

- (g) Preventive measures for aboriginal and new diseases.
- (h) Curative measures for aboriginal and new diseases.
- (i) Promotive measures for aboriginal and new diseases.
- (j) Module of Health delivery system for Jarawa.
- iv) FAILURE TO PROVIDE PROTECTION AGAINST POACHING AND ENCROACHMENTS
 - (a) The existence and extent of poaching and encroachment to be reported by concerned enforcement agencies like (i) Forest Department, Police and District Administration and by (ii) Composite Groups.
 - (b) The sudden change in the behaviour of Jarawas caused by the illegal activities of poaching and encroachment, if any.
- v) OTHER REASONS FOR SUDDEN CHANGE IN THE BEHAVIOUR

Other reasons, if any, emerged during the study / survey of the Jarawas and analysis of various aspects, will be specifically reported.

- 25. Your humble petitioner states that the draft reports prepared by the respective subject experts viz. Director of Health services, A&N Islands for health, Head of the Department of Bio-Chemistry and Nutrition, All India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health, Calcutta for nutrition, team of officials of Botanical Survey of India, Zoological Survey of Indian, Forest Department of A&N Islands for resource base in Jarawa area and teams from Anthropological Survey of India for culture and behavior on the basis of first phase survey among Jarawas during December, 2001-January, 2002 were discussed by the Expert Committee on 17th and 18th March, 2002.
- 26. Your Humble Petitioner further states that the experience of the survey among the Jarawas during the first phase demands for further refinement in the survey and some modifications in the questionnaires for the second and subsequent phases of study on Jarawas. Accordingly the Expert Committee met on 5 / 04 / 2002 to fine-tune the survey methodology and questionnaires. The second phase of multi-disciplinary survey among the Jarawas has started on 12th April 2002.
- 27. Your Humble Petitioner still further submits that analysis of the scientific data collected in course of first phase of survey during December 2001-January 2002 in respect of health indicates that it is essential to apply the standards / norms / scientific indices specific to the unique community like Jarawas to understand the status of health and nutrition. Application of norms / standard worked out for general communities *ipso facto* is likely to lead to wrong conclusions. Therefore, the recommendations and measures for the betterment of Jarawas based on such erroneous conclusion / findings would be
