185	<p>Reference note on pre-page the following follow up action has been taken in view of note as under :-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The existing staff in Tirur has been replaced to revamp the field unit. 2. Surveillance has been intensified from morning till 8 PM in the evening. 3. Night Patrolling is also conducted at regular intervals. 4. Executive Secretary is himself monitoring the situation by frequently visiting the Tirur area. 5. An interaction meeting with PRI members of the Tirur area was held on 8th December, 2013 by the officials of AAJVS and Experts members of AAJVS eliciting their cooperation to address the Jarawas Issues. (copy enclosed) 6. A look out hut has been constructed at the mouth of Nallah joining the sea as mentioned in the report of expert and Director (TW) to have watch on the poachers. 7. Whenever there is any violation of PAT Regulation the case is registered with Police Station. 48 cases of violation have been registered under PAT so far. 8. All the field staff is in close touch with the Jarawa to convince them that any sort contact with the settlers is harmful and injurious to their own interest. 9. Presently we are carrying out patrolling by a hired Engine Dinghi. Shortly we are getting a Dinghi from Fisheries Department under Tribal Sub-Plan. Then we can do patrolling even odd hours. 10. We are getting misleading information from various sources (i.e. News papers & magazines) that the Jarawas are addict to liquor which is totally baseless. For about a month, there is not Jarawas in Tirur area. Most of them are at Badabalu and five or six are nearby J.P.P. 4. Badabalu is about 10-15 miles from Tirur. There is strict watch over the area by AAJVS staff. Official of AAJVS paid 4-5 visits to Bada Balu in last one month. Some of the news are published in the local as well as foreign news papers simply to create pressure on administration. <p>Constraint :-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Jarawas area is totally pores. 2. We can prevent poachers from going into the Jarawas area but it is difficult to prevent Jarawas to enter the settlement area.
