The implementation/enforcement of the PAT Regulation, 1956 as further amended in 2012 should be stricter that the culprits allegedly introducing alcohol, tobacco with pan are nabbed forthwith and brought to book for which, law enforcement agency needs to be strengthened. Otherwise Jarawas are going to be spoiled in future because being an innocent and ordelicate mind, they can be misled by the unscrupulous persons easily. Even they alleged that the Police were in the know of the perpetrators of the illegal barter with the Jarawas.
	4. Some local poachers are allegedly sometimes in league with foreign poachers in poaching valuable timber, Sea food etc. So the number of JPP needs to be increased in order to cope up with the poaching activities in the Jarawa reserve area, AAJVS, Forest and Police should work in cohesion to prevent illegal activities like poaching, unauthorized contact, introduction of alcohol etc. in the Jarawa reserve.
(3 4)	In the wake of the above interaction, the following remedial measures have been initiated / taken with regard to the Jarawa issues:-
	(i) The hotspot structure at Tirur and Jhaokona has been completed and it is being furnished, Some equipments like GPS and communication system are also being arranged. In the mean- while the hotspots at each of the above places are functional with the Jarawas and AAJVS field functionaries interacting with each other.
	(ii) The existing field functionaries of AAJVS in Tirur area having completed their tenure have been transferred and replaced by the officials from other areas in order to revamp the field unit in Tirur.
	(iii) An engine dinghy fairly large in size is being acquired to be stationed at Tirur unit to facilitate patrolling along western sea coast to prevent poaching. In the meantime an intensive joint patrolling by the officials of AAJVS, Forest and Police is being

carried out with a hired engine dinghy.
