

27 The following aspects would be relevant to the Health and Medical Care for the Jarawas:

- (a) Morbidity / disease pattern in different months / seasons.
- (b) Etiology of diseases (causes of diseases)
- (c) Diseases occurring prior to outsiders' contact
- (d) Morbidity and mortality due to diseases occurred prior to outsiders' contact
- (e) Ethno-medicine and its extent / efficacy
- (f) New Diseases due to contact with outsiders their morbidity and mortality.
- (g) Preventive measures for aboriginal and new diseases.
- (h) Curative measures for aboriginal and new diseases.
- (i) Promotive measures for aboriginal and new diseases.
- (j) Module of Health delivery system for Jarawa.

iv) FAILURE TO PROVIDE PROTECTION AGAINST POACHING AND ENCROACHMENTS

- (a) The existence and extent of poaching and encroachment to be reported by concerned enforcement agencies like (i) Forest Department, Police and District Administration and by (ii) Composite Groups.

- (b) The sudden change in the behaviour of Jarawas caused by the illegal activities of poaching and encroachment, if any.

29 The detailed discussion/deliberation led to the following decisions:-

- (i) DHS shall provide the required manpower to conduct nutritional and dietary survey among the Jarawas during the subsequent phases.
- (ii) Professor Indira Chakravorthy, All India Institute of Public Hygiene and Health will arrange for the training of the Officers of the Directorate of Health Services to conduct proper nutritional survey and also to analyze the data.
