Note

Report received from the Tribal Welfare Officer, AAJVS, Tirur, stating that Janjati Sevak (AAJVS) namely Shri K. Pappa Rao, who alongwith a Home Guard was escorting two Jarawas discharged from PHC, Tushnabad after treatment, reached Bada Balu (a hot spot in relation to Jarawas), where they were to be dropped back in an Engine Dinghi on 7.3.2013 around 2.30 PM, two Jarawas were found intoxicated. One Shri Sujoy Roy later identified as Narayan Roy, R/o Madhupur No.1, Diglipur (camp at Collinpur) and his two other accomplices alongwith an Engine dinghy who had intruded into Bada Balu falling in the Jarawa reserve, were found present on the spot. It was suspected that the intoxicating liquor was offered to the Jarawas by the said intruders. Janjati Sevak tried to seize the Engine Dinghi of the offenders, but could not do so as the Jarawas who were under the influence of liquor resisted and restrained him, threatening to assault by bow and arrow.

A complainant against the above three persons for having committed illegal act was lodged with SHO, Ograbraj on 8.3.2013. They were arrested and produced before the Court. The Court has remanded them to judicial custody. The Engine dinghy is also reported to have been seized by the Police.

In this context, it is pertinent to mention that the very person (Shri Narayan Roy, alias Sujoy Roy) was also, in the past booked by the Police for having committed various illegal activities in the Jarawa reserve as per the details of the cases registered against him given below:-

The complaint against the intruder needs proper investigation and trial under the provision of PAT Regulation.
