5. No school under education department is functioning at Strait Island although there is one Primary school teacher and class IV staffs. The matter to be taken up with the Director of Education.
  6. The minor damage caused at Strait Island Jetty to be taken up with the PE (Marine) for immediate repairs.
  7. It is reported that the Jarawas are moving freely at the Middle Strait jetty as well as in and around the Police Barrack and the canteen located at Middle Strait. Sometimes the Jarawas stay at jetty and in or around the Police Barrack. Action should be initiated to stop the Jarawa wandering and stay at Middle Strait. The police personnel stationed at Middle Strait should be asked strictly not to invite/ provoke/persuade the Jarawas or do any activity that may attract the Jarawas to come and stay at Middle Strait. The Social Worker, Middle Strait shall use the office motorcycle already provided to him to remain at the Middle Strait in late hours even after the last convoy passed.
  8. Report received that some Police constables stationed at Middle Strait are indulge in some unhealthy activities that are against the welfare of the Jarawas. They are Shri Vashista Rao, Shri EP Basheer, and Shri Peter Kachap. The Police Department may be requested to take necessary action against them.

#### **Dugong Creek**

9. Report received from the Research Investigator that the Onges have started to stay in the old settlement and at present they do not stay in the new traditional huts constructed after the tsunami. There is no electric supply to their settlement where they stay now. In the Onge Guest house at Hut bay the electric supply is also required. The Department of Electricity at Hut Bay should arrange to supply electricity to the old Onge settlement as well as the Onge Guest House at Hut Bay.
10. The issue regarding pending bills of the OMPCS raised. Some discrepancies were observed in some previous bills. It has been observed that in some ration bills that the excess quantity of ration articles has been issued which are not tallied with the prescribed scale of ration distributed among the Onges. The Secretary (TW) asked to recover the excess amount from the concerned Social Worker.
