Sub: Submission of report on joint patrolling Reg:

Sir,

I am to inform you that the joint patrolling was conducted on 30/01/2018 by using our speed boat HDPE- 90 Hp and the forest engine dinghy. The team consists of shri Tamarashan S.I & i/c OP Tirur, H/C Mr koshi, OP Tirur, P.C Firoz of JPP NO 4, Dr. Bisweswar Das T.W.O AAJVS, Balram yadav J/S, Mohd. Rafique driver of speed boat, Mahesh Mazumder helper and kaushik sarkar assistant of the team. shri M. Khalid F/Guard II of forest department, Shri shyam E/dinghy operator, Muchal Rao helper.

We start from collinpur by our speed boat and with the forest E/dinghy at about 0715 Hrs and reached JPP No 04 at about 0730 Hrs and directly proceed to Heeran Tikrey by about 0735 Hrs and reached there by 0935 Hrs and Halt at Heeren Tikery and had breakfast.

We conducted patrolling in the Heeren Tikrey Nallha from 1025 Hrs to 1100 Hrs during patrolling in the nallha, we can't found any outsider engine dinghy/ Fisherman or poachers in the area. However a Jarawa camp was observed adjacent to the nallha. There were eighteen Jarawa fellow members, including male, female and children. (Ulliguard, Achetta, Ingmen, Horkottai are the adult male member) Near the campmate we found a small wooden dinghy (oaring), in possession of the Jarawa group (Photograph enclosed). We interacted with the Jarawa members and asked about the dinghy, Achatta the Jarawa says that the dinghy was received from Thaanmad area, infact the said dinghy was gifted by a Jarawa fellow member namely, Ekangna of Potatang /Punna nallha area. We warned them not to use the dinghy in the sea, because the Jarawa people are not very good sea farer. Before we depart from Heeren tikrey, some fishing hooks and lines were also distributed to the Jarawa members as they demanding for that.
