

Smti. Nabimboy W/o Shri Tanagiri, Onge tribe<sup>F. Dugong</sup> had fracture on her right leg due to an accidental fall<sup>at Dugong Creek</sup> at Dugong Creek and was brought to Port Blair for treatment. She was admitted <sup>in</sup> GB Pant Hospital in January, 1988 and was under treatment till now. Now she has improved and her fracture has set in. She has been discharged from Hospital.

Although her fracture has set in, she is not able to walk distance and she requires rest. She will be able to gain her capability of normal walking only after some time in due course. Since she has been discharged from hospital she is pressing to go back to her home at Dugong Creek. In view of her peculiar condition she needs a direct transport to Dugong Creek. The Samiti's boat mv 'Milale' has been taken on slipway for repairs and it may take about 10-15 days for her sailing. As such no other source is available for her transport to Dugong Creek. If she avails the ferry service to Little Andaman she can go upto Hut Bay only, and further she has to travel through jungle by walk which is not possible for her, in her present condition. It is also doubtful whether any motor dinghi will venture to go to Dugong Creek from Hut Bay in this foul weather. The only alternative is to allow her and her attendant (her husband) to avail helicopter flight by diverting the Port Blair - Hut Bay - Car Nicobar service, to Dugong Creek, as a special case.

Nabimboy and her husband may kindly be accorded and the authorities be informed. The helipad at Dugong Creek is fit for landing and take off.
