		<p>Refer page 159/C & 160/C please</p> <p>(54) This is a report submitted by Dr. Pronab Kr. Sircar, TWO. AAJVS. Tirur regarding panoramic field situation in Tirur pertaining and workable suggestion dated 31st Oct. 2013.</p> <p>(55) With reference to O/Order No. 393 dated 23rd Oct. 2013 he has reported for duty in Tirur on 25th Oct. 2013 and during visit of the Jarawa area he has given a report is as under:</p> <p>(56) "The interactions between the Jarawas and fishers can never be controlled and traced out all times if there is no bar for them to stay near the tribes. Essentially certain distance of at least 1 Km. from Jarawa Reserve should be kept restricted for fishermen and be maintained by some policed regulations."</p> <p>(56) In midst of the way on an edge of mangrove a Jarawa boy was standing and at the moment at about 10 mtrs. away from there a fishing dinghy was anchored. The same scenario he has observed at mouth of the creek near washed out old JPP4. At this JPP 4 site few Jarawa girls were camped. These girls are in regular communication often with the local fishermen. We cannot take action against them and the reasons are clear that-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. They don't get down from their dinghy but prompt / coerce the Jarawas in the manner that the tribes themselves come to them.
