

- (iv) Purpose of carrying persons/passengers onboard (and allowing only if the purpose is not for the illegal activities.)
- (v) Cargo and other articles, equipments on board the dinghy.
- (vi) Declared purpose of the movement into the creek/sea (to be allowed if it is lawful) and destination with expected date and time of return.
- (vii) Similar entries after due check on return (landward movement) of the dinghy. Initiate legal action if the cargo onboard is contraband.

(6) The preventive and protective measures for the Jarawas shall include patrolling along the coast and also through land. There shall be three layers of patrolling along the coast on the basis of watercrafts deployed for the purpose and the personnel onboard as given below:

(i) The outer layer shall be formed by the Coast Guard and Navy, the middle layer by A & N Marine Police in speed boats and the inner layer by Joint (AAJVS + Police + Forest) Patrolling Parties in dinghies/motor boats.

(ii) The task requirement from the angle of protection of Jarawas from the outsiders especially from foreigners needs to be infused /emphasised in the mandates of the existing organisations, that is, Coast Guard and Navy forming the outer layer.

(iii) In respect of middle layer, the Director General of Police shall issue necessary directions to the Superintendent of Police, Police Marine Force to enforce the A & N Islands (Protection of Aboriginal Tribes) Amendment Regulation, 2012 under which coastal waters up to 1 km from high tide mark has been notified as tribal reserve.

(iv) The Marine Police during the patrol shall check and nab the boats found in the tribal reserve water and more importantly capture the evidence in the form of videography/photography with the locational coordinates using GPS.

(v) The Joint Patrolling Party (JPP) shall provide protection at close proximity to Jarawas and their reserve area. Each Joint patrolling party shall comprise of: (a) A Janjati Sevak from AAJVS, (b) an authorised representative from Police and (c) An authorised representative from Forest department.

(vi) The Joint Patrolling Party will cruise close to western shore and into creeks as per the requirements in double engine *bonga* dinghy (dug out canoe)/ motor boat.

(vii) In the first instance there shall be three base camps viz (i) 4 No. Chouki (Tirur), (ii) Kadamtala and (iii) Louise Inlet Bay from where joint patrolling parties shall cruise along the western coast. Each Joint Patrolling Party shall cover the specific stretch of coast in the normal condition and to any extent if situation demands.
