


Shri Kanchan Mukhopadhyaya informed that the orientation course for the field worker is not yet given as such the field staff are not having a clear concept about the tribal people. Secretary (TW) directed to work out the modalities of such orientation course. Secretary (TW) further directed to hold similar orientation programme for the drivers of the vehicles like buses both private and Govt. trucks normally plying on ATR. Shri Mukhopadhyaya also proposed an anthropological study of the Jarawas by Indian Anthropologists. He was asked to submit a detailed proposal.

Executive Secretary, AAJVS informed that last year a medical team comprising of specialists from GB Pant Hospital, Port Blair visited Dugong Creek & South Bay and a complete medical checkup was done and it was decided to undertake such kind of medical check up every year. Secretary (TW) directed to write a letter to Director of Health Services for sending the medical team to the Little Andaman, Strait Island and to the Jarawa area for the check up.
