The T.W.O, informs that eight Jarawa male members visited / invaded in to the Plantation area of Khurmadera on 29/10/2012 and took some items from their houses. As per list enclosed, Jarawa took items mainly clothes and other items from 29 houses. The T.WO inquired the matter with the help of Pradhan, Gram Panchayat, Tusnabad and staff of revenue department to assess the loss of items. Some iron items have been retuned back by the Jarawas.
	No	On receipt of the report, ES AAJVS directed T.W.O to investigate the incident thoroughly and submit a detail report. The Tribal Welfare officer, AAJVS, Tirur then submitted a
*	21	detail report that on early morning he received a phone call informing that Jarawa entered into Collinpur village and took some items. He and other AAJVS staff (night duty) and incharge, Jarawa protection post No: I A proceeded to the spot. They victims informed that only 05 houses were affected, when the Pradhan and revenue officials visited, all the house owners recorded their name.
		The T.W.O interacted with the Jarawas and requested to return the items. The Jarawas returned 05 dah, an air bag containing documents etc. When Pradhan asked, what they want, I will take to higher authority for that. One Jarawa Shri, Alamalay demanded rice, clothes, biscuits, shoes and belt. Hereafter, T.W.O inquired the matter with Jarawas, it was revealed that the Jarawas had a preplan to collect rice and clothes from the village area. 13 Jarawas visited collinpur during the night and invaded the houses, they did not enter any house, except two and collected the clothes and iron materials from verandah and surrounding of the house. They took rice and clothes from inside of two houses. The T.WO is unable to ascertain the reason for frequent visit of the Jarawas in neighboring areas. He has requested to take immediate step to restrict the calculated interaction between the Jarawa and the people/
