Form No. 1: General Information/Demography/Anthropometry

- 1. The family should be properly identified from the name of the eldest member of the family so that they can be traced during the current and also in future surveys.
- 2. Head of the family may be given a semi-permanent identification mark, if required, during the survey.
- 3. Place of residence should be specifically noted with all details.
- 4. Joint family is the family where there is the possibility of two kitchens to exist.
- 5. Age has to be determined clinically and so it is approximate.
- 6. Write F or M in the sex column for female and male, respectively.
- 7. Hunting and gathering of food may be considered as moderate activity. Housewives and those who are not engaged in hunting or gathering are sedentary workers.
- 8. Write M for married, UM for unmarried and W for widow in marital status column.
- 9. Write P and L in case of pregnancy and lactation, respectively.
- 10. ACU will be calculated at the time of data analysis.
- 11. Height and weight will be taken for all individuals using anthrpometric rod and foot rest weighing machine, respectively as per the demonstration during training.
- 12. MUAC is to be measured using an ordinary measuring tape as per the demonstration during training.
- 13. BMI will be calculated from the height and weight as per briefing during the training.

Form No. 2: Morbidity Pattern.

- 1. Examination is to be done in case of all the members of the family.
- 2. Sl. No. of the family members have to be maintained as these are in Form No. 1.
