

Conclusion:

The Sentinelese is an extremely small population totally unaware and having no understanding of their position of citizen of this great country. Therefore, their continued survival and protection is the duty and responsibility of the government. They have a right to live the way they like and to embrace change according to their needs. There has to be a persistent and concerted effort from the civilized and dominant community of the country to make it possible for them.

In the past, the Administration had adopted "hands off" policy towards the Sentinelese. The same has been replaced by "eyes on", policy recently wherein circumnavigation of the North Sentinel Island is being carried out by the designated team of the Administration to keep a vigil around the North Sentinel Island and to make systematic observation of the behaviour, general aspects of Health, assessment of topography in the surrounding areas etc.
