Sir,

I am directed to refer your letter No.5-1/AAJVS/2004/8 dated 05/05/06 on the above-cited subject. In this regard it is stated that The Police Department has no role to play in demarcation, as it is a subject matter of Revenue and Forest.

In this regard it is suggested that a detailed map of Jarawa reserve areas may be displayed at major population, centers/villages/settlement area adjacent to the boundary line of reserve areas indicating that entry into the area without permit is liable to prosecution. Similarly, such Boards should also be displayed on pathways, and unmettled roads leading to Jarawa area with warning signs of prosecution.

Moreover, if required, Police protection will be provided to the teams.
