Please refer your letter no. IV 8/0ATVS/88-TW, dated 12th August '88 regarding evacuation of patient from D/Creek. In this connection I am to mention that I always request them to ~~take~~ accompany child either father or mother. Not only myself but also my A.N.M. and W/Attendant also request them in same manner.

In one instance, on 26th June '88, A.N.M., W/Attendant and myself went to Sri Kanyoti's residence after receiving a signal from Directorate regarding Antitubercular treatment of Sri Kanyoti, as he was a tubercularis patient, then we requested him to proceed to G.B. Park Hospital, Port Blair by boat for tomorrow, he refused to talk and chased us with a knife, luckily nobody was injured.

One thing I have to inform you that if we want to send a signal to Port Blair, I have to send a messenger all the way on foot for 3 hours upto 22 km. road from where the messenger will get a ^{boat} ~~bus~~ if available. And messenger has to cross two nallahs which are infested with crocodiles, and only in low-tide messenger can cross the nallah if he is not unlucky as now-a-days people are seeing crocodiles very frequently.

So whenever I send a signal to Directorate of Health Services and A.T.V.S. regarding patient, I do always consult regarding accompanying the child with their father and accordingly I send signals kindly refer my signals dated 3-8-88 and 9-8-88.
