CIRCULAR

The forests of Andaman & Nicobar Islands are endowed with some of the rare and valuable timber species. In order to afford statutory protection and to safeguard the survival end sustained availability of a few rare and endemic species, Administration vide order No.9/GG/Fim/18-A Vol.I(J) dated 23.1.96 have declared the following timber species as 'reserved trees' under Indian forest Act, 1927.

- 1. Padauk (Pterocarpus dalbergioides)
- 2. Marblewood (Disosyrous marmorata)
- 3. Chboi (Sagerea clliptica)
- 4. Teak (Tectona grandis)
- 5. Satin wood (Murraya exotice)
- 6. Thitmin(Podocarpus orrifolia)

By virtue of the above order, the trees of above mentioned species even when found outside reserve forests cannot be felled, removed or traded without the explicit permission of the Administration. In other words, the Administration has absolute right
