

- (a) Joint patrolling party based at Louise Inlet bay shall patrol the shores southward up to Flat Island.
- (b) One of the two Joint Patrolling Parties based at Katamtala shall guard coast from Lakralungta/Humprey Strait northwards up to Flat Island while second party shall patrol southwards up to Port Compbel.
- (c) Joint Patrolling Party based at 4 No. Chouki (Tirur) shall guard the western shores northwards up to Port Compbell.

(7) The Police and Forest Departments shall designate their representatives as the members of each Joint Patrolling Party,

(8) AAJVS contingent for each Joint Patrolling Party (JPP) shall comprise of: (i) a Janjati Sevak, (ii) Engine Driver and (iii) a Helper. Now, also taking into account the reinforcement of patrolling along Andaman Trunk Road abutting Jarawa reserve, the AAJVS shall have : (i) 8 Janjati Sevaks, (4 for Patrolling Parties operating from land-side remaining for inner layer), (ii) 4 Engine Drivers and (iii) 4 Helpers

(9) Double engine dugout canoe (bonga dinghy) to be used by the joint patrolling party shall be built by the Forest Department following the usual safety norms. Dinghies shall be registered under I.V Act or any other Regulation / Rules applicable. The Forest Department shall provide four bonga dinghies under current Tribal Sub Plan 2014-15 urgently.

(10) All safety equipments like life jackets, communication sets, and powerful search lights, GPS enabled video cameras shall be provided by AAJVS to each JPP.

(11) The joint patrolling party (JPP) shall apprehend the intruders in to tribal reserved waters/territory. They shall capture hard evidence using the videography / photography with locational coordinates with the help of GPS..

(12) Multipurpose Field Teams (MFT) and Joint Patrolling Parties (JPP) shall collect information from the field which shall be incorporated in the reports prepared by the respective Tribal Welfare Officer of the AAJVS and sent to AAJVS promptly if immediate action is warranted and in monthly reports under normal situation.

(13) There shall be a Research Cell in AAJVS headquarters manned by (i) a Tribal Welfare Officer who shall put up field reports quickly and (ii) an Advisor (TW) who shall provide the research driven solutions and administratively apt responses for the wellbeing of the Jarawas. AAJVS shall create the above mentioned engagements for patrolling in the field and for Research Cell at headquarters.

(14) The Joint Patrolling Parties based in the District shall be under the operational command of District Superintendent of Police. The Inspector of General of Police shall be the Chief of the Joint Operations at the
