Sir,

I am to inform you that the joint patrolling team comprising of In/charge out post Tirur, H/c Mr Basheer police OP tirur, mr firoz P/c of JPP No 4. Tribal Welfare Officer AAJVS, Janjati Sevak (Balram Yadav). DRM (Kausik Sarkar) and Mr M Khalid Forest Guard II ,Mr Shyam (Engine Dinghy Operator) and Mutche Rao DRM of Forest Dept, with forest Engine dinghy Proceed to Bada Balu/Heeran tikrey from collinpur (near AAJVS field office) on 04/01/2018 at about 01.50pm

On the way to Badabalu at about 03.40 Pm. We intercept a fishing dinghy bearing Regn .No. MFV- SILPA.IND-AN-SA-Mo.666, three people are on board they possessed big Ice Box for freezing the catch .We enquire their identity and search the dinghy. Fisherman onboard are – Samir Mondal 42 Yrs Nithananda Halder 45 yrs. And Sambhu Barman 39 Yr all are residence of New Wandoor .We warn them not to enter in to the Jarawa Reserved area for any purpose and do not interact with them any situation .

We start further toward Bada Balu after sailing some distance at about 4.30 Pm, we encountered with another fishing dinghy moving towards Tarmughi island/ wandoor keeping considerable distance from jarawa reserved area.We intercept them and search their fishing dinghy but not found they objectionable item. persons on board are Sahadev Kujur 42 Yr R/o Rangat but presently residing at New Wandoor, Harikrishna Biswas 52 Yrs and Nitai Biswas 40 yrs both are residing at New Wandoor .The fishing Dinghy bearing Regn.No-MFV.BIJOY LAXMI ,IND-AN-SA-Mo.747.Both the fishing dingies ae having solar panel and modern/ advanced fishing equipment .

We reached Badabalu at about 6.20 Pm and halt ain the tin shed constructed by AAJVS at Badabalu. However the shed is in very bad condition, i.e rusting of tin sheet, one of the posts of the shed has completely damaged by white ant. There were as many as six jarawa Huts on shore but we cannot see any jarawa camping in their traditional hut, at the particular area.

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
