak and collected agricultural products viz.. coconut, plantain and bettle nuts.

On 13/12/2012 self directed Shri. A. Gunasekaran Pillai, Tribal Welfare officer (HQ) to visit the village and meet the Jarawas to submit a detail report. He reported that he met villagers at Mile Tilak. They informed that the Jarawas have collected 500 nos coconut, 3000 nos bettle nuts and 50 nos goath of banana. He then met the Jarawa on the ATR at Punna Nalalh and inquired about the incident.
