Sub:- Demarcation of Jarawa Tribal Reserve Boundary - Regarding

Sir,

The demarcation of Jarawa Tribal Reserve Boundary of South and Middle Andaman was one of the important decisions taken in the Executive Council Meeting of AAJVS held on 17-08-2007 under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Lt. Governor. The deadline for the completion of work was 31-10-2007. But, the work could not be completed exactly during one year and in the next Executive Council Meeting held on 12-08-2008 Hon'ble Lt. Governor took a serious note of it. The new deadline given for completion of the demarcation of Jarawa Tribal Reserve Boundary is 31-10-2008. The meeting of Executive Council of AAJVS was attended among others by Principal Chief Conservator of Forests as well as Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman and the minutes were circulated to all concerned vide this office letter No. 16-1/AAJVS/2007/134 dated 20-8-2008.

I regret to state that except futile correspondence nothing concrete appears to have been initiated on ground and under the circumstance we may fail to complete the work even as per the fresh deadline given. Considering the importance of the work and also the concern expressed by the Hon'ble Lt. Governor towards the Primitive Tribal Group a meeting will be held on the above mentioned subject on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> October, 2008 at 0930 hrs. at APWD Guest House, Rangat to address the issue in its right earnest so as to achieve the target within the deadline.
