## menace Hawkers

Unauthorized occupation of roadside parements of footpaths by hawkers has emerged as a big problem in the town and is attaining alarming proportion with the number of hawkers in the town increasing on a daily bacic. The acceptance of

is attaining alarming proportion with the number of hawkers in the town increasing on a daily basis. The eneroaching of footpaths by hawkers, had forced the pedestrians to walk on the roads. This not only exposes them to great risk of accidents but also poses great problem to the vehicles plying on the roads.

The problem of hawkers in our town needs to be viewed seriously as the town is very small, roads are reasonably wide and the footpaths exist only at selected places. This becomes more worrisome when eneroachments on footpaths take place in busy areas in the heart of the town requently. Unauthorized occupation of footpaths in our town may become a serious problem unless it is tackled urgently and more effectively. The only possible splution could be the regular eviction of roadside hawkers including those on the footpaths.

drives to evict footpath encroachments, however, due to political pressure, the drive had to be halted in the mid. In view of this, efforts will have to be stepped up by the Municipality to ensure that the hawkers once evicted do not reoccupy the place from where they have been removed. Special care need to be taken by the authorities in restoring the encroached footpaths. In view of this, the concerned authorities should seriously ponder over this problem and strive hard ponder over this problem and strive hard to solve this before it is too late.

The authorities should also ensure that no political interference is given consideration while carrying on such eviction drive for the greater interest of the public. On the same time the authorities must also ensure that these hawkers do have some alternative arrangement so that those who love shopping from the hawkers are not disappointed.
