Meanwhile, the Pradhan, Tusnabad Gram Panchayat has submitted a letter addressed to the Chief Secretary containing suggestions and demands of the Pradhan to solve the problems of loot by the Jarawas. His suggestions are as follows:

- Reconsider and re-fix the Jarawa boundary
- Immediate compensation to be provided to the villagers for loss of utensils and plantation
- Appoint 40 to 50 number of local youths on daily rated basis
- Shifting of Police outpost to its original location where it was before Tsunami
- AAJVS be directed to proceed every ^{week} work and step for development keeping in confidence with Pradhan.
- Jarawas are continuously demanding iron tolls etc., the items seems to be either of good quality or in sufficient so distribution may be made in presence of the Pradhan.

He has inflated the report for sheer publicity. It is observed from his report that the main motive is appointment of few people from his Panchayat.

Apropos to the comments of the Pradhan it is submitted here that:

- is already under consideration,
- the District Administration has a scheme of payment of compensation, we may refer the issue as AAJVS runs on Grant-in-aid and this money is not meant for payment to the villagers.
- AAJVS has skeleton staff strength at all PTG settlements. It is proposed that we may engage few persons on daily rates basis after observing all administrative formalities and post at Jarawa area including Tirur
- We may request the Police department to shift the JPP to its old location
