NEW DELHI, JAN. 20. The United Nations will send a mission to Iraq in order to ascertain whether elections in the country can take place earlier than possible. "The technical mission will advise on the feasibility of elections within the next few months and, if not, the alternatives that might be possible," said UN Secretary General, Mr. Kofi Annan

The Development Commissioner, Shri S. Hemachandran, in his opening remarks, called upon the PRI members for speeding up implementation of various development projects for the remaining quarter of the current financial year 2003-2004. For 182 KMs of transferred road. funds are to be provided by APWD to PRIs for maintenance. Sufficient bridges are to be constructed wherever required. Top priority is to be given to urban water supply system.
