Notings, from para 188/nf. ante., may kindly be seen. The
joint patrolling team of AAJVS, Police and Forest Officers have
done a commendable job by apprehending 7 (seven) accused for
violation of PAT Regulation. The Investigating Officer and the Ld.
Public Prosecutor must pursue the case to its logical conclus 1,
through the Competent Criminal Court.
The occurances of such unauthorized and undesirable

interaction by poachers with the Jarawa tribe causes concern towards the safety, security, protection and preservation of the indigenous community. Recently, the Tribal Advisory Board, in its 3rd Meeting held on 30th December, 2013, reviwed the Jarawa situation and recommended for coordinated action by the concerned Departments in protecting the interests of Jarawas (Minutes of the meeting placed in the file). The Board also recommended for counselling the Jarawas as well as non-tribals. It is noted that large number of criminal cases (47 in number) filed under PAT Regulation are pending disposal for very many years (Oldest case related to the year 2002). It is proposed to hold a joint meeting of the Tribal Welfare and Police Officers and Ld. Public Prosecutor to ensure expeditious disposal of all pending criminal cases. The awareness creation programme will be organized in February, 2014 at "Hots-spots" located within the Jarawa reserve, for the benefit of Jarawas. offenders will be made to execute a bond u/s 110 of Cr.P.C for good behaviour, before the Executive Magistrate concerned.
